




## **Situation Overview**


The refugee population in the DRC has slightly increased from 515,066 to 518,899. This is mainly the result of the data cleaning and update of Central African refugees addresses as well as the continuous registration. The number of asylum seekers has decreased from 2,576 to 2,183 due the recognition of some by the eligibility commission during the month. 2,590 ex congolese refugees were repatriated from countries of asylum.







Locations of Refugee Population in DRC











**211,953** Central African refugees and asylum seekers in DRC , i.e. 211,918 refugees and 35 asylum seekers with identity documents issued by the government with the support of UNHCR. There was an increase of **2.4**% due to updates,continuous registration(new births (272 cases)) and updates of addresses( 4,714) in proGres V4 database. These people live in the provinces of North Ubangi (114,823 persons), South Ubangi (42,780 persons), Bas Uélé (54,036 persons), Kinshasa (305 persons) and Haut Katanga (6persons), Haut Uélé (2 persons) and North Kivu (1 person).











## Location of South Sudanese Refugees in DRC





**55,652** South Sudanese refugees and asylum seekers in DRC, a decrease of **2.7**%. Mainly due to adjudication cases and absentees. Only **37,139** or 67% live in camps (Biringi, Meri and Bele) and hold identity documents issued by the government with the technical support of UNHCR.






**42,232** Burundian refugees and asylum seekers:40,808 refugees and 1,424 asylum seekers. This representes an increase of **0.02**% compare to July population data.7 cases of activations and 3 births recorded. They all hold identity documents issued by the government with the technical support of UNHCR.

#### Number of refugees repatriated to RDC

In August,2,590 Congolese were repatriated from Angola (447 persons), Zambia (2,135 persons), South Africa (54 persons), Mozambique (9 persons) and Senegal (5 persons). In total 3,863 ex refugees congolese return to DRC since the beginning of the year.
