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


### Weekly distribution of COVID-19 cases, deaths




## Weekly distribution of tests performed and confirmed COVID-19 cases



- Key information which are essential for coordinating EMT was collected by 527 daily reports, which includes data of 5280 consultations (from 11th March – to 29 August 2022)

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



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
