


## Eritrean Refugees and Asylum-seekers Per State

UNHCR continues to receive new arrivals in East Sudan, largely from Eritrea. The Commission of Refugees (COR)







## New Arrivals Trends (2018 - 2022)




# Age-gender Breakdown<sup>3</sup>


