| Updated figures and announcements (UNHCR) | <p><u>2023 RRP:</u> Operational Plan:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sector Leads to have consultations within their WG on the strategy for 2023 • Is the 2022 strategy still valid; what are new emerging needs? • What worked well; where do we need to improve? • How do we incorporate the new emerging needs in strategies and activities? • How contribute to / maintain social cohesion • Each sector to have a consultation with the core government counterpart to update the strategic direction, needs and support to government plan. • Inter-Agency shared the narrative format for 2023 RRP last Friday • Approximately 1 page/sector (200 words: strategy; 50 words linkages to GCR; 50 words links to SDGs and NAP) • Country overview (500 words) • Country Protection and Solutions Strategy (750 words) • An intersectoral working session with the authorities will be held on the week of 7 November.
