## <u>SHELTER & NFI</u>

625 households living in adequate shelters in the camp following refurbishment of existing shelters with local, durable materials

# PROTECTION

- 75% of refugees registered
- 27 representatives of the
Govt., NGOs, and members of civil society trained on refugee protection
- 100% of SGBV survivors provided with adequate assistance, including medical treatment

### WASH

- 19 boreholes rehabilitated in the camp

 - 27 litres of potable water available per person/day
 - 11 water management committees active in the camp

- 346 PoCs reived loans through UNHCR's partners

8,032 refegees received food assistance on a monthly basis including 6,175 through the cash voucher programme HEALTH

 - 23 qualified teachers trained

- 161 children aged
