

Somalia

1 - 31 May 2019

In May, 60,000 new internal displacements were monitored by the UNHCR-led Protection and Returns Monitoring Network (PRMN). Of the 162,000 displacements monitored year-to-date, drivers include insecurity (91,000), drought related (60,000), floods (5,000) and other reasons (6,000)

refugees & asylum-seekers

As of May 2019, there were 34,158 refugees and asylum-seekers registered in Somalia, mainly from Ethiopia (16,542 asylum seekers and 4,017 refugees) and Yemen (48 asylum seekers and 12,981 refugees). 570 persons were from other countries including Syria (234), Tanzania (119), Eritrea (88) among others.
