SITUATION UPDATE #4: Republic of Moldova Refugee Emergency Telecommunications Sector (RETS)

Update: 13 – 26 April 2022

OVERVIEW

The UNHCR-led Refugee Emergency Telecommunications Sector (RETS) is the coordinating body for IT and communications assessment and service delivery in refugee emergencies. RETS seeks to reinforce multi-sector coordination by streamlining IT and communications into operational preparedness and response strategies for the delivery of assistance to refugees and other persons of concern.

In the Republic of Moldova, with the number of humanitarian partners providing services to persons of concern increasing, RETS is prioritizing the establishment of internet connectivity in reception centres and other key operational sites, and delivering internet connectivity in Blue Dot hubs across the country. Partners and other sectors are fully engaged in the assessment, planning and implementation of the RETS response, and play an active role in identifying sites where connectivity services are a core requirement for operational enhancement.



Achievements and Impact

- UNHCR is collaborating closely with Cisco Crisis Response who is providing remote support and configuring emergency deployment kits out of their office in Poland.
- Ericsson Response has deployed a third volunteer to Chişinău to support the deployment of connectivity in new sites.
- ACTED continues to provide project management support to RETS service deployments.
- The Regional Refugee Response Plan for the Ukraine Situation was released on 26 April.



Achievements and Impact

- The Wi-Fi network is Palanca has been extended to align with the growth of the Humanitarian Hub, covering the new waiting area and camp area.
- New RETS Wi-Fi networks have been established in:
 - Six new Refugee Accommodation Centres
- Nine other operational sites remain connected to RETS Wi-Fi networks:
 - The office of the Guardianship Authorities of the district of Ştefan Vodă, on the Palanca border crossing point
 - One Refugee Accommodation Centre (RAC) in Chişinău municipality
 - Two RAC in the district of Bălţi
 - One RAC in the district of Anenii Noi
 - Blue Dot, Palanca.
 - Palanca Humanitarian Hub, Palanca
 - Blue Dot, Otaci
 - Căușeni Train Station
- ACTED continues to distribute pre-paid SIM cards to refugees arriving in Moldova. Between 13 and 20 April, ACTED distributed 375 SIMs in Palanca, 222 in Otaci, and 451 in Refugee Accommodation Centres.

Identified Needs and Remaining Gaps

- Two Blue Dots have been established in Leuseni and Sculeni. Deployment of internet connectivity is pending the green light from UNICEF.
- Internet connectivity deployments are planned in a further three Refugee Accommodation Centres over the coming week.

SECURITY COMMUNICATIONS

Achievements and Impact

 The telecommunications regulatory authority has approved VHF and UHF frequencies for the UN Joint Radio Network.

Identified Needs and Remaining Gaps

 Delivery of equipment for the installation of the VHF and UHF networks is pending.



Achievements and Impact

 UNICEF launched its third Viber poll to assess evolutions in primary education access for Ukrainian refugee children.




Achievements and Impact

 Cisco Crisis Response has agreed to provide five emergency response kits to cater for increasing needs in Moldova. The kits will also be used for prepositioning in line with preparedness planning.

Identified Needs and Remaining Gaps

 UNICEF is procuring 1000 laptops, which will be placed in technical labs and assigned to specific schools to benefit refugee and Moldovan children by ensuring access to continuous learning.
