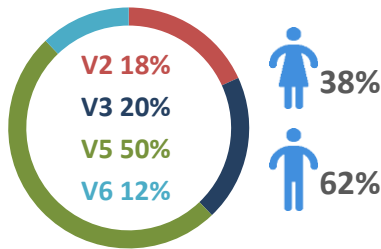

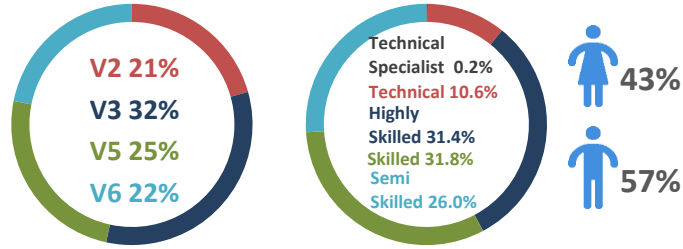

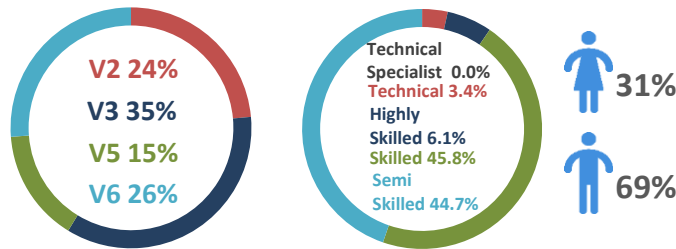
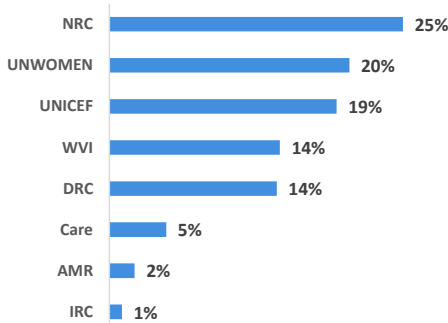

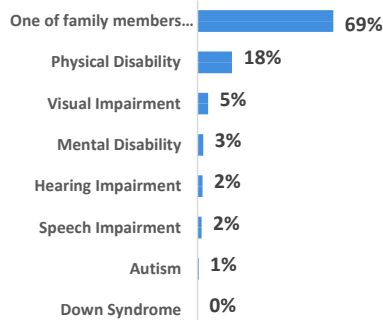

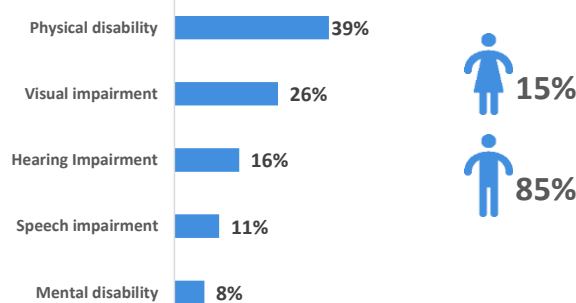

Feedback received from the community:

- Community members showed their dissatisfaction regarding the number of IBV opportunities in Azraq Camp and requested to work on increasing the number of available vacancies.
- Also community members demanded to have additional options of applying to available IBV vacancies other than using smart phones / applying through internet since not all camps residents have smart phones and internet bundles.
