Refugees and Asylum seekers who are willing to register trading business under their names should be treated as non-Jordanian investors under the regulation of investment for non-Jordanians No. 77 of the year 2016. And The Amended regulations No.80 of the year 2019. Home Based Businesses activities are governed by the Commercial Law No.12 of 1966, Companies Law No. 22 of 1997and amendments, Law of Professional Licenses for the City of Amman No. 20 for 1985, The Municipalities Law No.13 of the year 2011, in addition to the Instructions of licensing HBB of the year 2017, and a Cabinet Decision allowing Syrians to register and operate HBBs. Accordingly; the Ministry of Industry and Trade does register HBBs for Syrians with a full ownership.
