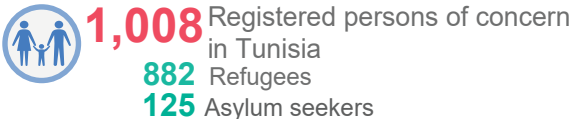

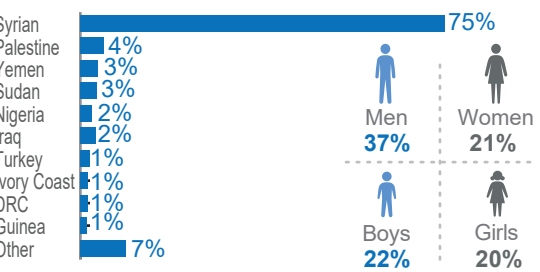

UNHCR Tunisia population of concern

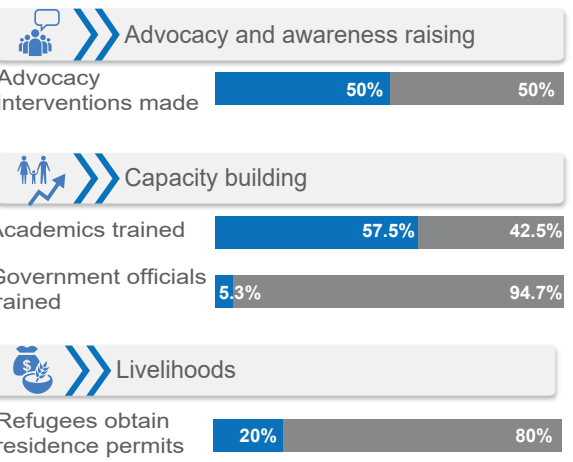

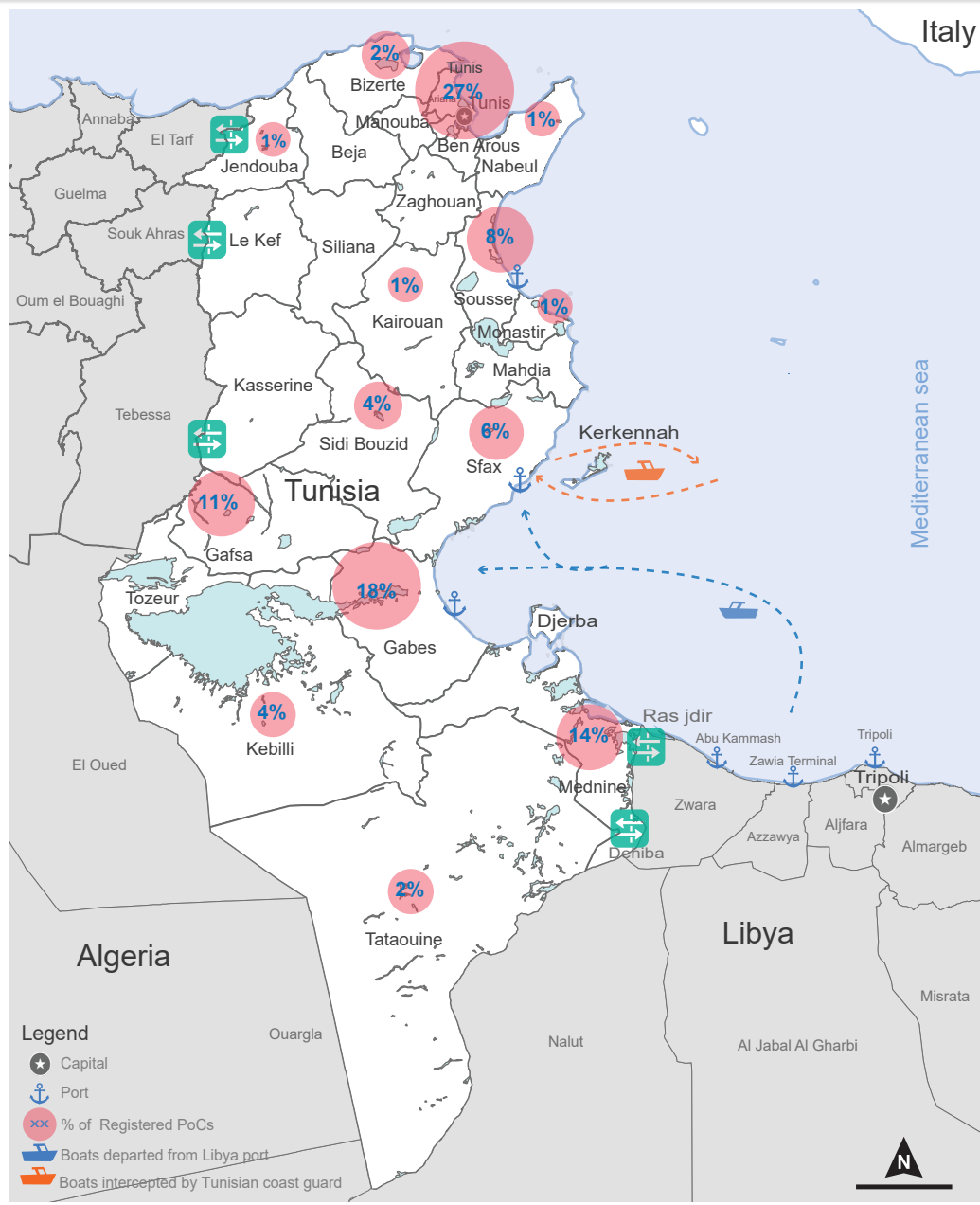
Registered persons of concern by country of origin

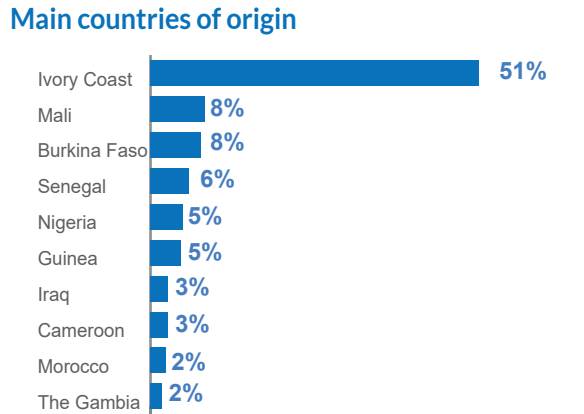
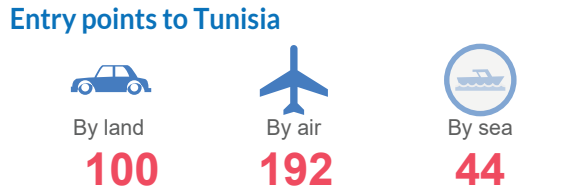

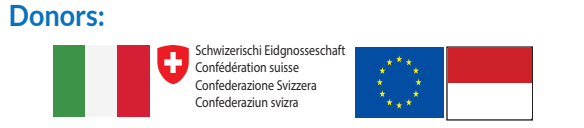


Italy Mixed migration and refugee arrivals in Tunisia

In 2017, **1,660** new arrivals within mixed migration flows were referred to Tunisian Red Crescent in Southern Tunisia (Medenine). Since October 2017, all new arrivals have been systematically profiled by UNHCR and partners using Kobo system, for a total number so far of **336** individuals, with the following findings;



Future intentions
14 to 15% of these new arrivals expressed intent to seek asylum.
