Priorities Roma Community Mediator

- 1. Management reorganization: clear repartition of responsibilities and liability among the 3 administrators of the RAC Testemiteanu 6.**
- 2. Child Safe Space available and number of actions of coordination and list of needs with the services providers and donor**
- 3. Medical cases and registration and statistics (including based on the case of the disapperead family with 4 children, as well as observations of number of persons present)**
- 4. Measures with the Ministry of Education, Health and Labor and Social Protection on job seekers (not yet discussed the obtaining of a profession measures)**

Priorities Roma Community Mediator -2

5. Letter of information to managers of RACs and other measures concerning discrimination of Roma in RACs
6. Mapping of the Roma refugees
7. Restart of the system distribution of donations in a more equitable manner

Employment of at least 4 Roma Community Mediators and specialists, Women and Men

1 Roma Community Mediator was employed by the Crisis Centre with the financial support of the UNHCR to consult and assist the activities toward the Roma refugees from Ukraine. He was presented at the Protection Working Group Meeting and pointed out his main activities for the first week as mapping of the interventions concerning locations of Roma refugees and the amelioration of the criteria and conditions of receptions and accommodation of the Roma refugees.

Crisis Centre and at least 2 INGOs as IsraAID, INTERSOS and Medecins du Monde: 3 Roma Community Mediators and 1 PSS specialist

Crisis Centre and at least 2 INGOs as INTERSOS and Medecins du Monde: 2 Roma Community Mediators and 1 PSS specialist.

Outcome 1 Diversity, inclusion and most of all – belonging and ownership

Outcome 2 Human Rights and Roma Rights promoted and mainstreamed

Outcome 3 Facilitated communication, mediation, problem-solving and conflict resolution

Collaboration and enhanced coordination on solving difficult medical and legal cases

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Several cases per week, but with several ramifications and referrals

Outcome 1 Cases are different, but with joint efforts they are solved or referred

Outcome 2 Trust established with isolated communities

Outcome 3 Actions and practices to be changed as a consequence of some cases

Better coordination of the Child protection partners providing services, esp in RACs

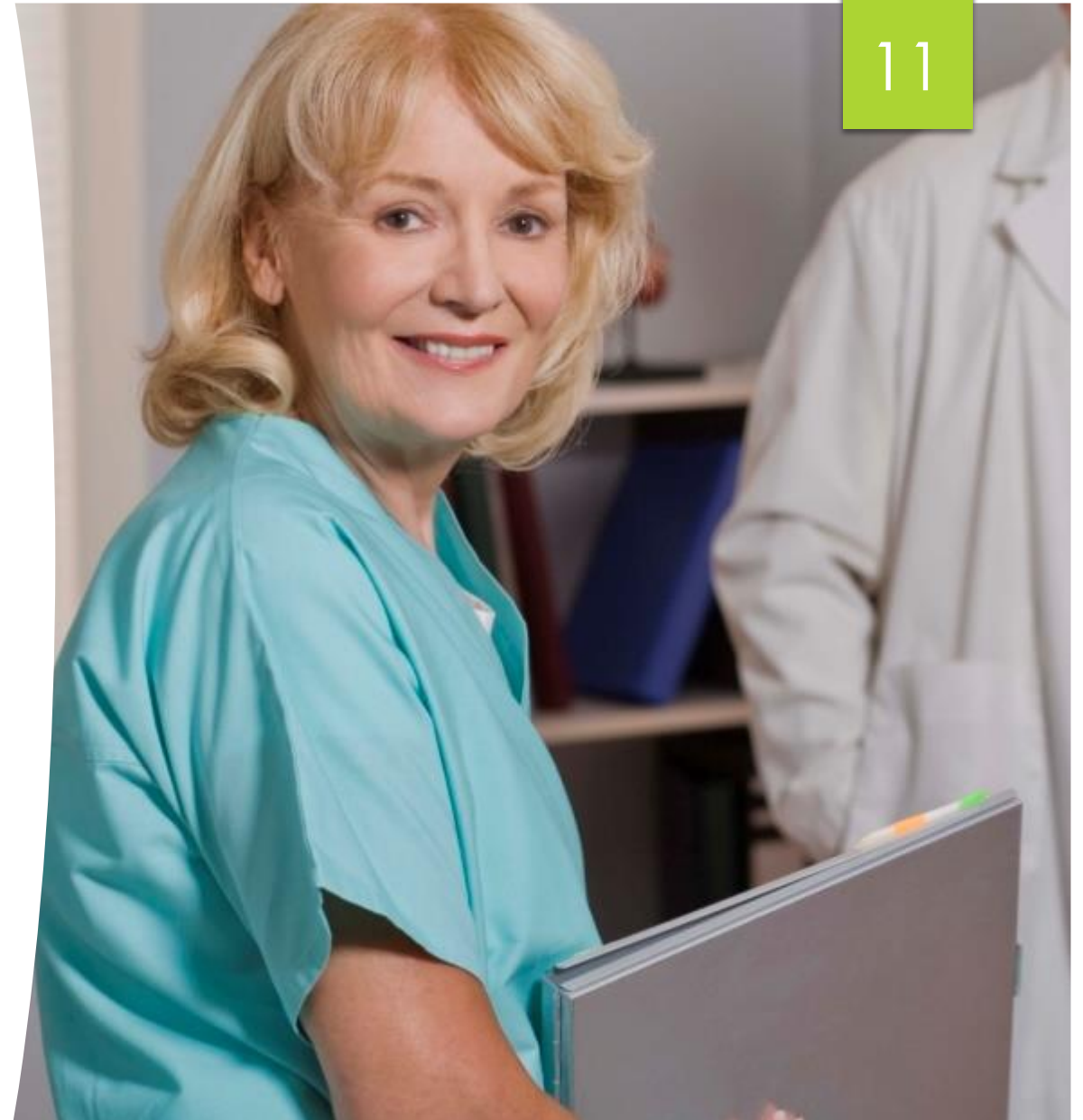
