IKEA	 The Ministry of Public Works is to provide a list of an initial 202 accommodation sites and social housing (followed later with a list of 80 sites) for where IKEA support to provide furniture and electrical appliances. There is space, however, for additional requests and where there are immediate needs. UNICEF noted the need to coordinate the requests with Min of Public Works to ensure sites accommodating unaccompanied minors are accounted for. The National Youth Foundation will be opening youth centers as well where this support could be welcomed. 	agencies to record stocks.
Romexpo and harmonization	 A meeting was convened with the municipality to help coordinate support to Romexpo where the "store" has become depleted of food and non-food items. Meeting attend by UN agencies and Red Cross. Items had been offered freely to refugees who could come to collect items every 10 days. On average, 800 persons per day had been coming to Romexpo to receive items. However, donor fatigue has set in and supplies have started to dwindle. Organizations are requested to assist in meeting unmet needs expected to arise. A six month action plan was agreed to. Romexpo will be handed back on 17 May. Two more centers will open, one for GII registration for TPD and cash enrolement; and another for the store where refugees can still receive items. It is agreed that these new buildings will be rented for a period of six months. In case of influx and need of establishing again a communal shelter, a new dialogue with ROMEXPO will take place to identify a third building. For the time being, it appears that refugees receiving cash vouchers are still coming to ROMEXPO to collect specific expensive products i.e. powdered milk and nappies for babies. Refugees are travelling from Constanța – using a free train – to collect food at ROMEXPO A request to cross-check the data base of beneficiaries coming to ROMEXPO and other CBI providers has been raised. The Municipality of Bucharest needs to assess first the legality of it in terms of protection and exchange of data In regard to the regular demand for food and in kind, UNICEF will check the support they can provide baby products. Red Cross Romania remains the key actor which can provide some foods (but not all requested) 	entering requests.

	 UNHCR can be the provider of last resort to complete the procurement of some items, notably NFIs for the period of six months, including (to be confirmed) some dry/canned foods. There is a common understanding with the regular arrival of refugees (who are not yet registered) the provision of in kind and off food can tremendously help them. However, the provision in kind and of food may decrease in the future when the CBI and social umbrella assistance from the government will be largely implemented. To optimise the distribution of food, a Minimum Expenditure Basket (MEB) needs to be developed. The social service at ROMEXPO may need further assistance to control the registration of beneficiaries and to have a better understanding about the goods collected by households.
