NCFA is planning to have training for NGOs throughout the year of 2019.

Another note is disability inclusion. Guidance on the denial of resources from IRC. • Monitoring and evaluation: related how much you report on activity info. Evaluation assessment of the SWG and its functions to evaluate the performance of the group through a survey. Will continue this year in the 3rd quarter the survey. • Capacity building: training on adolescence girls from IRC • JHF funding for GBV • Will send the SWG electronic version for one week to update otherwise on week later it will be considered endorsed. 	
<p>IM update</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • JRP reporting: urging to update JORISS to match Activity info. • JRP highlight the importance of updating the project information through JORISS to help the government to track and report on JRP projects. • JORISS will centralize financial and technical info to allow MOPIC to track activities and funding • SGBV mobile app: provided a briefing training on the 23rd of April. • SGBV Mobile Application: All agencies who attended briefing should enter all data on services in the back end system. Organizations who have implementing partners should provide data on their implementing partners. Deadline to update the app is 15th of May 2019 to update. <p>Good practice IRC presentation:</p> <p>Girl Shine curriculum</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Girl shine presentation: • Chose girls for this curriculum: girls have limited mobility due to household chores which affects their social networks. Girls are a critical time. They are more susceptible to exploitation. <p>The package consists of four parts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How to guide • Girl shine life skills curriculum • Girl shine family curriculum • Mentor training manual. <p>Sessions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trust • Social and Emotional skills • Health and hygiene • Safety • Solidarity • Visioning <p>52 sessions, in each session many activities and cannot ask the girls to commit for all 52 sessions therefore sessions might be picked based on areas of function to establish curriculum.</p> <p>First piloting training was in February second will be September in all areas where IRC provide services</p>	
<p>Field Update from Mafrq SGBV SWG</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Established in April 2018. • Held 10 meetings so far. • Members are both international and national organizations. Governmental actors stopped coming (challenge) 	

	<p>Challenges:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Not targeting persons with disabilities. ➤ Livelihood services/women empowerment ➤ CMR services through Zaatari camp not in Mafraq urban area. ➤ Active participation from local community and government ➤ Mapping the services. <p>Achievements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Update sgbv referral pathway ➤ SGBV safe referral training for non-specialized SGBV staff “frontline workers” ➤ Finalized gap analysis report ➤ Enhancing the coordination between different SGBV actors (more efforts will be deployed to reach out to CBOs). 	
AOB	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • JHF Call proposal update: SGBV revision of proposals on the 9th of May. IRC and NHF will take part on the 9th of May 2019 for the revision. • WHO health consultant: capacity building of health service providers. The role out will be in 3 locations for a 2 day training after they receive the ToT. ToT training (in English) will be on the 10th of June targeting health care service providers only. The training is about the service itself and the referral (physicians, nurses and midwives)
