Update on the winter assistance	<ul> <li>The winter assistance has started and the cases on the basic needs assistance list have been assisted by UNHCR.</li> <li>Additional 40,000 Syrian and non-Syrian cases that are eligible for the winter assistance will be paid in the next few weeks.</li> <li>It has been noticed that there are many cases have been booked on RAIS by some partners without assistance recorded till now. Partners are encouraged to make sure to record the assistance against the booked cases</li> </ul>



Block Coordination module for 2022	within two weeks, otherwise they have to either release them or request an extension.  - So far there is no any update related to OCHA fund for winterization.  - CARE has booked some cases on RAIS including Syrian and non-Syrian.  - Every year there is a new bundle to book cases in RAIS for Basic Needs assistance, COVID response and cash for shelter. The main purpose of this coordination module is to make sure the deduplication of cases receiving the assistance for the different partners.  - The new bundle will be opened for the partners to book the cases in Sunday 7 <sup>th</sup> of Nov.
