Agenda Point 1 Opening of meeting Svetlana Turcanu, Deputy Secretary General, State Chancellery, Svetlana.turcanu@gov.md	 The State Chancellery welcomed the development of the Refugee Response Plan for 2023, which needs to be coordinated with the Government measures, as well as the Anticrisis Agenda of the Government. It was mentioned that the area covered by the Livelihoods and Inclusion Working Group is vast and sometimes is interconnected with other working groups – it is thus important to work together to ensure coordination and avoid overlapping. The State Chancellery suggested inviting representatives of different ministries at the Working Group meeting, depending on the topic of the meeting agenda. Agenda Point 2 Defining the broader socio-economic inclusion framework. Guidance and studies on socio-economic inclusion by thematic area Oxana Maciuca, Regional Human Mobility Advser, UNDP, oxana.maciuca@undp.org	 The <u>first product of the Regional Socio-Economic Inclusion Working Group,</u> co-chaired by UNHCR and UNDP, was presented. The product, <u>Guidance and studies on socio-economic inclusion by thematic area</u>, aims to foster a common understanding of key aspects of socio-economic inclusion and equip stakeholders with helpful guidance and emerging good practices. The product presents studies and publication applicable to the Ukraine refugee response, covering the following areas: education and training, employment and skills, access to health services, access to housing, entrepreneurship and financial inclusion, social protection, non-discrimination and social cohesion, and measuring and informing socio-economic inclusion. The representative of the regional working group also explained the concept of socio-economic inclusion, and presented the definition developed and agreed at the regional level (see <u>presentation</u>). The State Chancellery emphasized the importance of learning from the experience of other countries covered by the RRP, and the existing good practices for the socio-economic inclusion of refugees implemented there. The State Chancellery requested statistics about the number of refugees included in different social systems (e.g. education, health, employment) in Moldova and the other countries covered by the RRP. Coordinate with the Regional Inclusion Working Group to provide the State Chancellery with statistics about the number of refugees included in different social systems in Moldova and the other countries covered by the RRP, as per the available data.

The first step is the selection of sector key indicators, which define the population in need. The livelihood indicators, for which data was gathered through the multi-sector needs assessment (MSNA), were also presented. The Working Group leads presented the broad steps that the working group should take for the preparation of the sector refugee response for 2023. 	N/A
