



**TOTAL DISPLACEMENTS**

**37,000** in February

The UNHCR-led PRMN implemented in partnership with NRC reported 37,000 new internal displacements in the month of February 2020. Of these, 25,000 were triggered by conflict /insecurity and 11,000 drought related.



**CONFLICT / INSECURITY DISPLACEMENTS**

**25,000** in February  
**53,000** (Jan - Feb 2020)  
**15,000** (Jan - Feb 2019)

In Galgaduud region, more than 17,000 people were displaced due to armed conflict between Al Sunna Wa Jamma militia and Somali National Army – this has now been diffused. Conflict related displacements continue in Lower Shabelle region with 4,000 forced to flee their homes in February, the majority arriving in Mogadishu.






**DROUGHT RELATED DISPLACEMENTS**

During the month of February, Sanaag (2,000) and Bay (2,000) regions were the most affected by new displacements where the main reason given was lack of livelihood.







**About PRMN**

The PRMN (Protection & Return Monitoring Network) is a UNHCR-led project which identifies and reports on displacements (including returns) of populations in Somalia. The network also identifies and reports on protection risks and incidents underlying such movements. Only figures collected by PRMN are reported above. Not all displacements in Somalia are captured. This dashboard should be read in conjunction with the Notes on PRMN Methodology (<https://data2.unhcr.org/en/documents/details/53888>) which outline the approach and certain limitations. The figures shown are for numbers of individuals and are based on interviews with key informants and/or displaced households at destination (unless otherwise noted).
