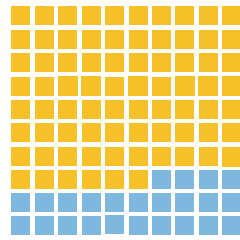
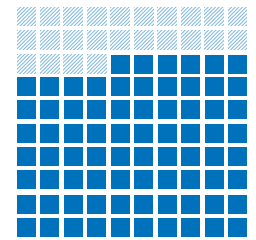

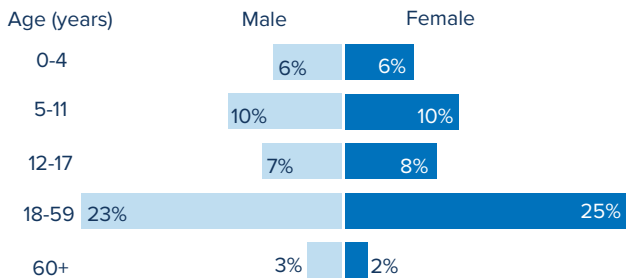
POPULATION DISTRIBUTION

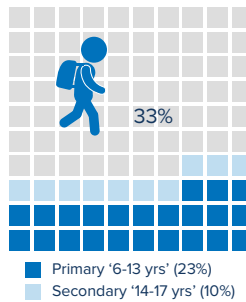

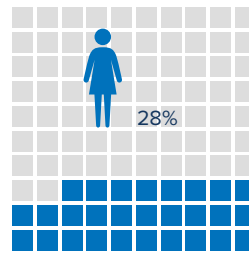

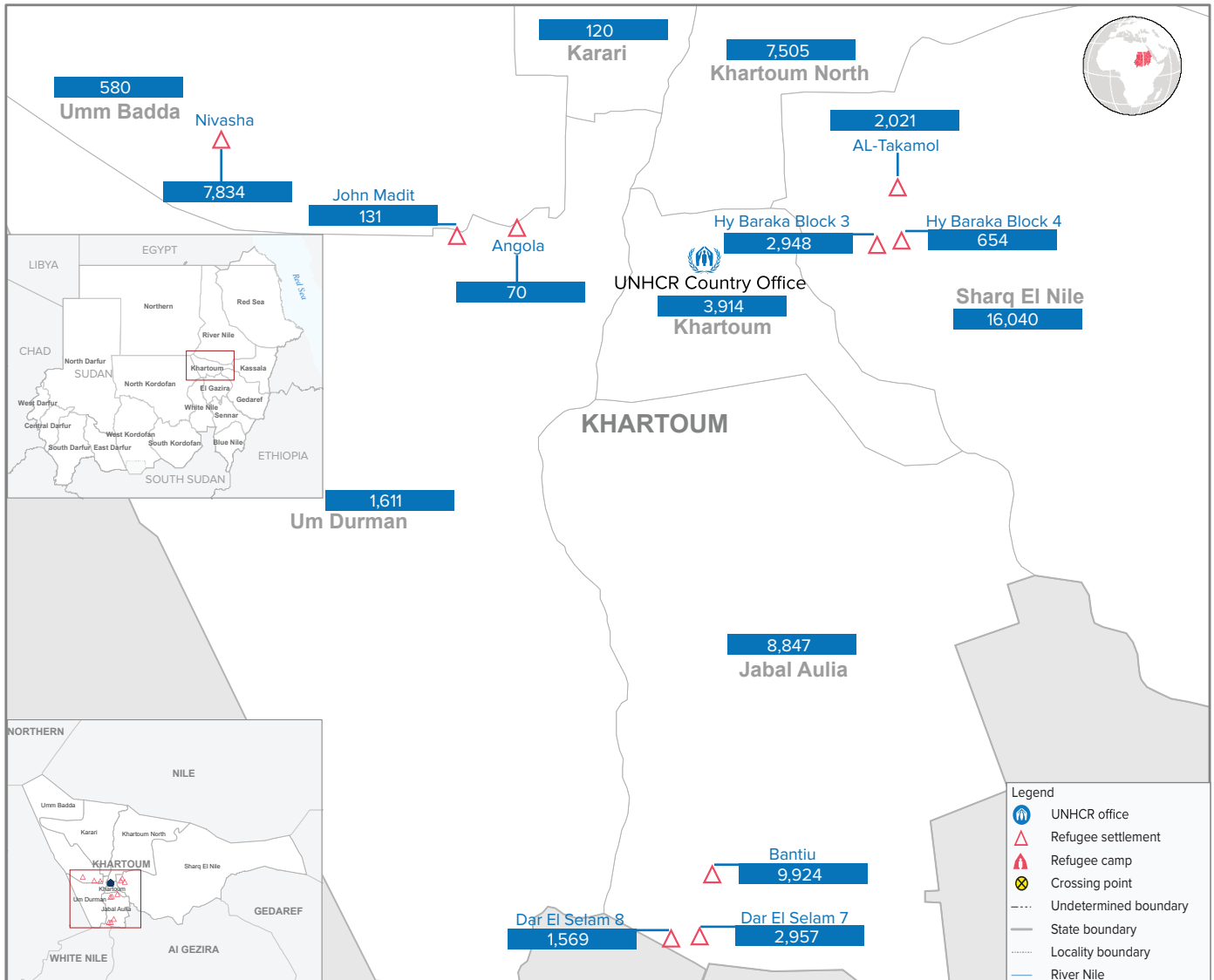
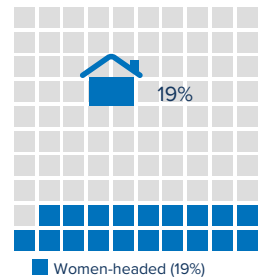
SCHOOL- AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>4</sup>

HOUSEHOLD DISTRIBUTION<sup>4</sup>



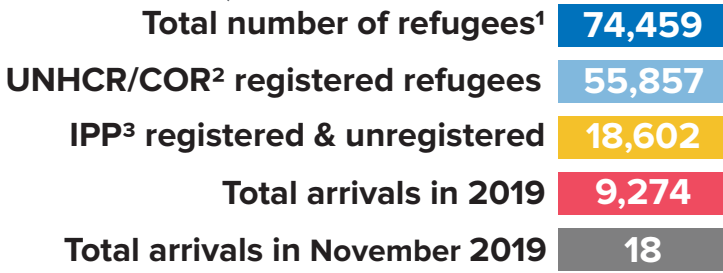

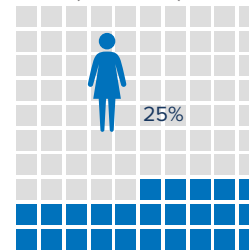
AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN <sup>4</sup>



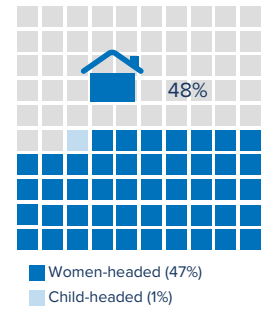
SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS) <sup>4</sup>



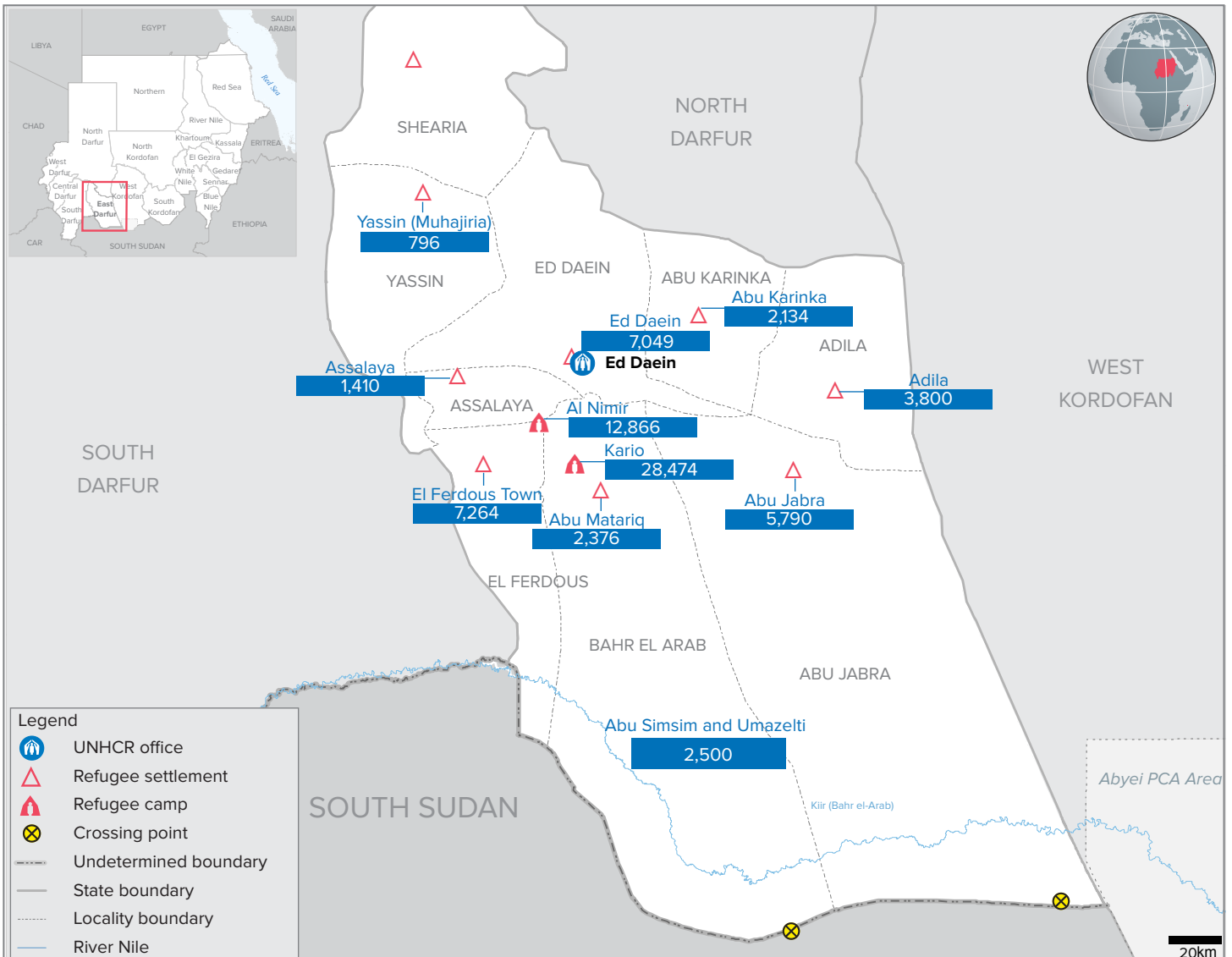
REPRODUCTIVE-AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS) <sup>4</sup>

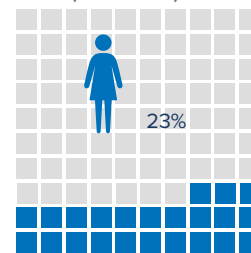
AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN<sup>4</sup>



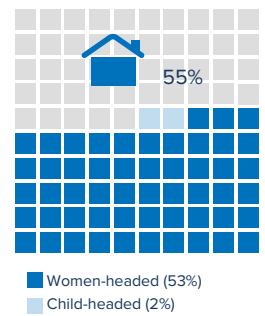
SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>4</sup>



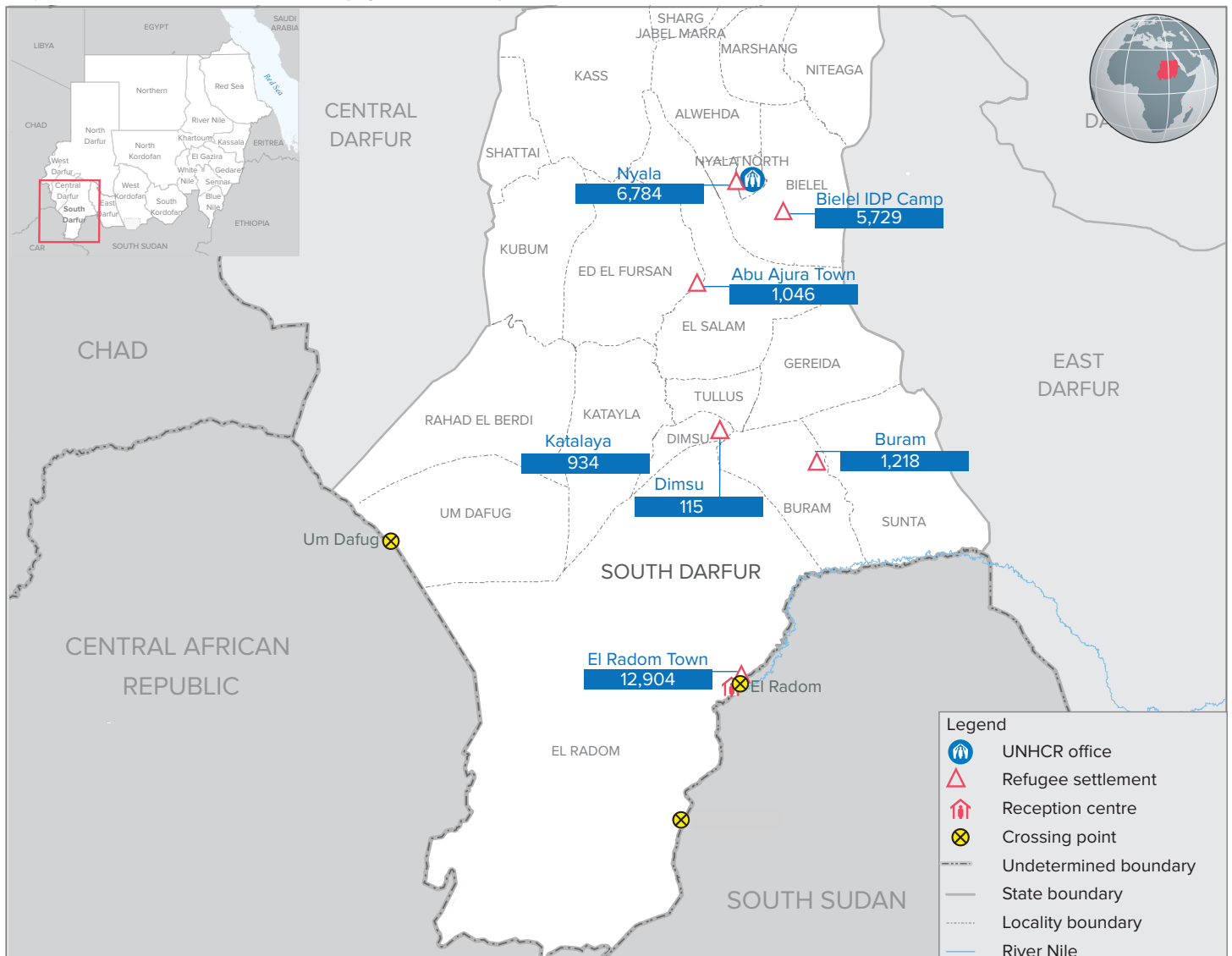
REPRODUCTIVE-AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS)<sup>4</sup>

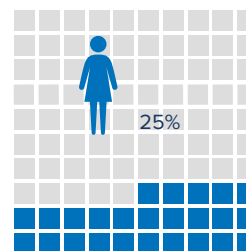

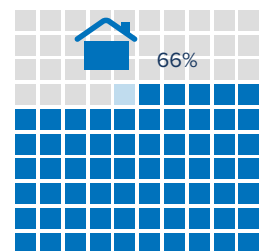
**SCHOOL- AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>4</sup>**



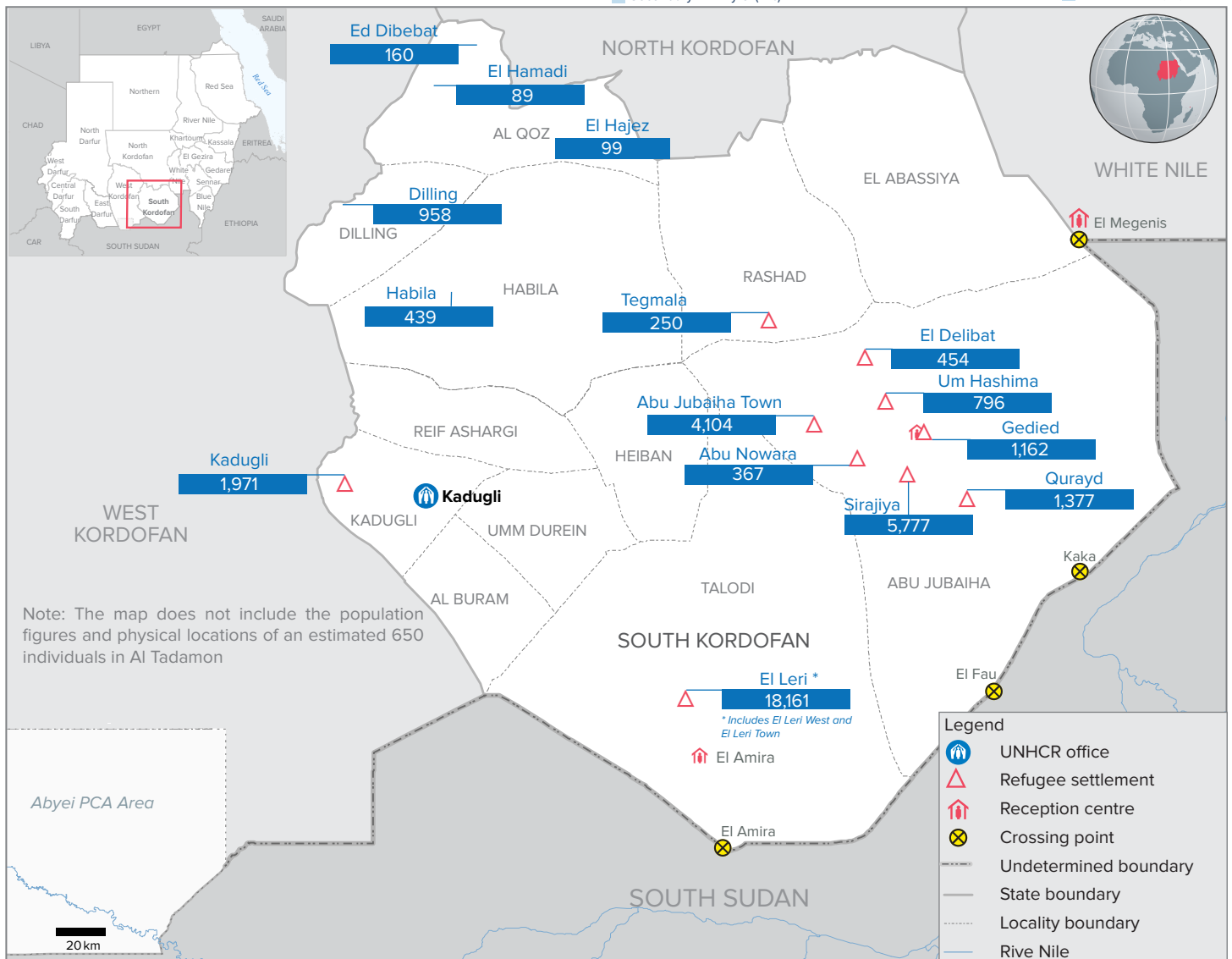

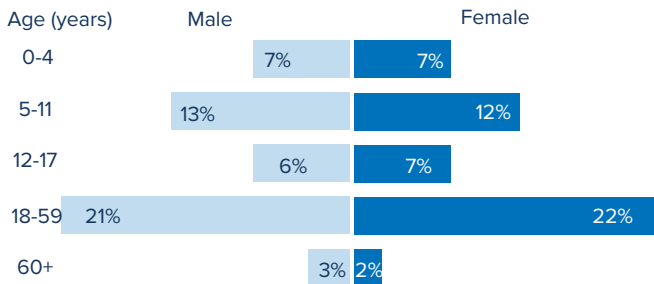

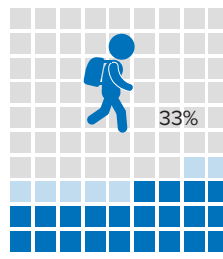

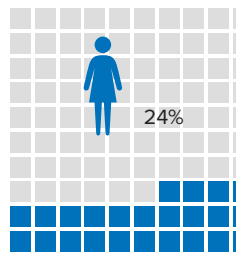


**SCHOOL- AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS) <sup>4</sup>**

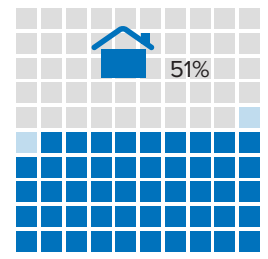

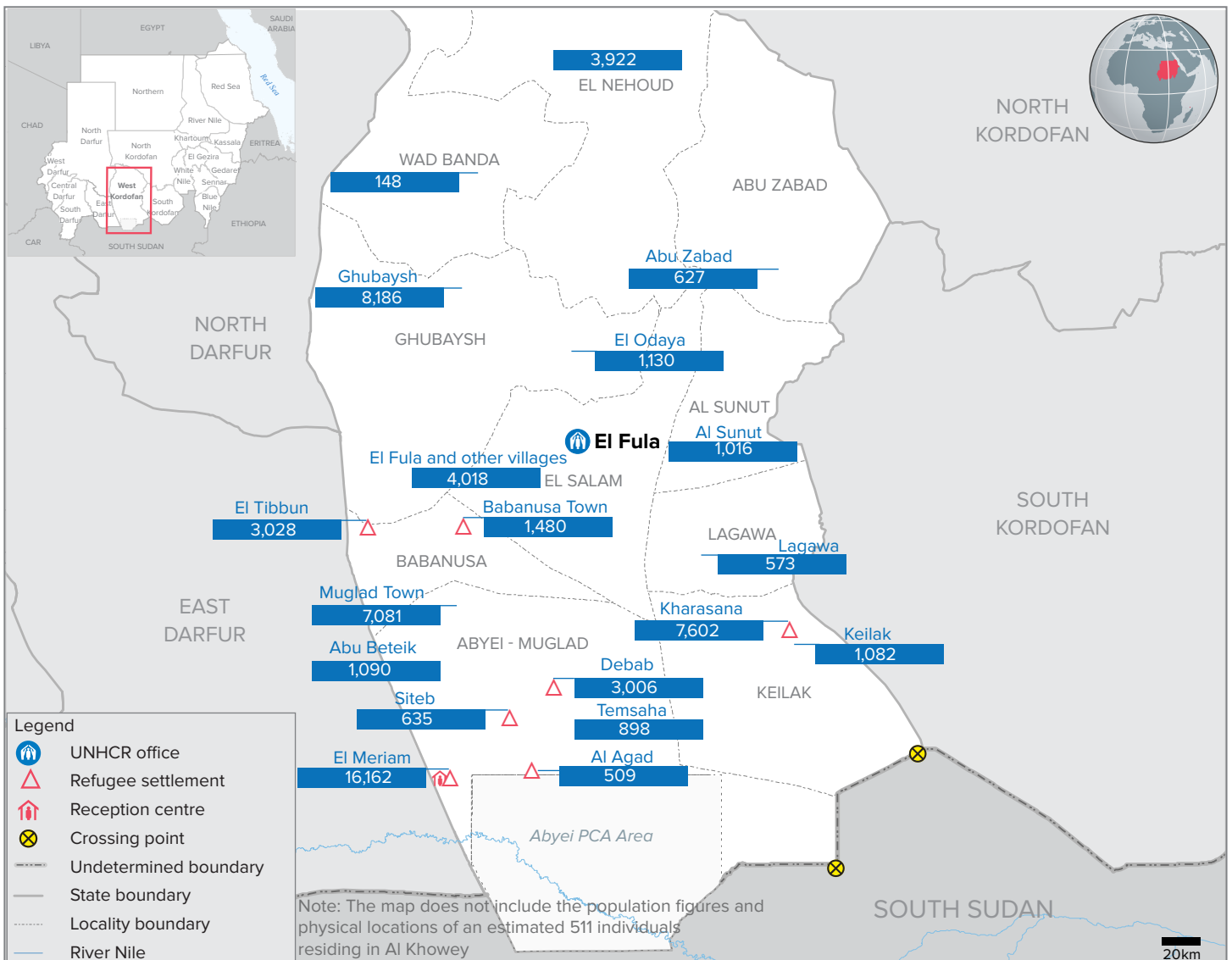

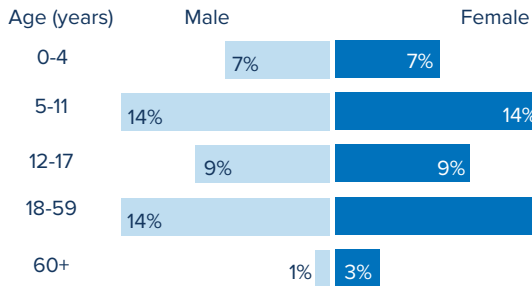

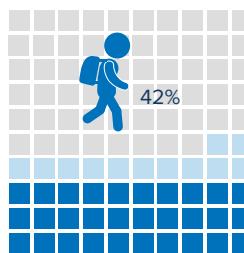

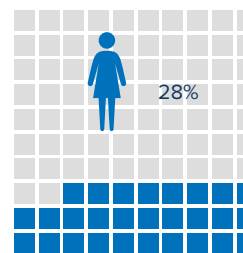
AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN<sup>4</sup>



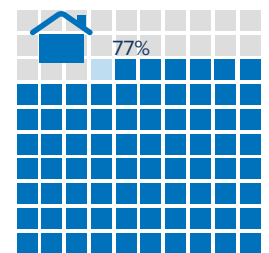
SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>4</sup>



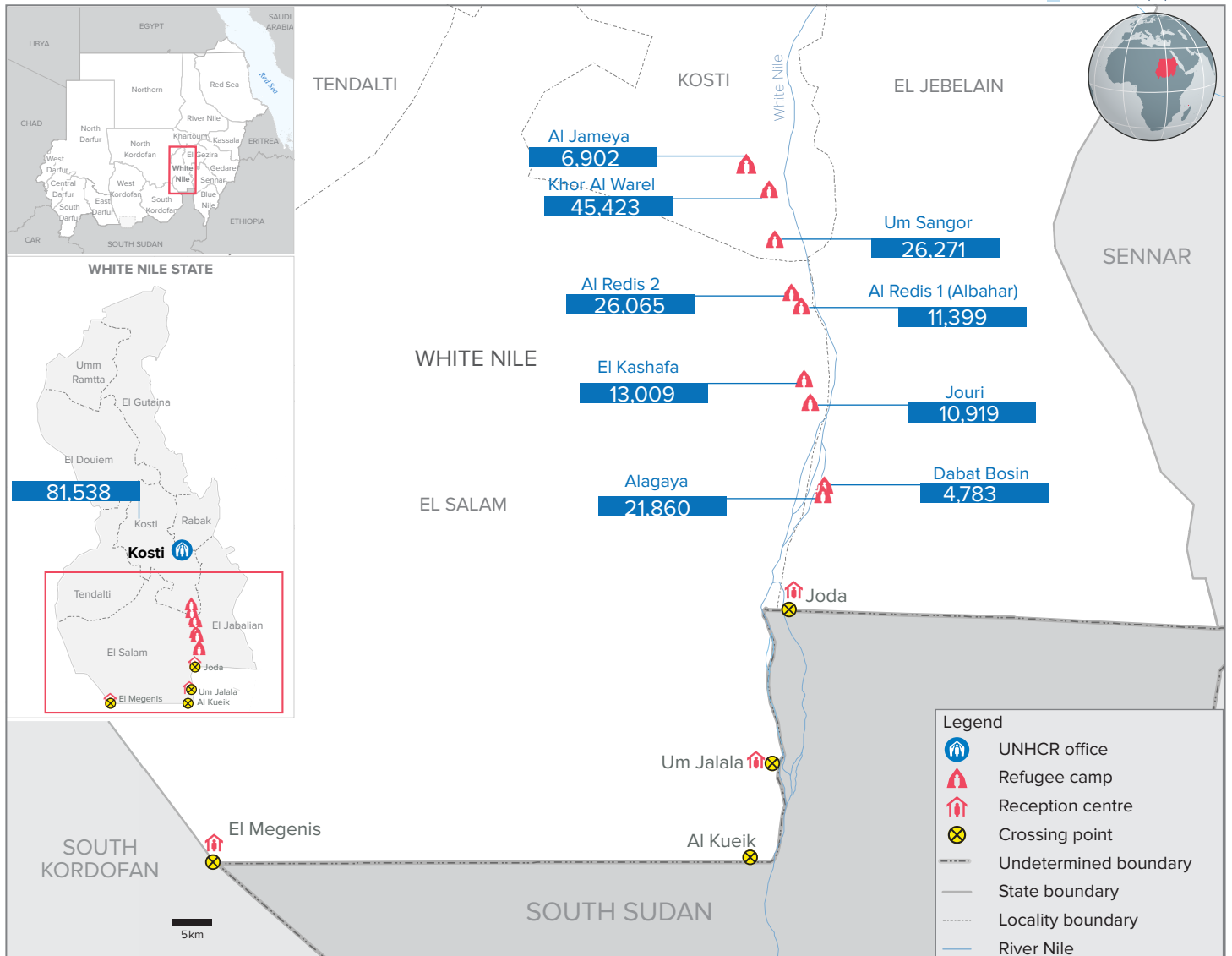
REPRODUCTIVE-AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS)<sup>4</sup>
