Partner updates	<p>Romanian National Council for Refugees (CNRR):</p> <p>“Gavroche” representatives abusively evacuated three children hosted in their centre.</p> <p>The General Inspectorate for Immigration (GII) has been prompt in responding and contacted DGASPC to fully understand the situation.</p> <p>The National Authority for Child Protection and Adoption (ANPDCA) did a control at the accommodation facility and within the DGASPC on the 17th of August.</p>	<p>CNRR continue to ensure the monitoring of the situation.</p> <p>A formal discussion with ANPDCA and other relevant authorities will be done.</p>

	<p>The DGASPC representative, started acting nicely with the children. It is important to underline that usually, children report that DGASPC representatives are not sufficiently involved in the needs of the children and often don't undertake their respective tasks ensuring protection and assistance to the children.</p> <p>ANDPCA: From February 24th to August 22nd, 2022, GDSACP registered 4,218 unaccompanied children from Ukraine, as follows: - 574 children were identified between February 24th and March 18th, 2022, before the approval of the joint order 20362/2022, respectively establishment of the system of filling in a standard form at the border for unaccompanied children travelling with a relative or an adult person - 3,644 children were identified after the approval of the joint order 20362/2022, out of which: •963 remained in Romania together with a relative or other adult. •2,642 were in transit together with a relative or other adult. •39 travelled alone.</p> <p>Save the Children International (SCI): Save the Children has provided assistance to more than 6.500 Ukrainian children and around 5.700 Ukrainian adults in the form of food, NFIs, counselling and CVA in Bucharest, Suceava, Iasi, Galati, Tulcea, Maramures, Timis counties. Child protection activities were run through Counselling hubs set up in Bucharest, Iasi, Galati and Suceava, a mobile team for Tulcea, Mother and baby spaces set up in border and transit locations (Bucharest, Tulcea and Maramures counties) and also within the Regional Procedure and Accommodation Centres for Asylum Seekers in Bucharest, Galați, Suceava, Maramureș, and Timișoara.</p> <p>UNICEF:</p> <p>An update on the law regarding women's conccription in Ukraine</p>	
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	<p>1. Enrollment of women should begin on October 1, 2022. This means that a woman becomes conscripted and is in the reserve of the Armed Forces, National guards or other military formations. But these are only women of those professions, which are defined in the order of the Ministry of Defense of Ukraine dated October 11, 2021 No. 313.</p> <p>2. Women with minor children under the age of 18 are not subject to conscription for military service through mobilization.</p> <p>3. Registration is not mobilization. All women who serve do so voluntarily and/or under contract.</p> <p>4. In wartime, women may be accepted for military service and service in the military reserve only under a contract and voluntarily.</p> <p>According to the law, conscripted women are obliged to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - to be on military registration at the place of residence, and abroad to be at the place of consular registration at the diplomatic offices of Ukraine; - appear on call to the procurement and social support center within the time limits indicated in the received documents; - not to change the place of residence without the permission of the military commissar, the heads of the Security Service or the Foreign Intelligence Service after the announcement of mobilization in wartime; - undergo a medical examination and treatment; - undergo training for military service, perform military duty while in reserve; - in a week, come to the Territorial center for removal from military registration, if it is necessary to change the place of residence, go on a business trip, study, vacation and treatment (for more than three months abroad); - in the event of a change in marital status, deterioration of health, address of residence (location), education, place of work or position - it is necessary to notify the authorities in which they are registered within 7 days; 	
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	<p>- in case of loss of a military registration document - immediately notify the recruiting centers or SBU authorities</p> <p>UNHCR:</p> <p>1,407,860 refugees from Ukraine have arrived in Romania between 24 February and 21 July 2022: 890,168 of them arrived directly from Ukraine while 517,692 arrived through Moldova. As of 21 July 2022, 48,182 refugees have applied for temporary protection.</p>
