Refugees and Host Communities: Poverty Situation

Globally, 68.5 million individuals are forcibly displaced as a result of persecution, conflict, natural disaster or generalized violence

Among refugees, 85 % – or 16.9 million refugees – are hosted in developing countries facing socioeconomic challenges and high levels of poverty

In 13 countries surveyed by UNHCR, 50% of refugees and 44% of host communities (WBG 2018) live in extreme poverty

The Coalition Response



A coalition of UNHCR, The World Bank Partnership for Economic Inclusion (PEI) and 10 NGO partners will work towards the common vision of increasing resilience, self-reliance and social inclusion of refugees & host communities by sustainably increasing their income-earning opportunities



Parallel funding

where each organization manages its own fund raising is the coalitions funding model. Fundraising will be considered at the global, regional and country levels. UNHCR and PEI will be the main conveners by creating joint content, MoU, and events



Graduation approach

will guide the coalitions response. The duration of a graduation programme is 18-36 months per household, and includes a combination of cash support, market oriented skills for self- and wage employment, financial inclusion, asset transfer, access to social and legal services and mentoring



USD 500,000,000

needed for the coalitions activities during five years



500,000 households

consisting of refugees and host communities alleviated from poverty as an objective within 5 years



27 countries

targeted across Africa, Asia, Europe and Latin America in areas where both refugees and nationals live in poverty and close proximity
