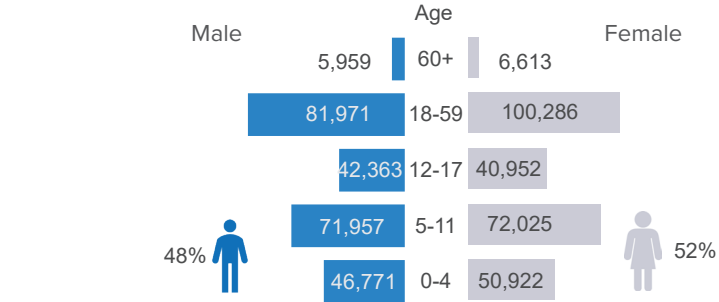

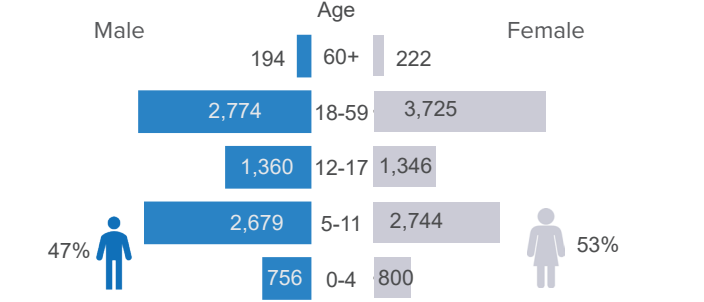

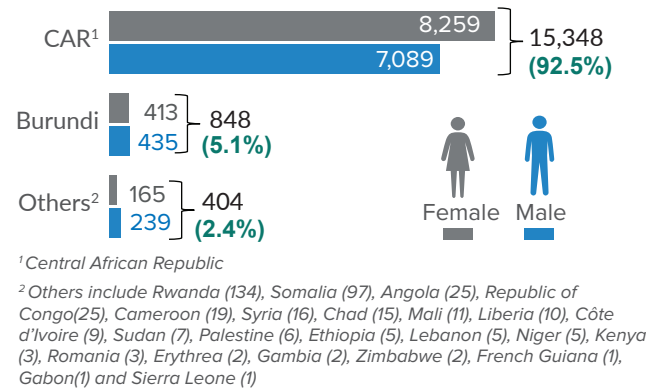
Age and Gender of Refugee Population



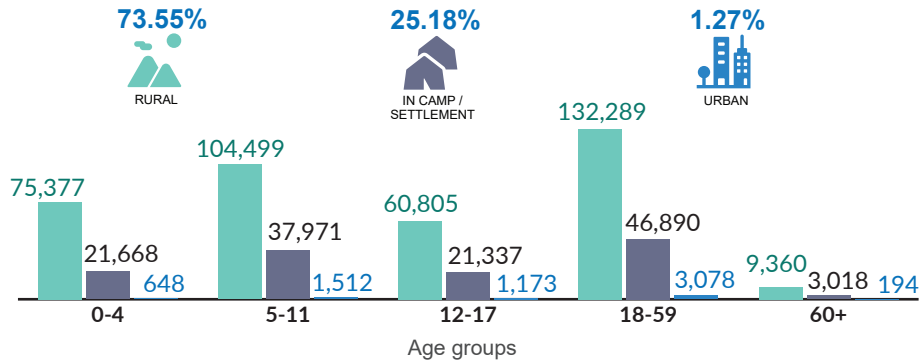
Age and Gender of Asylum Seekers Population



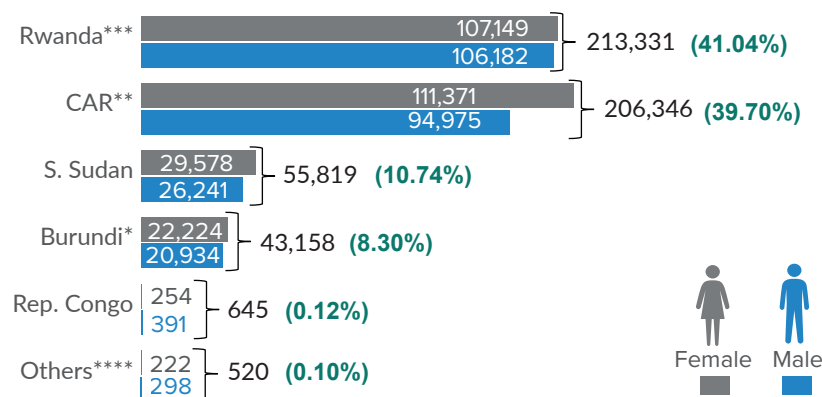
Asylum Seekers Population by Country of Origin



Refugee Population by Type of Location



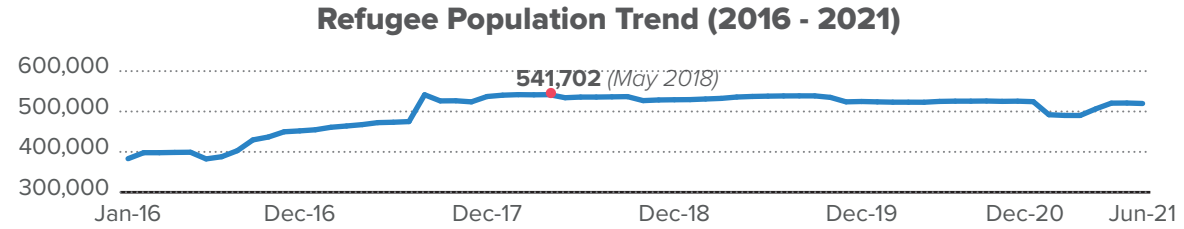
Refugee Population by Country of Origin



Situation Overview

During this period, the refugee population in the DRC has significantly decreased from 520,962 on 05/31/2021 to 519,819 on 06/30/2021, a decrease of 1,143 people representing 0.2%. The increase in the number of refugees during the month is explained by 34 births registered in the South Sudanese refugee population and 536 cases of regularizations/activations in the Burundian (534) and Rwandan (2). The decrease in the number of refugees during the month is explained by 2 deaths recorded in the population of urban refugees in Kinshasa, repatriation of 1,035 Burundian refugees to their country of origin and cases of inactivations of 958 Central African refugees and 30 South Sudanese refugees absent from verification and / or distributions.

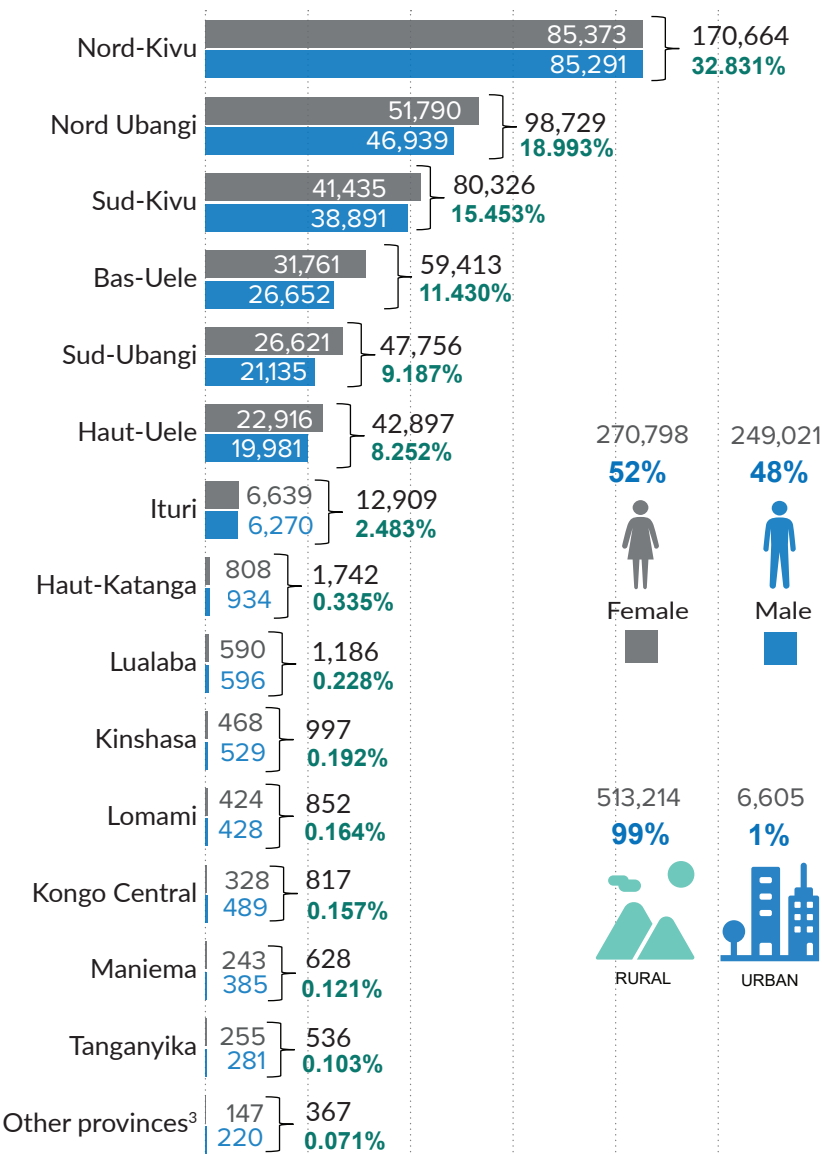
As of June 30, the number of asylum seekers in the DRC fell from 15,207 people to 16,600 including 15,287 people newly registered in the province of North Ubangi, 535 in the province of South Kivu awaiting validation of their refugee status "prima facie" by the eligibility commission and 778 former cases of various nationalities awaiting their Refugee Status Determination (RSD) in urban areas (Goma (208), Bukavu (1), Lubumbashi (281), Kalemie (52) Kinshasa (191)) and others (45).



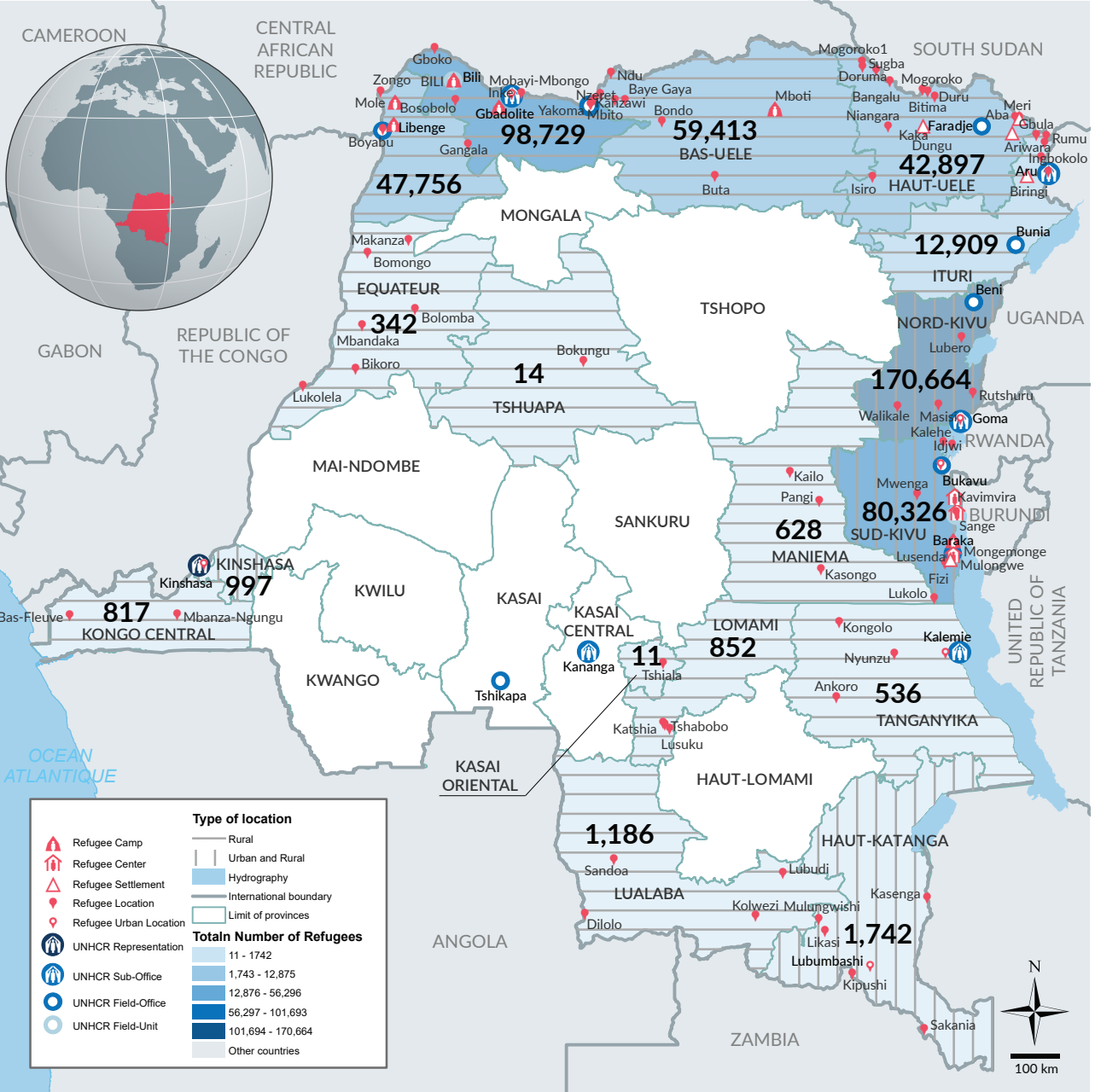

Refugee Population by Province in DRC

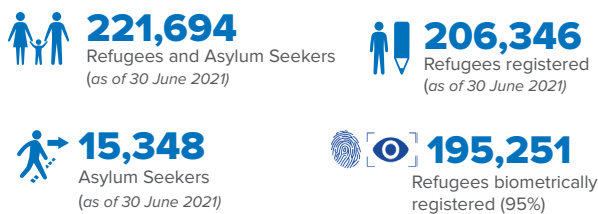


Locations of Refugee Population in DRC

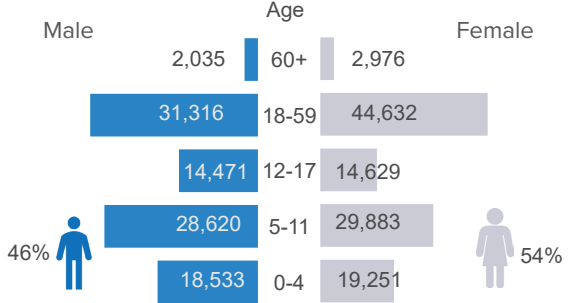

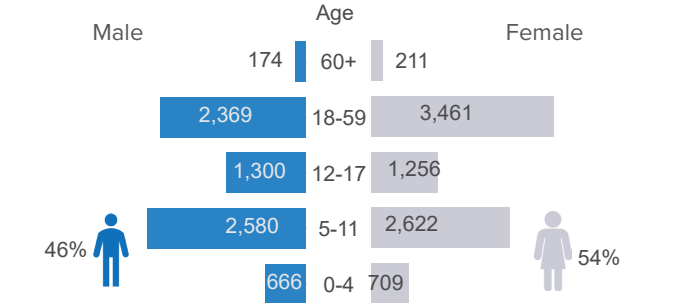

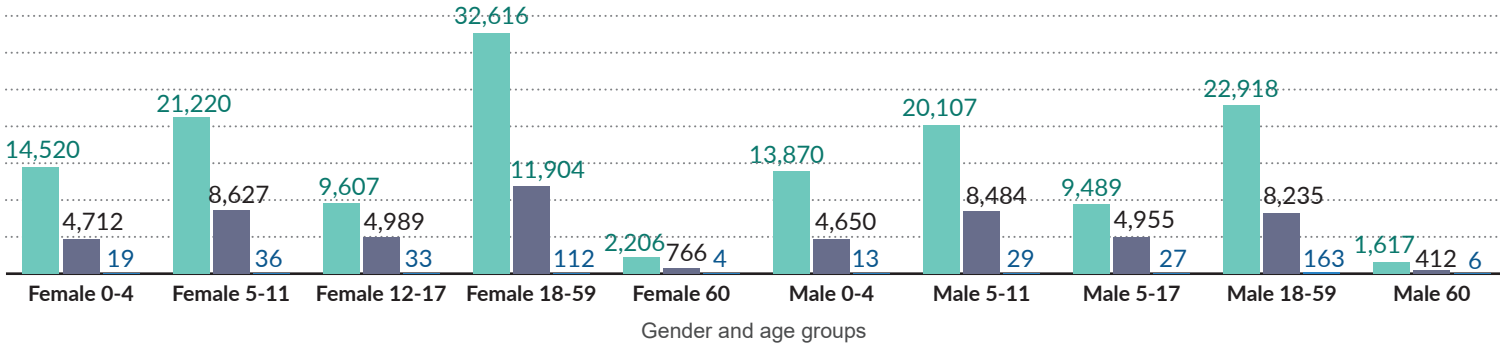
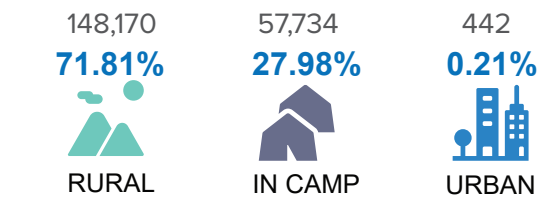
Age and Gender of Refugee Population



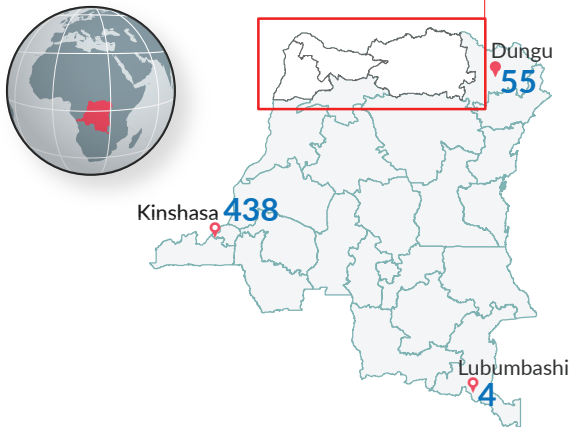
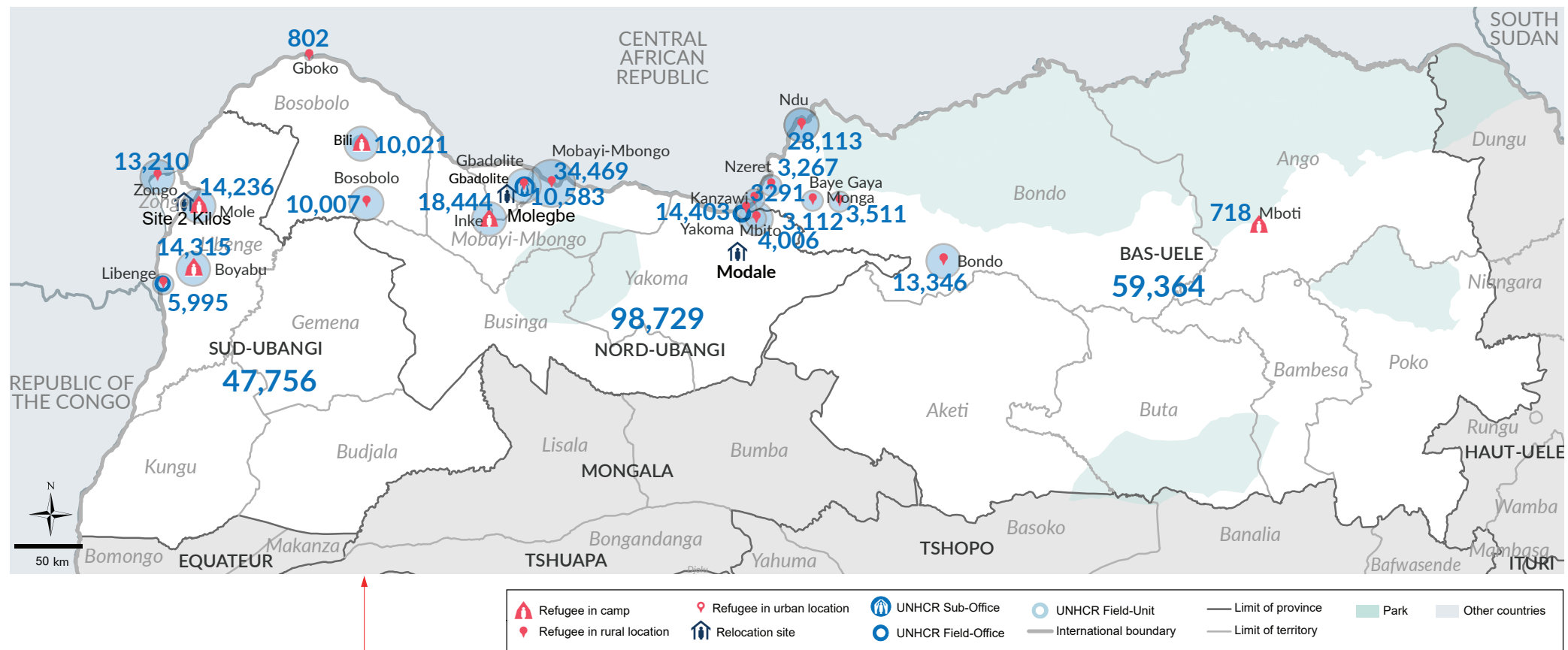
Age and Gender of Asylum Seekers Population



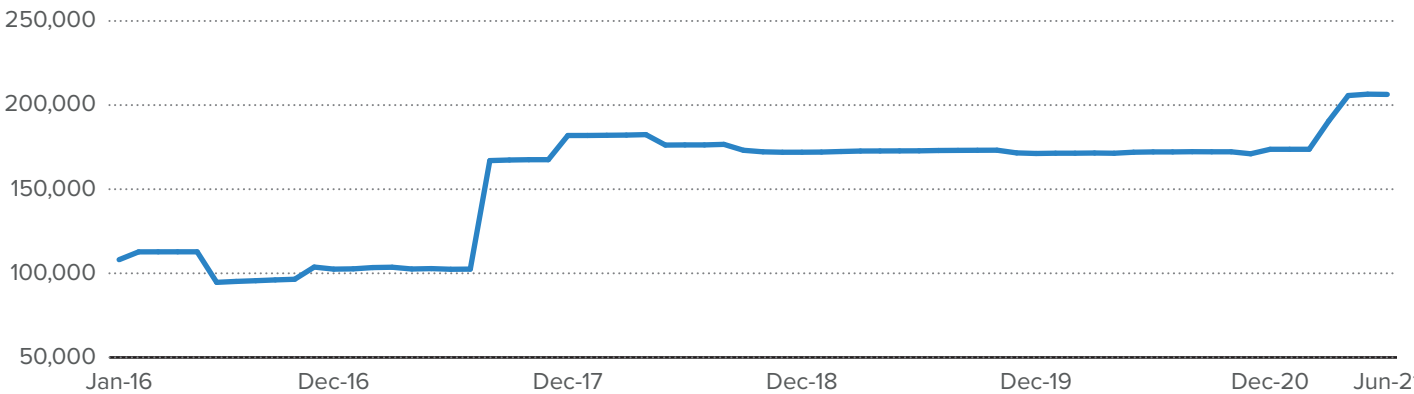
Central African Refugee Population by Type of Location

Central African Refugee Population Trend (2016 - 2021)



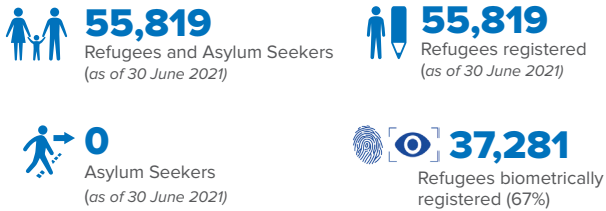
Comments about the figures of Central African refugees

The security situation in the Central African Republic (CAR) deteriorated during the period preceding or following the presidential and legislative elections of December 27, 2020. This situation has resulted in an influx of refugees in neighboring countries and in particular in the DRC in the provinces of North Ubangi, South Ubangi and Bas Uele. As of June 30, 2021, the CNR with the technical support of the UNHCR registered and verified 73,645 people in the provinces of Bas Uélé, Nord Ubangi and Sud Ubangi, including 45,778 new arrivals grouped into 12,435 households and 27,867 people formerly recorded in our database grouped into 7,701 households.

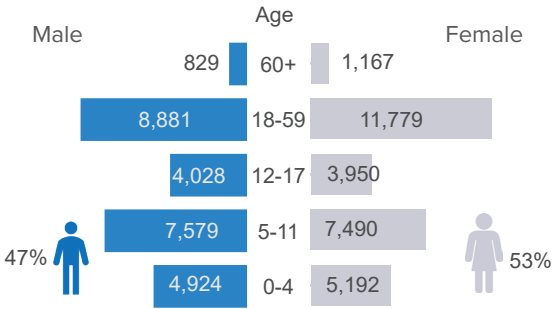
This makes a total of 221,694 Central African refugees and asylum seekers in the DRC as of June 30, 2021: including 206,346 refugees and 15,348 asylum seekers.

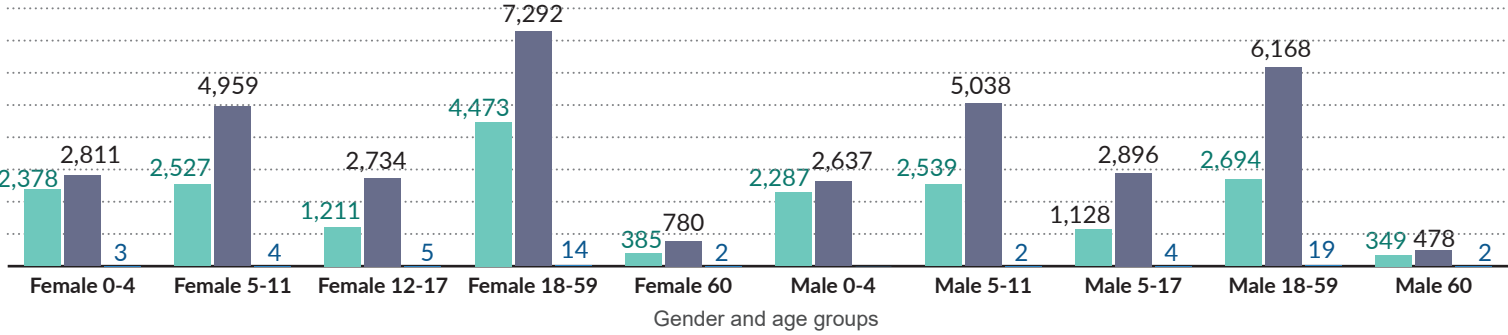
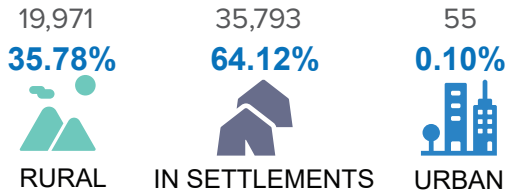

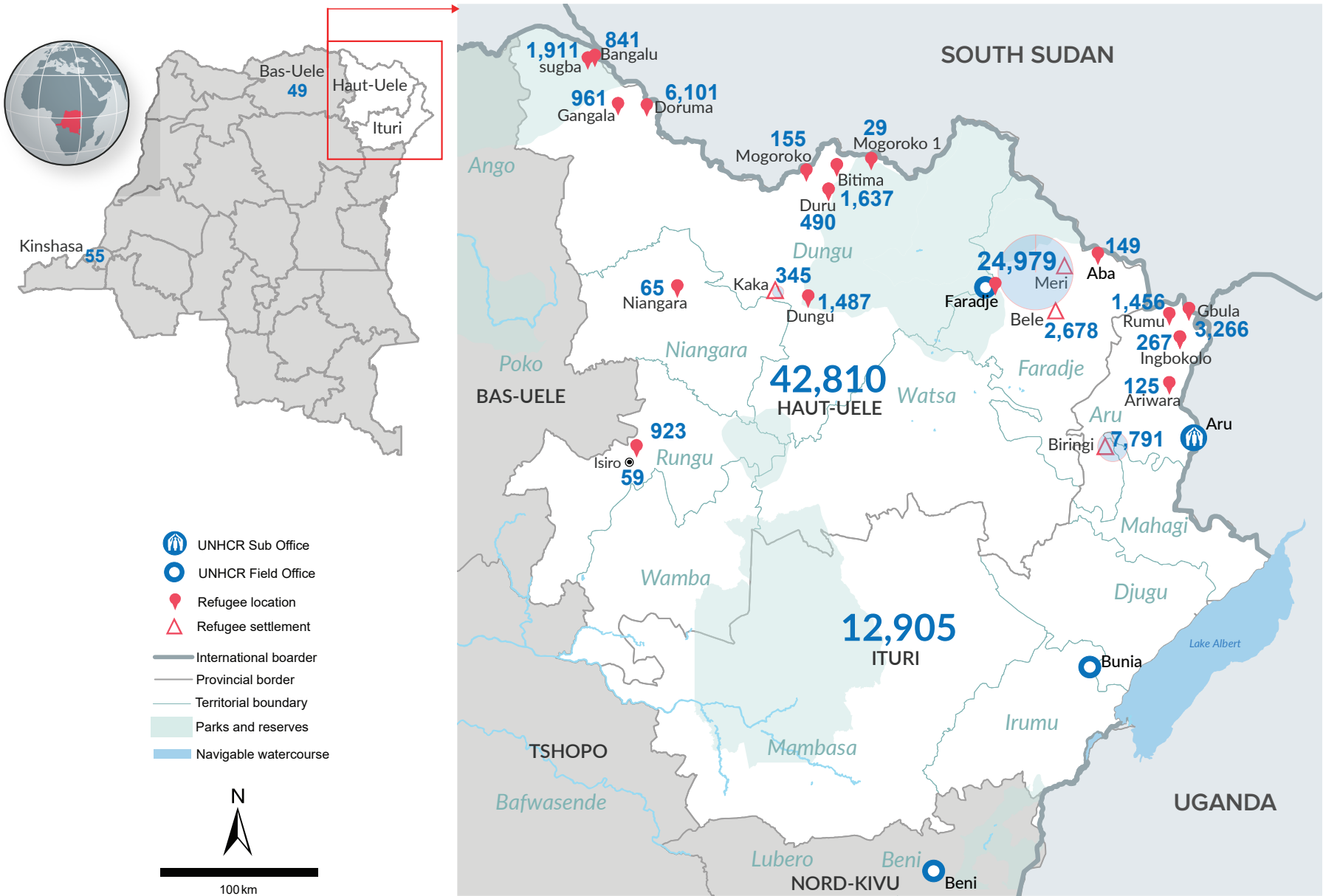
Age and Gender of Refugee Population



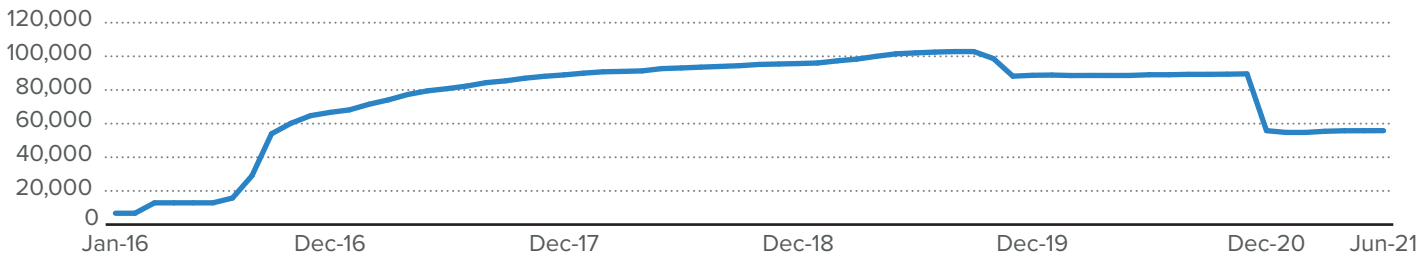
South Sudanese Refugee Population by Type of Location

Comments about the figures of South Sudanese refugees

The situation of the South Sudanese refugee population did not undergo any major change during the month of June 2021. 34 births were registered in the Biringi site and 2 people were relocated from the Meri site to the site of Bele.

The overall figures of our South Sudanese beneficiaries who are in our 3 sites are a total of 35,447 or 63.5% of the overall population of SSD refugees (55,819).

All the refugees living in the 3 sites, i.e. 35,447 have identity documents issued by the CNR with technical support from the UNHCR.
