

Methodology: Unearmarked funding is allocated and reallocated multiple times during the year to allow UNHCR to fund prioritised activities. This funding update includes an indicative allocation of funds so as to accurately represent the resources available for the situation. The contributions earmarked for the Central African Republic Situation shown above are combined with an indicative allocation of the softly earmarked and unearmarked contributions listed below. This allocation respects different levels of earmarking. Adjustments relate to programme support costs and carry-over.

Notes:

1. The financial requirements of the Central African Republic Situation include requirements in Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Democratic Rep of the Congo and The Republic of the Congo.

2. The percentage funded (8%) and total funding amount (\$12,500,462) are indicative based on the methodology described above. This leaves an indicative funding gap of \$152,215,109 representing 92% of the financial requirements.

3. Contributions to the Central African Republic Situation are shown by the earmarking modality as defined in the Grand Bargain.

4. Due to their earmarking at a related region, sub-region, country or theme, the other softly earmarked contributions listed are those which can potentially be used for the Central African Republic Situation. Where a donor has contributed \$2 million or more, the total amount of the contribution is shown.

5. Contributed without restrictions on its use, unearmarked funding allows UNHCR critical flexibility in how best to reach refugees and other populations of concern who are in the greatest need and at the greatest risk. Where a donor has contribution \$10 million or more, the total amount of the contribution is shown.
