


Map of verified IDP sites in Hobyo - August 2022

Assessment overview

IDP site verification exercise was conducted in Hobyo in August 2022 led by the DEH, TUO and PDA. 2 IDP sites were identified hosting 574 households or 3,444 individuals. Compared to the previous site verification held in September 2021, there has been a decrease of 2 IDP sites, 283 households or 1,686 individuals.

People living with disability

Using the washington group disability questions, statistics of people living with disabilities were

19 (37% Female) have difficulty with seeing (even wearing glasses)

15 (47% Female) have difficulty with hearing (even using a hearing aid)

27 (48% Female) have difficulty with communicating and/or understanding

18 (44% Female) have difficulty with walking and/or climbing stairs

29 (48% Female) have difficulty with dressing and/or washing

14 (50% Female) have difficulty with remembering/concentrating

Eviction Risk Mapping

122 (3.5%)

people living with disability

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of eviction. Several factors were put into consideration such as IDP site tenure, type of agreements in place and whether an eviction notice has been issued recently.

None of IDP sites have been classified as having high risk of eviction

100% of sites have landowner authorized occupancy

100% of sites have agreement in place

50% of those that have agreements have written agreements

50% of those that have agreements have no agreed end dates

None of sites have been issued with eviction notice within the last 3 months

Flood Risk Mapping

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of flooding.

None of the sites has been classified as extreme (always floods) and high (floods frequently)
