



### **Situation Overview**

The refugee population in the DRC has slightly increased from 518,899 to **521,512**, an increased of 0.50%, mainly due to updated data, especially for South Sudanese refugees. The number of asylum seekers decreased from 2,183 to **1,291** or 41% owing to the refugee status recognition of Burundians by the eligibility commission. Some **520** people were assisted to repatriate to Rwanda; **2,484**Congolese (ex-refugees) also returned to the DRC.












**212,120** Central African refugees and asylum seekers in the DRC as of September 30, 2022, or 212,079 refugees and 41 asylum seekers with identity documents issued by the government with the support of UNHCR. There was an increase of **0.07**% compared to August data due to new births 42 cases and 36 newly registered persons as well as 89 regularized,3 persons were closed (cases of death and double registration).






### **South Sudanese Refugee Population by Type of Location**






### **Location of South Sudanese Refugees in DRC**

### **Comments about the figures of South Sudanese refugees**

The South Sudanese refugees and asylum seekers population increased by **2.4**% between August (55,652) and September (**56,972**), mainly due to the ongoing data cleaning. Only **37,880**, or 67%, live in camps (Biringi, Meri, and Bele) and hold identity documents issued by the government with technical support from UNHCR.









### **Burundian Refugee Population by Type of Location**


### **Comments about the figures of Burundian refugees**

There were 42,387 Burundian refugees and asylum seekers, including 41,836 refugees and 551 asylum seekers, an increase of 0.36%. This increase was due to 145 regularizations and 8 births. They all have identity documents issued by the government with technical support from UNHCR.

In September, 2,475 Congolese were repatriated from Zambia, Gabon 2 persons, South Africa 6 persons, Tchad 1 person. In total 6,789 ex refugees congolese return to DRC since the beginning of the year.


