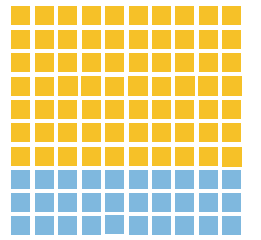
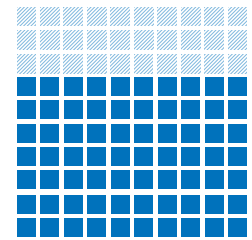

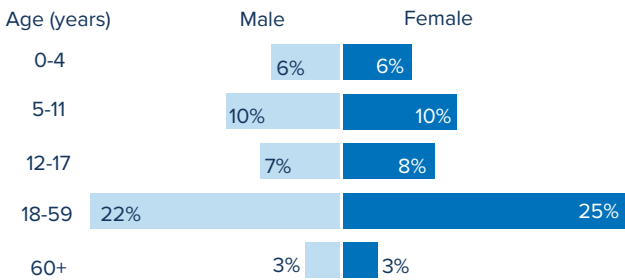
POPULATION DISTRIBUTION

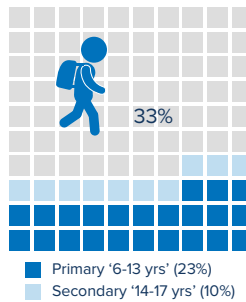

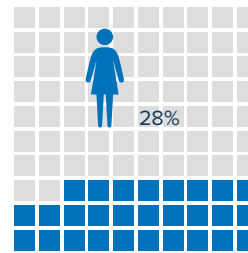

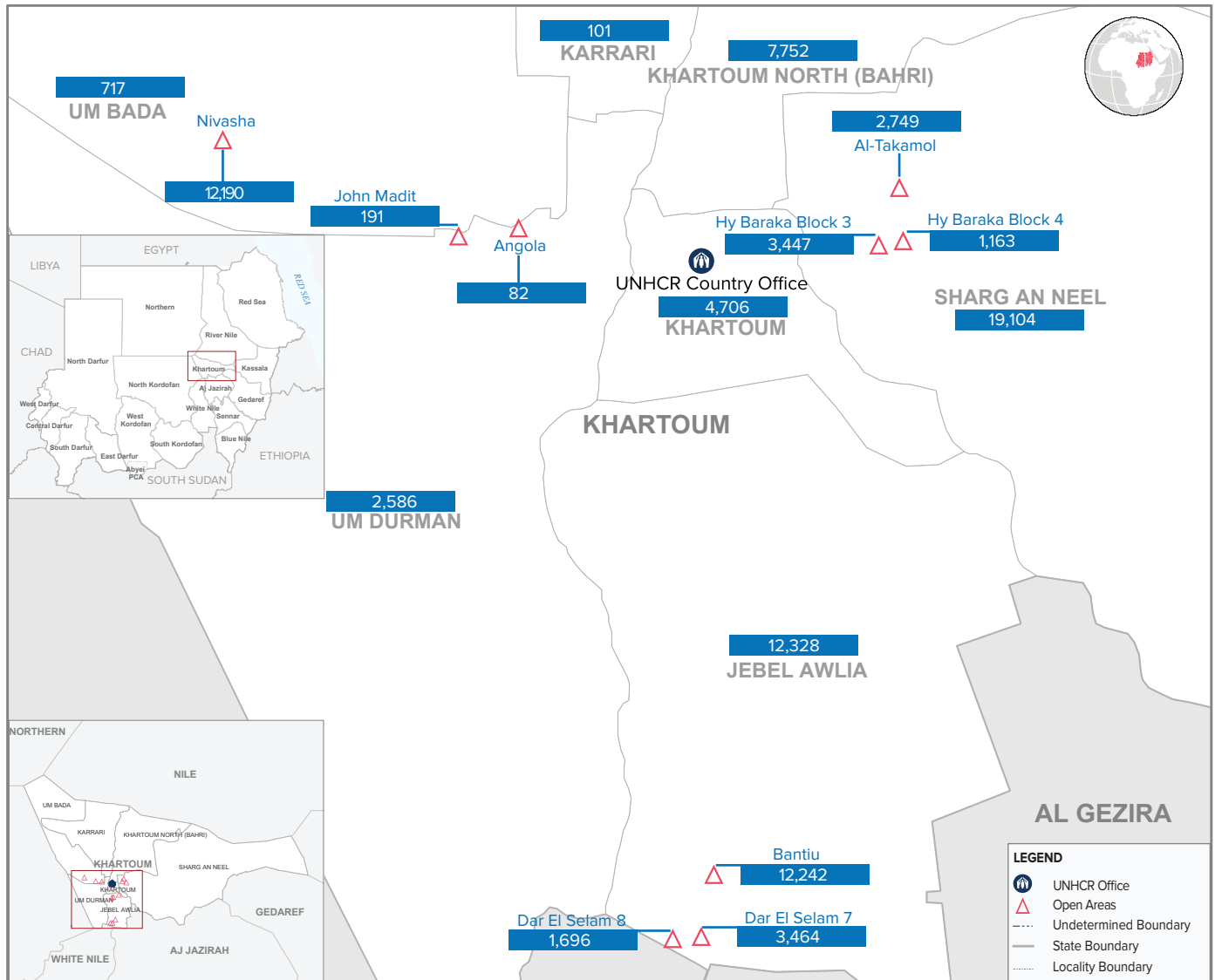
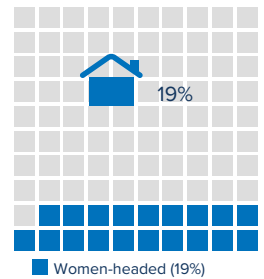
SCHOOL- AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>4</sup>

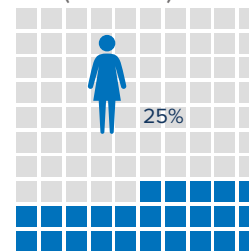

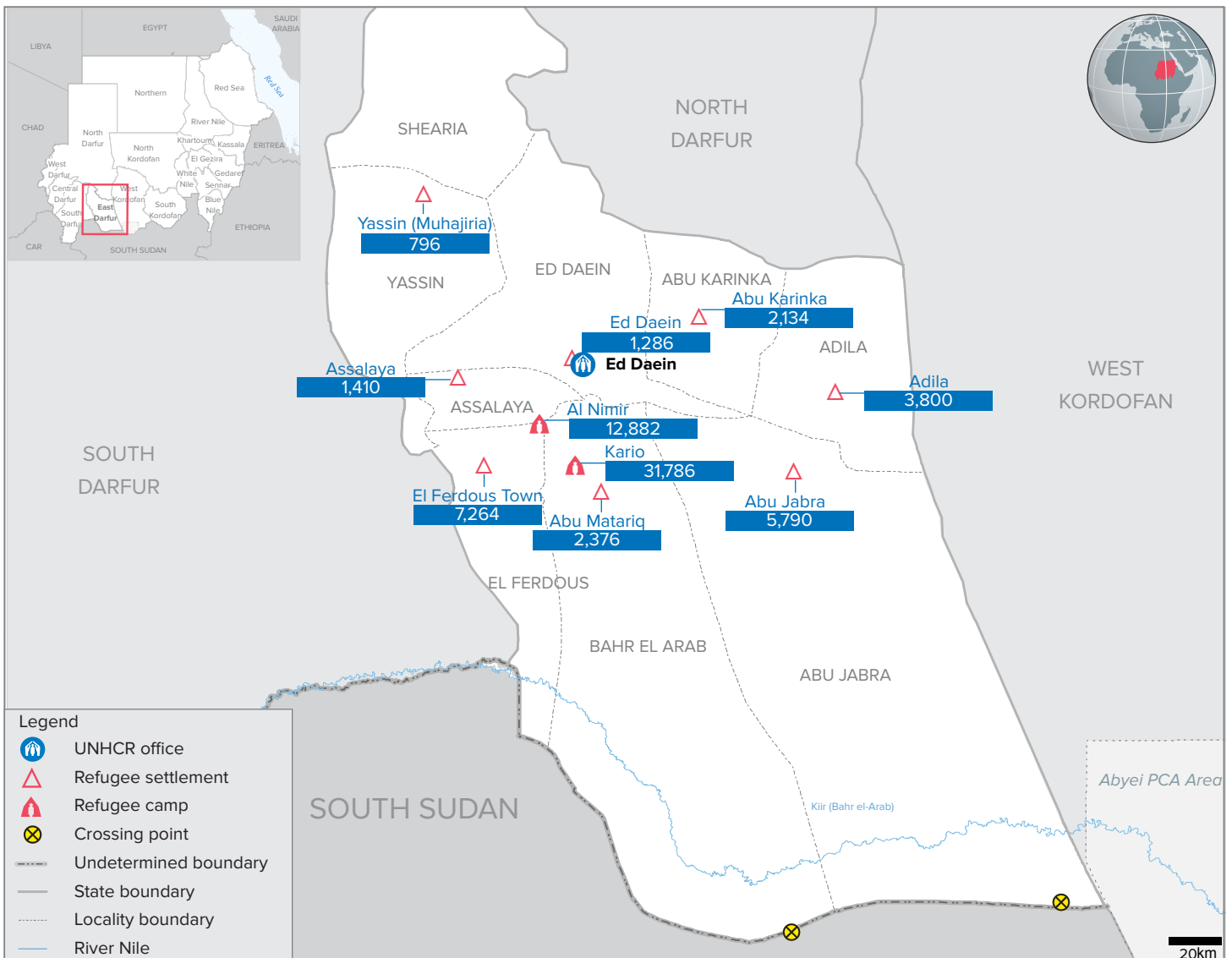

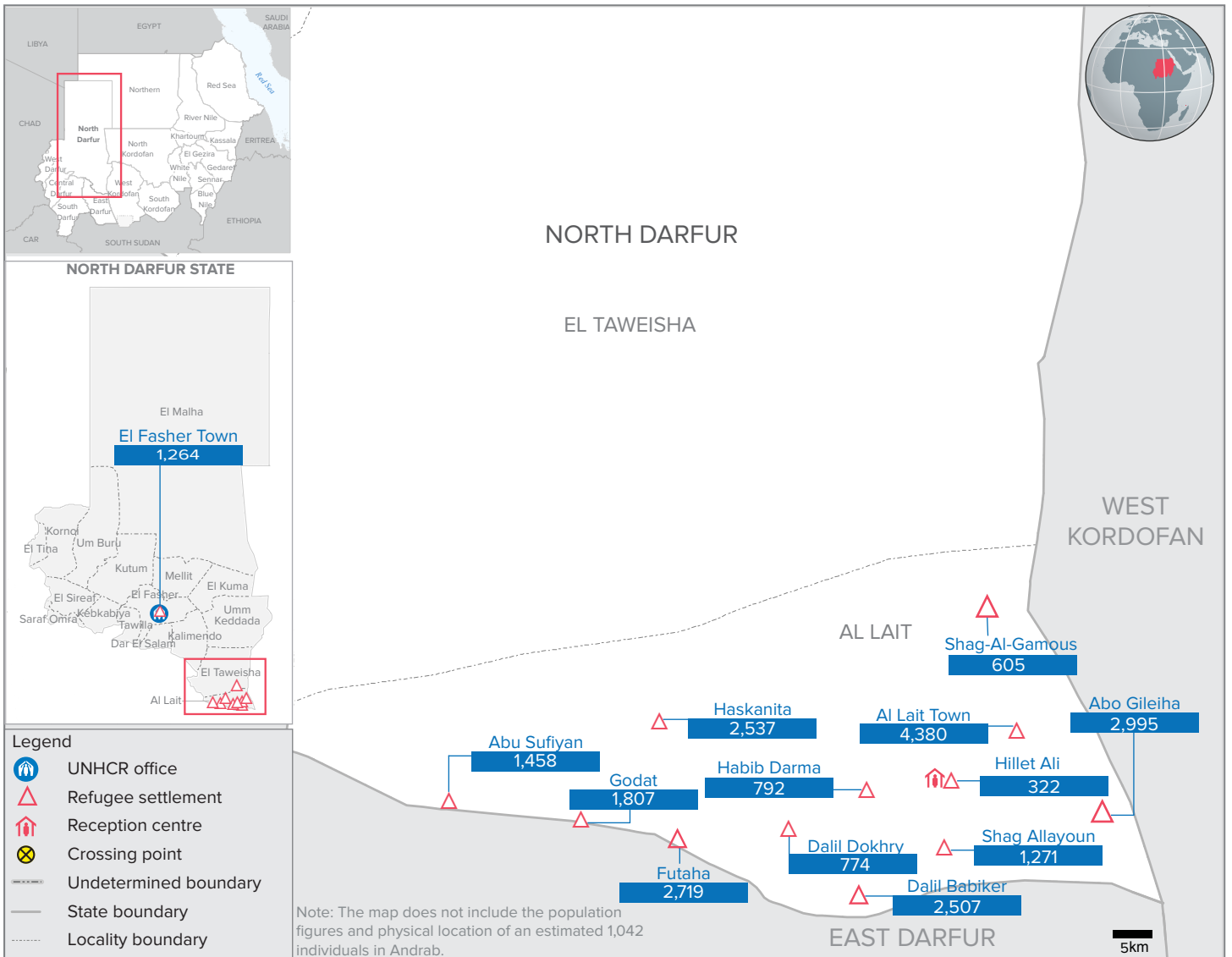

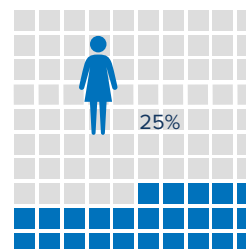

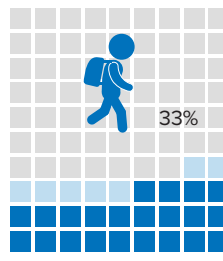

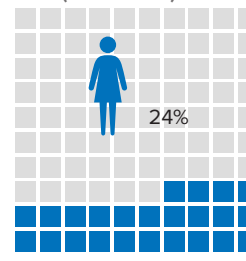

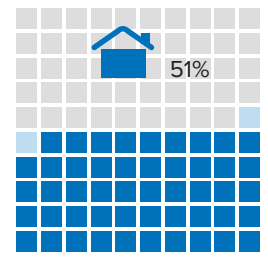

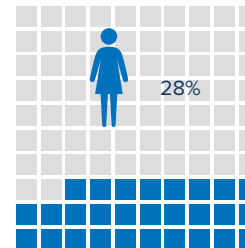
AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN<sup>4</sup>



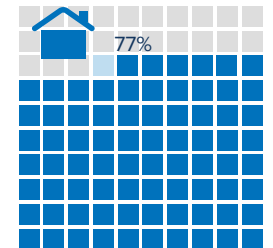

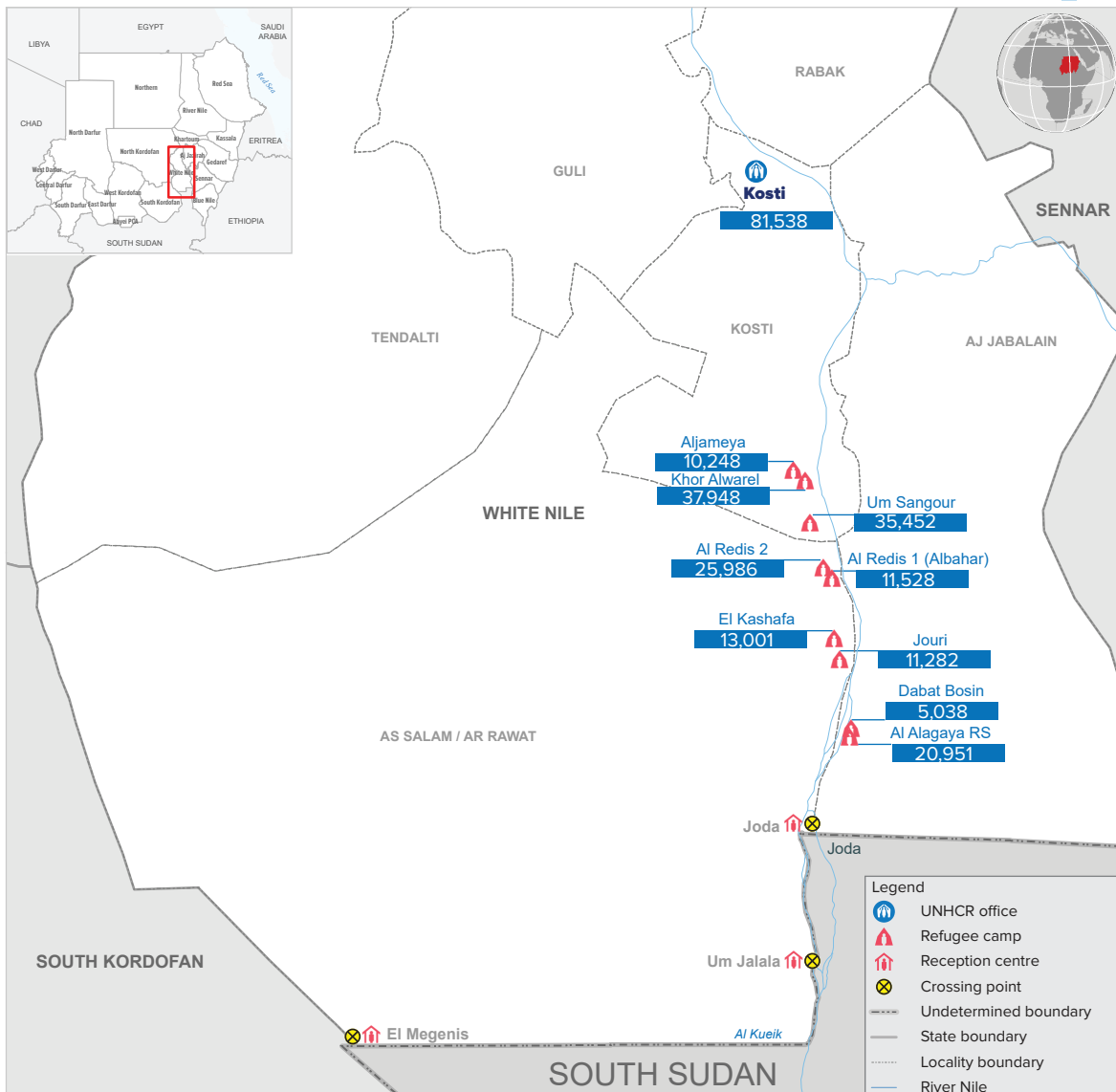
