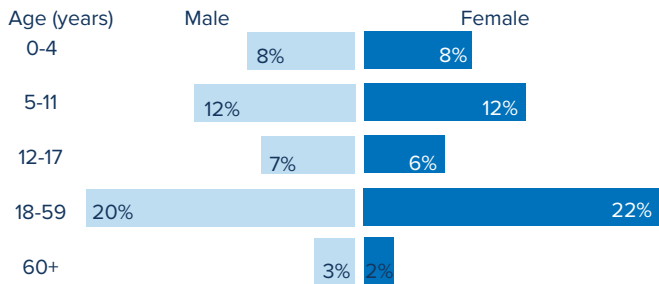

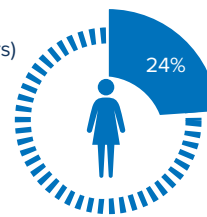
AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN \*\*



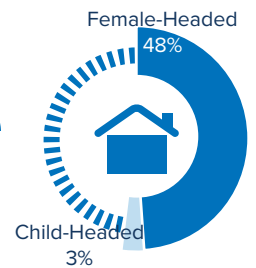
SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS) \*\*



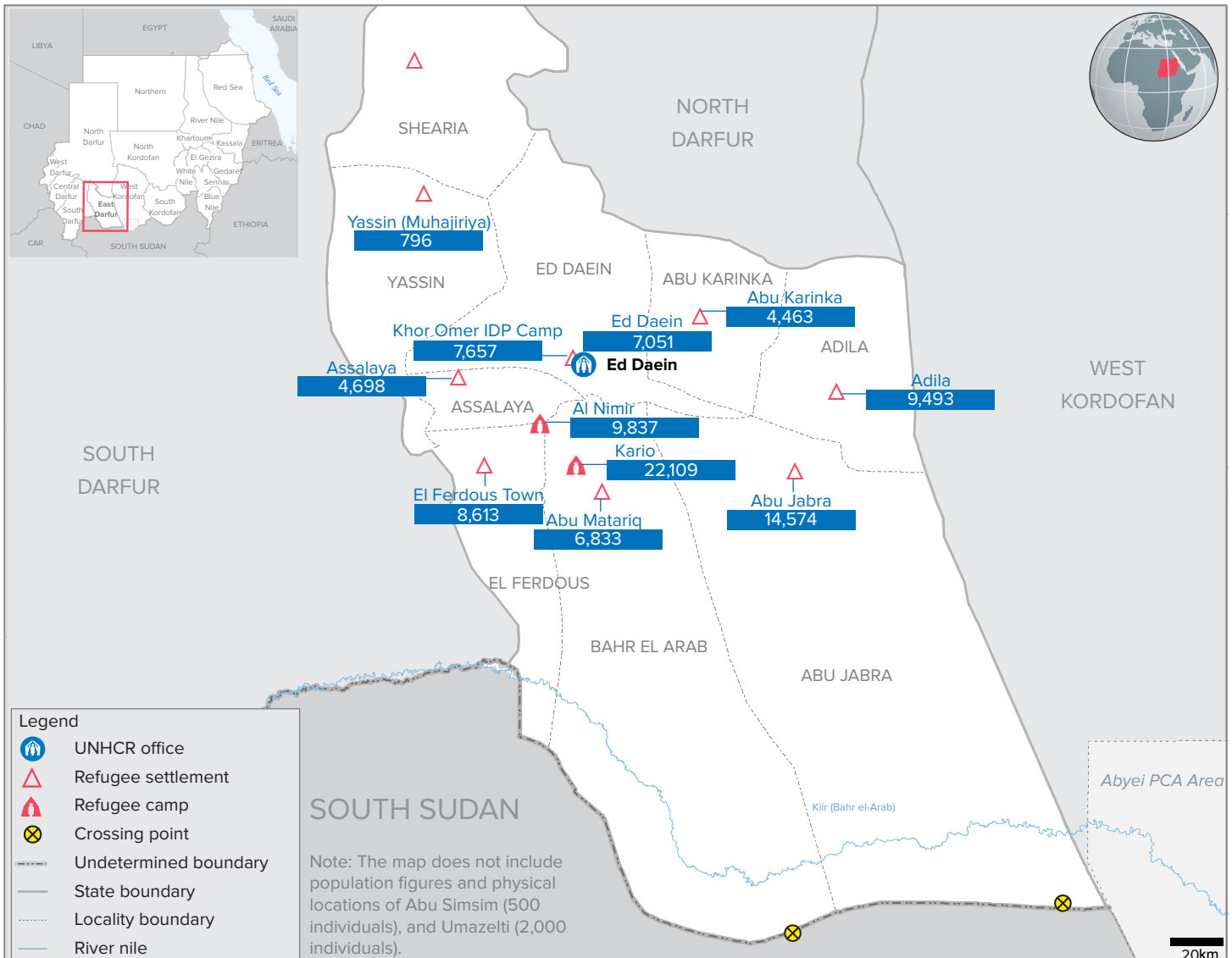
REPRODUCTIVE-AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS)\*\*

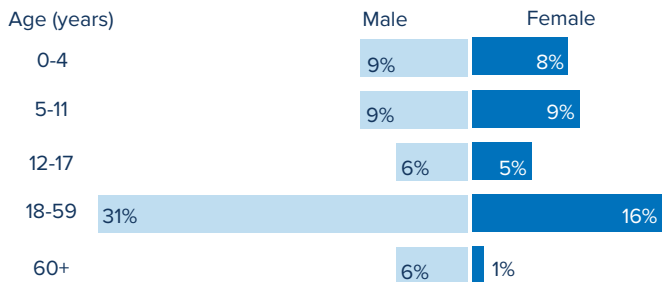

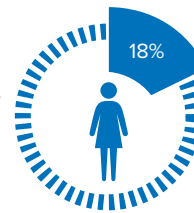

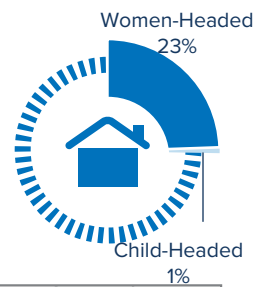
SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS) \*\*



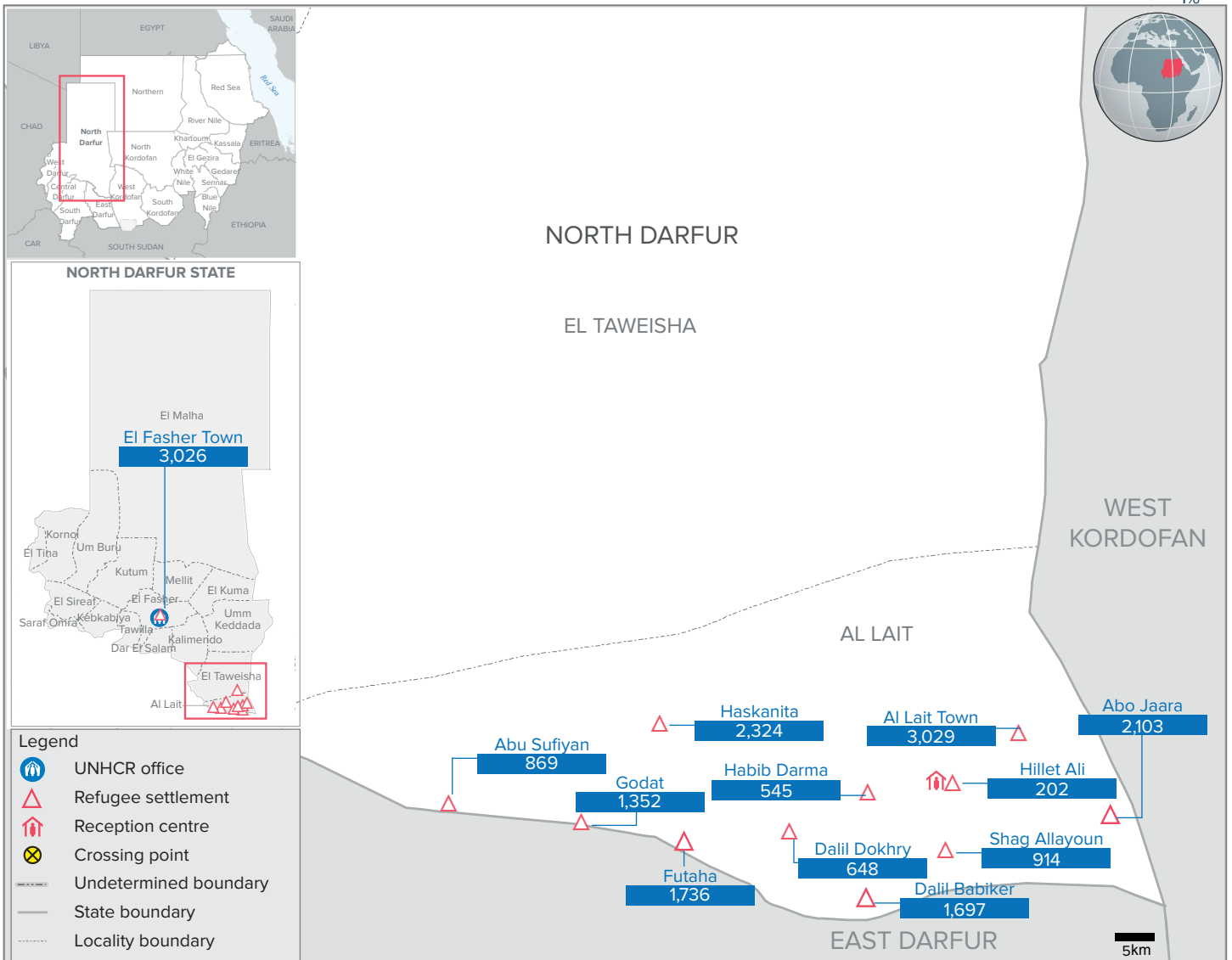

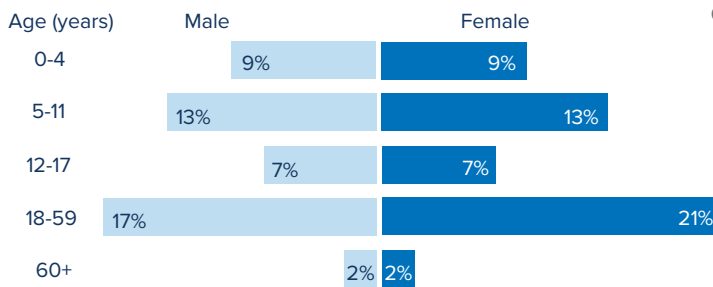

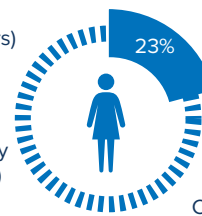

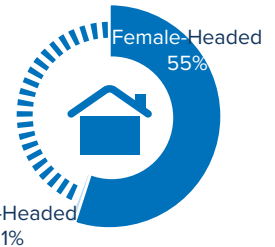
SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS) \*\*



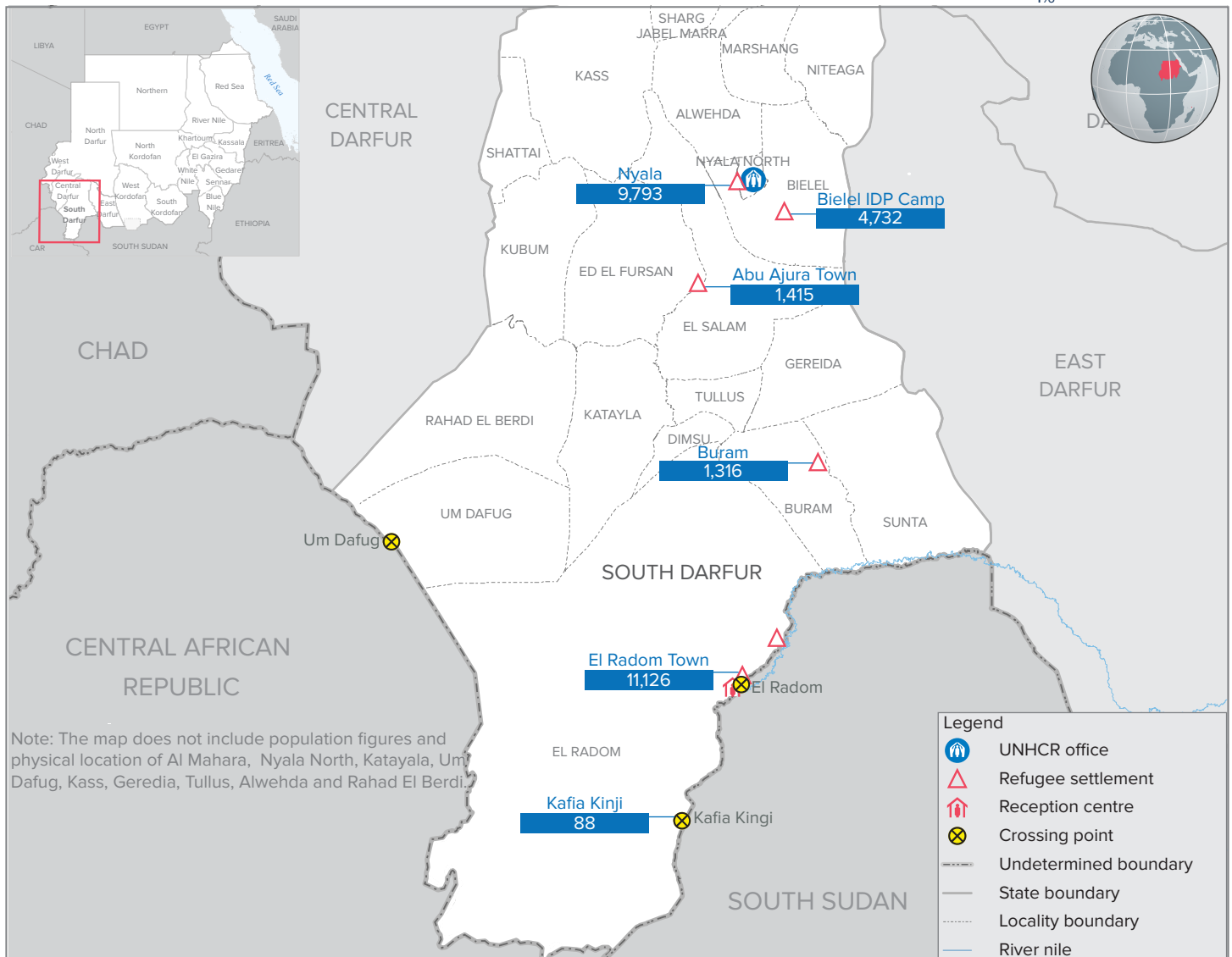
REPRODUCTIVE-AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS)\*\*

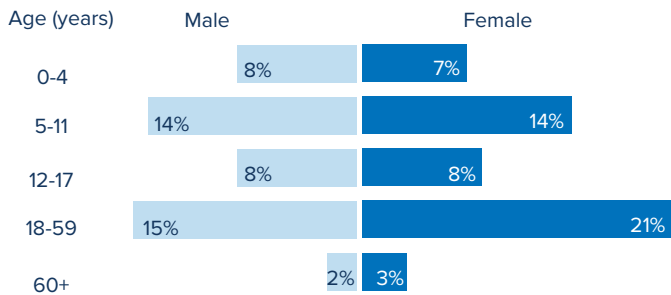

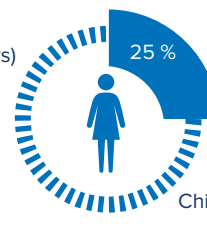
AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN \*\*



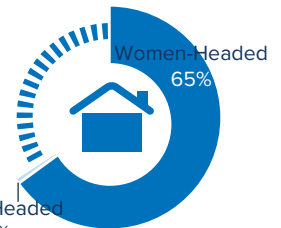
SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS) \*\*



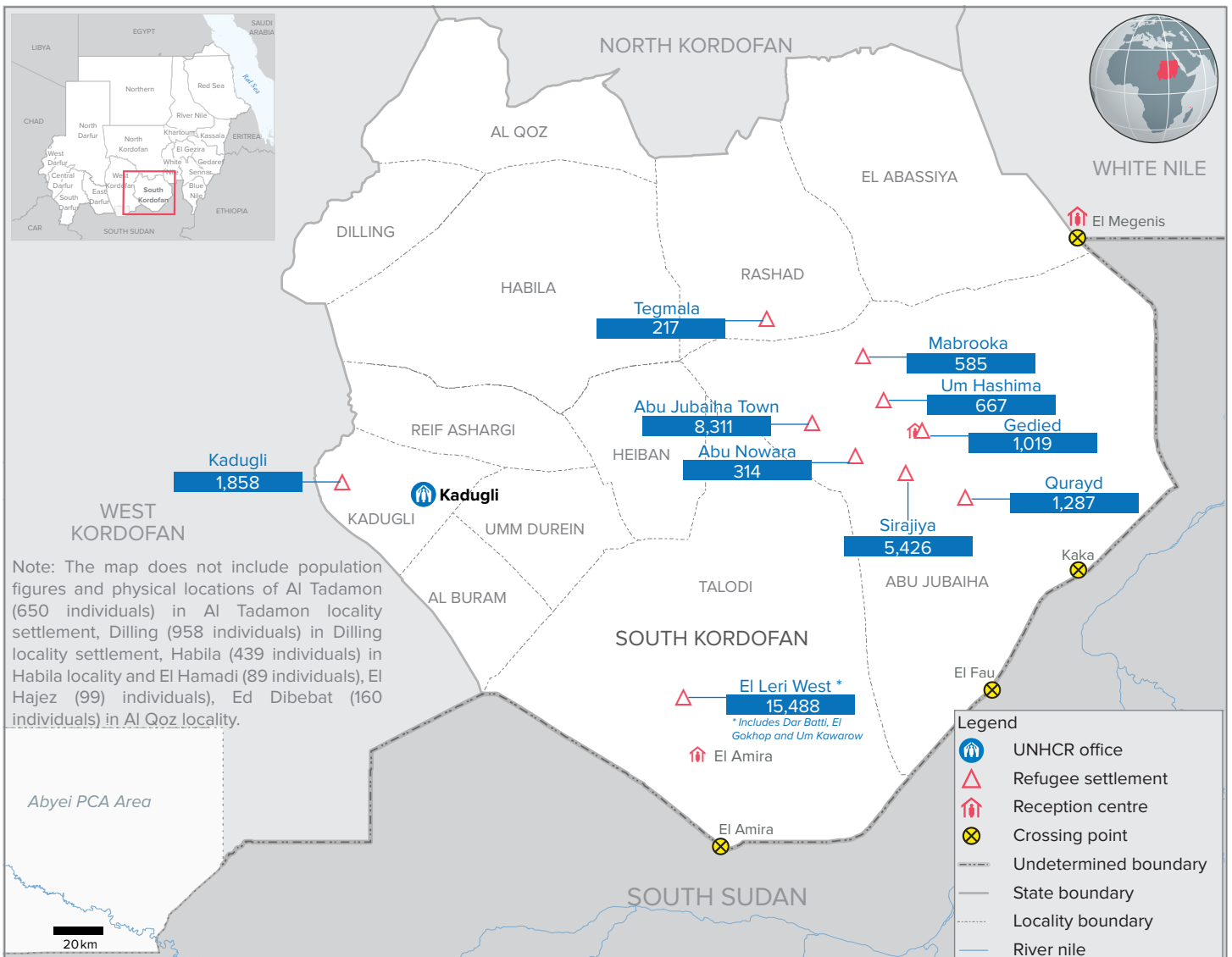
REPRODUCTIVE-AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS)\*\*

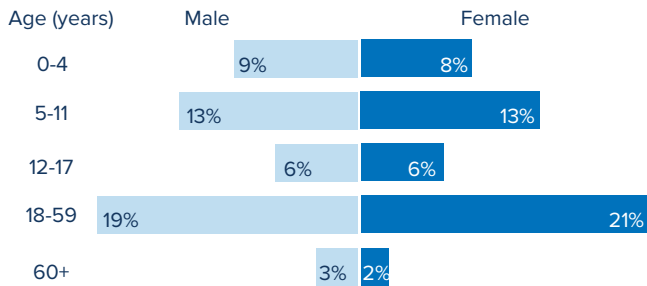

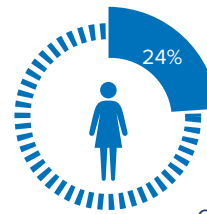

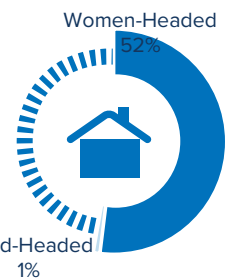

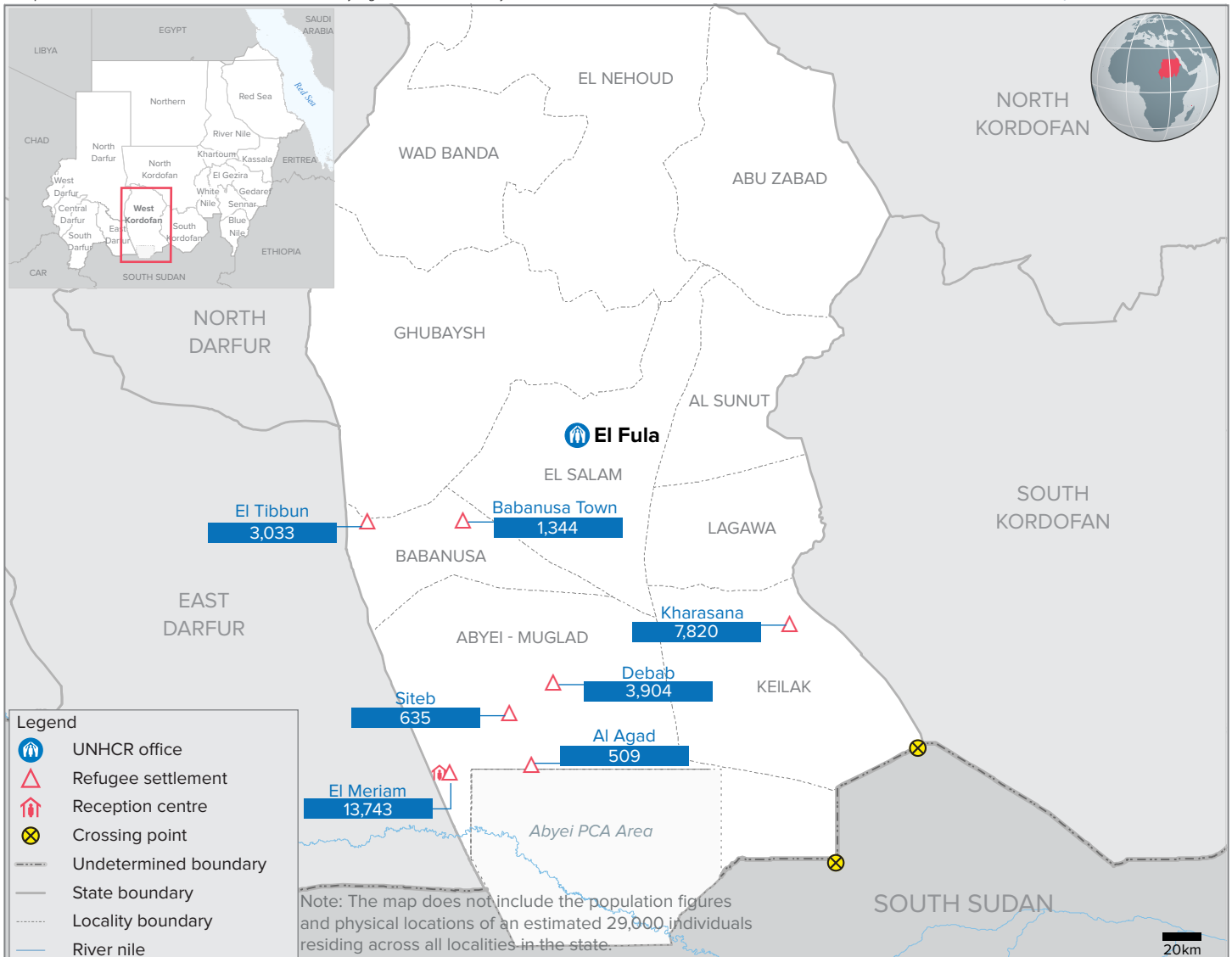

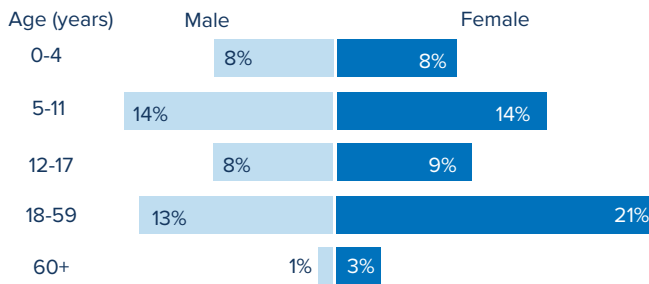

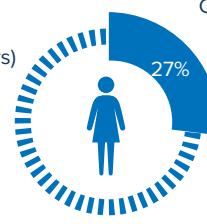
AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN \*\*



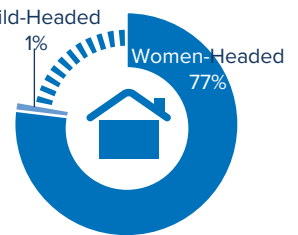

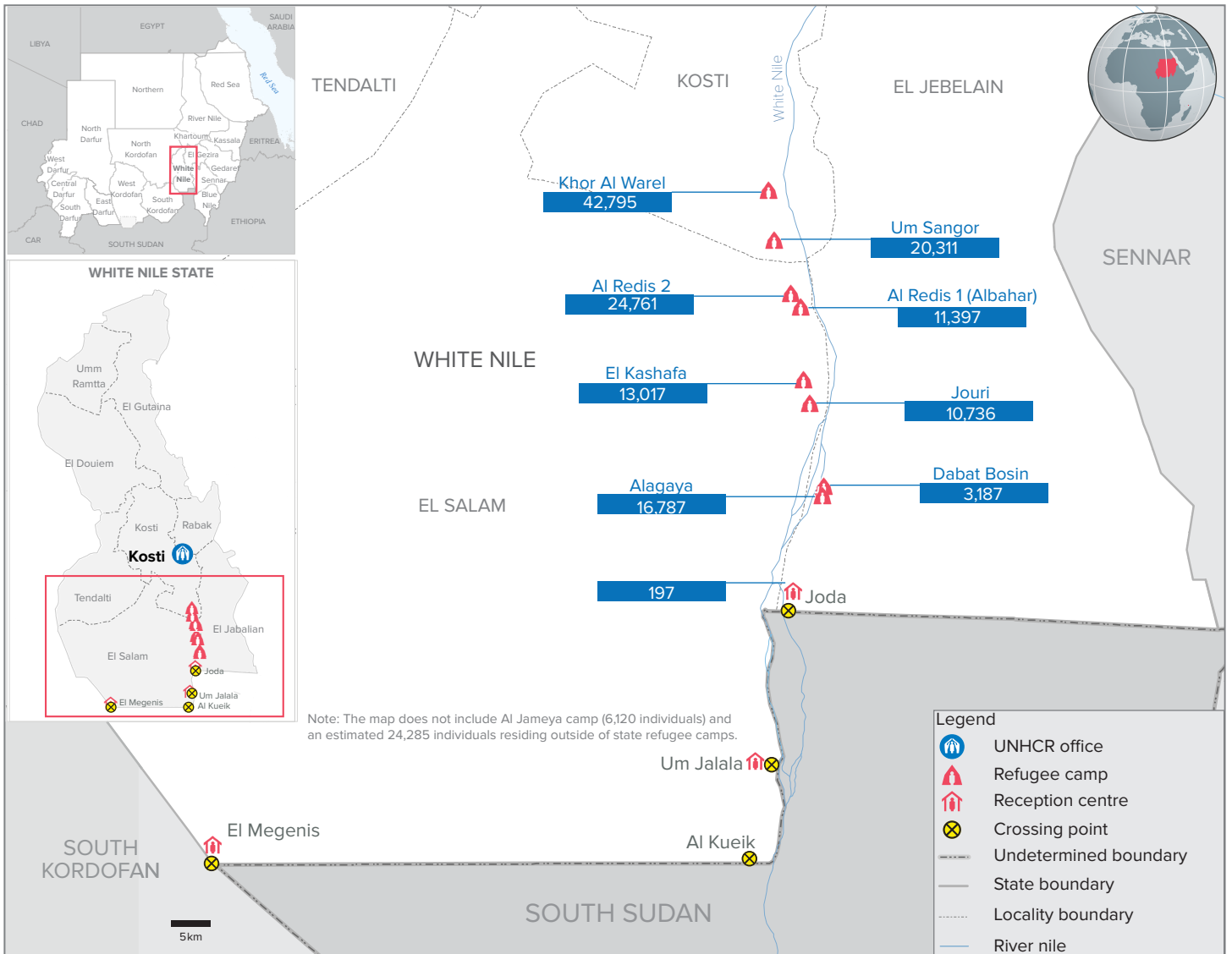
