	<p>School rehabilitations, ( this is a consortium project with ACF and INTERSOS)</p> <p><b>ACF:</b> - EU MADAD project; infrastructure for water and waste water network and one borehole, and HH rehabilitations and School rehabilitations, (this is a consortium project with ACTED and INTERSOS)</p> <p><b>MC:</b> Currently, is implementing a five-year USAID funded Water Innovations Technologies (WIT) project. WIT seeks to sustainably increase water conservation by focusing on water efficiency in both the agricultural sector and amongst communities and households. The project targets the northern region where water reserves are under extreme pressure. It also focuses on enhancing the private sector role through adopting a Market System Development (MSD) approach. At this point, we are focusing on the House Hold (HH) component of the project by providing grey water systems and rain water harvesting tanks through a revolving fund system in northern parts of Jordan. We are also in the process of securing final USAID approval on three large scale communal water projects that includes major rehabilitation of two dams and a water catchment pond. We are expecting to commence the construction process next summer.</p> <p><b>Cewas Middle East:</b> Started implementation sanitation in Azraq, looking into the sanitation systems, funded by SDC.
