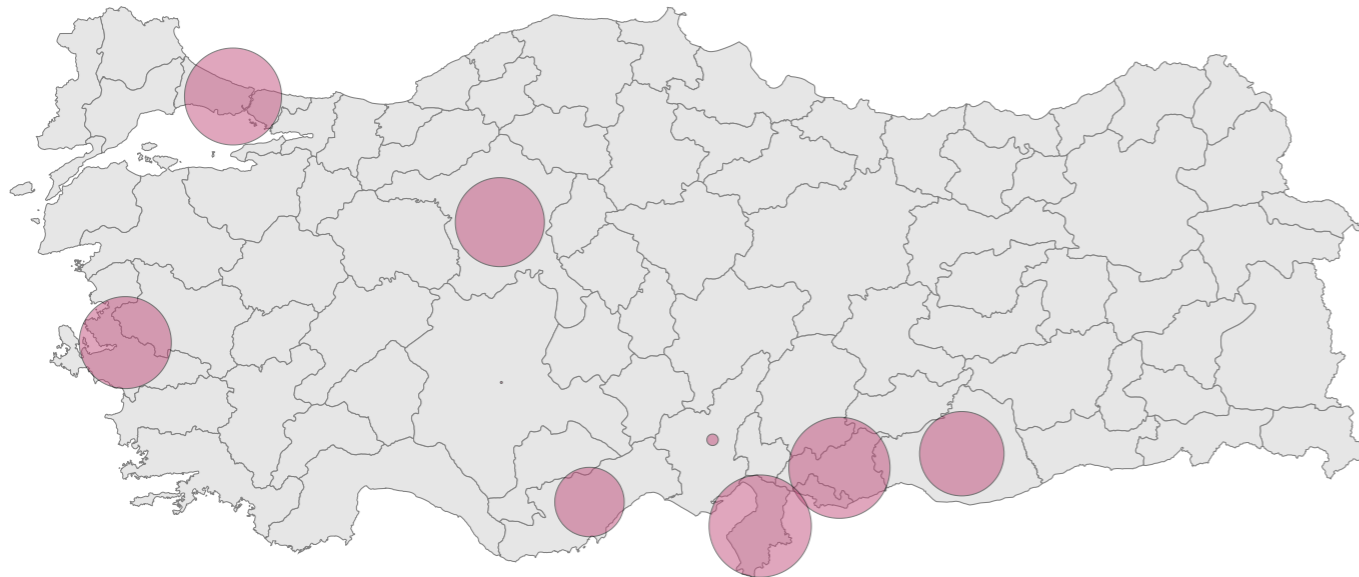


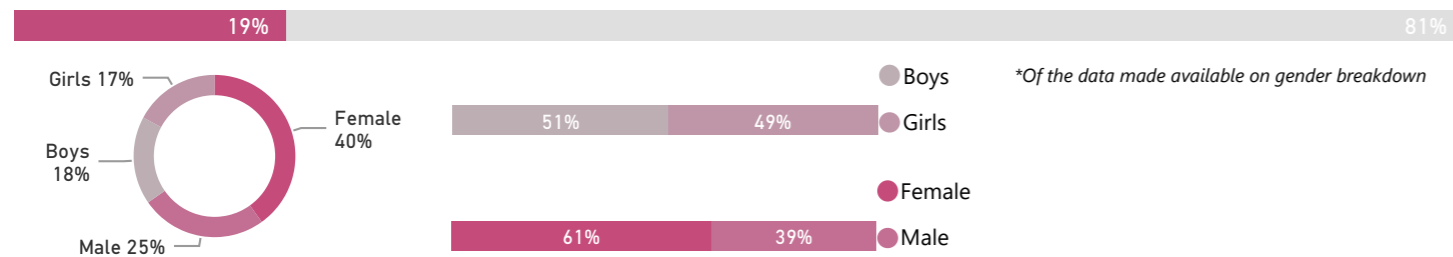
## # of consultations received by Syrian refugees in Turkey in refugee health centers directly supported by 3RP activities
