HIGHLIGHTS

- According to KR-I MoE, the Syrian MoE will now recognize all students' certificates (Kurdish or Arabic) issued in Iraq.
- Back to school interventions began in all refugee locations in September and will continue until the end of the year.
- In September, 4,900 children benefited from non-formal education programs such as catch-up and remedial classes delivered by education partners.
- 243 teachers were trained on Education in Emergencies (EiE), life skills, and Psychosocial Support (PSS).
- Drafting of 3RP strategic document is underway, with partners, including government counterparts, engaged with consultations.

NEEDS ANALYSIS

- The current funding gap is affecting the payment of teachers' incentives in refugee schools. Payment of 1,230 teachers is required to meet the needs for the current academic year.
- More trained teachers are urgently required in order to enhance

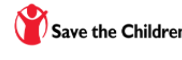
