Updated figures and announcements (UNHCR)	<p><u>REACH - Multi-sector needs assessment:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It covers both Romania and Moldova • The goal is to support an evidence-based material response in Romania through provision of the multi-sector data on the needs and coping capacity of the Ukrainian refugee households in the country, and to have a common demographic profile of the refugee households living in Romania. • The MSNA will be implemented under coordination and in close collaboration with the Information Management Working Group. • Reach will lead the technical part, development of the methodology, data collection and draft of the main outputs. • The team needs support from the sectors to gather relevant and priority information <p><u>Protection profiling:</u></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Get feedback from the sectors on key dates and the survey questions by the 22nd of September. • Data collection will start in the first week of October. • Inter-sector feedback to go to Stefan, who will coordinate and compile it before sending it to REACH.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Three types of products are available on the protection profiling. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Fact sheet with numbers only. 2. Medium fact sheet of four pages, harmonized with all regional fact sheets. 3. Longer analysis of 1.000 respondents, soon to be 3.000. • Currently, the analysis has three chapters - overview, displacement patterns in the host community and intentions of the refugees. • <u>Preliminary results:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 99% Ukrainian respondents - highly educated population - 80% of the people arriving have been separated from their family - 84% of the respondents travel accompanied by close family, around 5% traveled with unrelated children. - the large majority come from Odessa and Kiev - 52% intend to stay in the country - 14% intend to move to Germany, Canada, Poland, Bulgaria and Italy.
