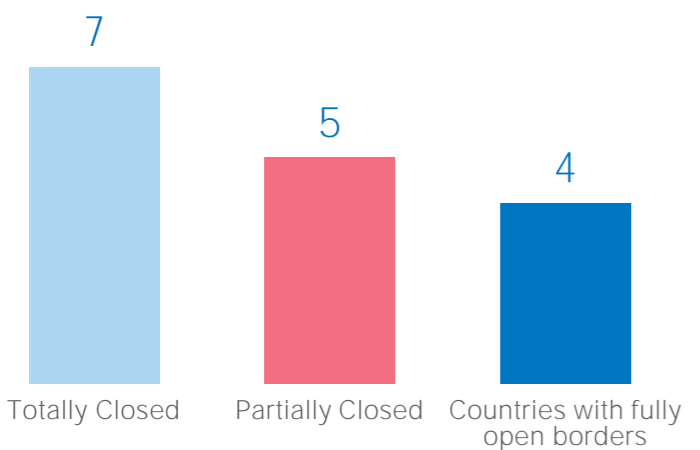

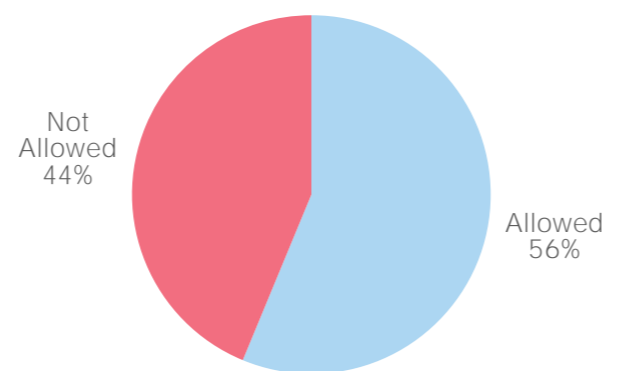

COUNTRY BORDER STATUS

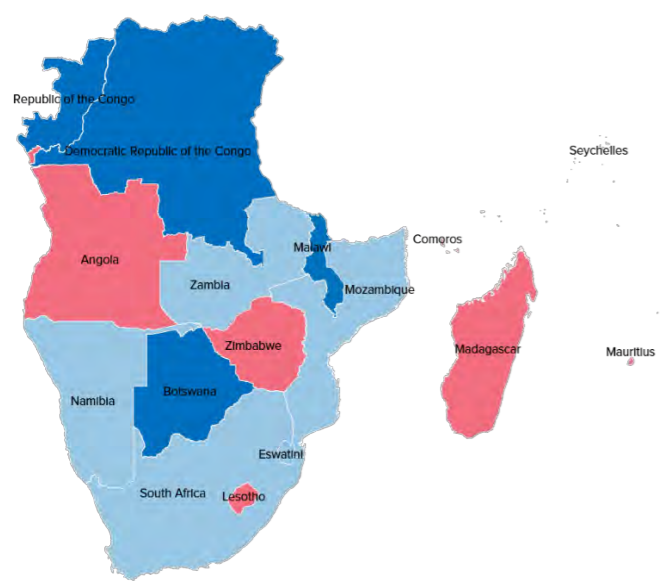


ENTRY FOR ASYLUM SEEKERS

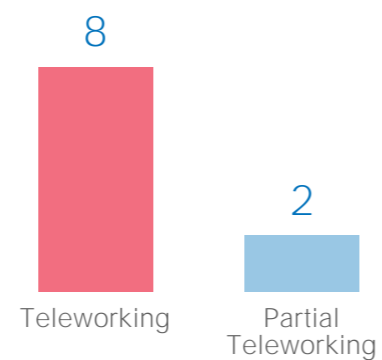


COMMUNICATION & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- In Angola, as the provincial health authorities in Lunda Norte and the provincial laboratory (CDLD) were set to carry out a mass testing for the COVID-19, 6000 refugees were also slated for testing with the support of the UNHCR health partner. 27 persons were trained by CDLD and started an information and sensitization campaign in the settlement, and procedures were aligned. As stigma and denial is still prevalent in the camp sensitization campaigns were intensified to mitigate risk of further stigmatization, especially as health workers started home visits to disclose results. Attitudes vis a vis COVID 19 continue to be a serious concern in Lovua Refugee camp, hence community mobilization will continue, including with children and young people.
- In the Republic of Congo, the broadcast of radio spots on NKENI radio on barrier measures and vaccination against covid-19 was intensified to reach a large audience in Gamboma and the surrounding villages, where persons of concern live in the communities. In addition, the health post in Bouemba organized educational dialogues on COVID-19, prevention and vaccination. A cash-snack (1500 Francs) was given to participants who will then support awareness-raising in the communities. Community-based surveillance activities also continued door-to-door in Bouemba and Gamboma, and 36 community relays were engaged in other locations. Community leaders, and mothers heads of households were targeted by mobile clinic's education activities.


