
CRATT Meeting #2
June 14th, 2022 (via Microsoft Teams)

Participants: UNCHR; IOM, ProTECT Platform Save the Children; Danish refugee council; Rise collective; Next steps; INCA; IJM; Salvation Army Romania; Eliberare; CSD, UNICEF.

Introductions:

Co-leads and participants introduce themselves and the agenda is presented to the participants.

Main topics discussed:

- **CRATTF members approved the minutes from the last meeting.**
- **CRATTF members approved the ToR** with no additional suggestions for amendments.

- **Overview of the Rapid Mapping Results**

The IOM co-lead did a brief presentation on the results of the Rapid Mapping, the activities organised by the TF members on Prevention, Protection and Prosecution within the Ukraine Crisis Response. Among the key needs identified there were the monitoring and evaluation instruments, coordination among all stakeholders, the Transnational Referral Mechanism, capacity building sessions, etc. The ProTECT co-chair mentioned the CSOs are preparing a more in-depth mapping of the activities and also the locations where activities are being carried out at this moment. The IJM representative also raised the question of sharing tools related to the risk assessment TF members are using, and the Danish Refugee Council representative supported the idea of sharing the tools and also mentioned the need to avoid overlapping activities. - **Updates on NIRM**

The ProTECT Platform co-chair presented briefly the stage of the new NIRM. The updated version was finalised at the end of March 2022, after two months of consultations facilitated by the National Agency Against Human Trafficking, under the supervision of the State Councillor Mădălina Turza, consultations which included around 20 representatives from various ministries, agencies and CSOs sector. Since April the document has been revised and approved by every ministry with responsibilities, and after that will be adopted by the Government of Romania. At this moment there is no clear timeline for that. However, there is a NIRM still applicable and if anyone identifies potential cases, there is a framework for referral in order for the potential victims to have access to specialised services.

- **Presentation on the 5Ws**

The UNHCR represented the methodology and need for the 5Ws.
