

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- ◆ 604 confirmed cases of COVID-19 (as of 17 Feb)
- No active cases
- ◆ Over 26,000 PCR tests conducted
- 8 refugees vaccinated (at least first dose)
- ◆ Over 750 registered for the vaccine
- Enhanced communication and community engagement
- Surveillance and monitoring
- ◆ 50-bed-capacity quarantine area

KEY FACTS & FIGURES

- ◆ 80% of school-aged children currently enrolled in education 12,029 children from KG2 to Grade 12 (49% female) enrolled in formal education
 - 274 children (58% female) enrolled in MoE-recognized non-formal education
- 3,956 work permits registered in the databas, including 1,493 females
- 1,559 refugees, including 43% female, engaged in the Incentive-Based Voluneer (IBV) scheme
- 375 formal shops owned by refugees and host community
- ◆ 5,151 average weekly health consultations per week

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- ◆ 1,329 confirmed cases of COVID-19 (as of 17 Feb)
- 36 active cases
- Over 22,000 PCR tests conducted
- 237 refugees vaccinated (at least first dose)
- Enhanced communication and community engagement
- Surveillance and monitoring
- Mask House producing 1,200 masks daily
- ◆ 365 additional 3x3m prefabricated rooms added to households with persons at high risk of infection of COVID-19

KEY FACTS & FIGURES

- ◆ 19,243 children currently enrolled in education, with 6,159 children out of school 91 KG2 classrooms benefitting 2,149 children | non-formal education benefitting 1,357 students 4,426 children and 3,142 parents benefitting from integrated learning support offered by UNICEF Makani centres
- ◆ 32 schools and 58 community centres
- 13,773 work permits (appx. 39% of Zaatari's working-age population), including 23% female
- 4,105 refugees, including 37% female, engaged in the Incentive-Based Voluneer (IBV) scheme
- ◆ 3,506 average weekly health consultations per week
- ◆ 1,100 caravans repaired based on specific needs assessments
- 4km (32,000 m²) have been paved with base course in District 1
