Updated figures and announcements (UNHCR)	 Figures: Over 100,000 refugees currently in the country, 15% increase in the last month. Government and UN are monitoring the situation. 97,000 people have received TP including 872 unaccompanied children. The local Child Protection authorities with UNICEF support are registering all refugee children using the Primero platform. All partners are requested to make sure that all refugee children are registered and referred to the local child protection authorities. 2023 RRP latest Dates: Everything has been integrated into RRP and it is being reviewed by authorities. The narrative will be finalized by closure of today. It will be shared with Regional RCF (Heads of UN agencies) on Monday 19 December 2022. The launch off RRP will take place on 23 January 2023. We are trying to provide a slot for Romania to speak as the first country who has national plan. Bilateral meeting took place with DSU and PMO. IA will share the presentation today. Assessments: IMWG worked with Protection WG for 50/20 and Basic Needs WG for winterization assessments.

	 CP WG: National authorities are fully engaged and have been participating in the CP WG meetings. There will be a meeting between UNICEF, Save the Children and UNHCR to discuss CP service mapping and referral pathways in January 2023. IA will organize a meeting early January to discuss mapping initiatives and way forward. IA will seek guidance about available information from the regional bureau. 	
	 Livelihood: Anticipated Language courses procurement by end of this year is not possible. Sector Leads are requested to share information regarding a focal point for day care with Christian. IM in Inter-Agency will find the information in ActivityInfo and other data received from partners. Child Protection SWG will share the information with Christian. 	
Sectoral updates (targeted, action- oriented, activities / gaps)	 New Sub working Group and co-leads: Terre des Hommes will be the new co-lead of the PSEA Network. GBV sub working group will have its first meeting next Tuesday 20 December 2022. ANAIS and UNHCR will be co-lead of this SWG. Sector Leads are requested to inform any interested organization to attend the first GBV SWG meeting. 	
	 Stefan presented the result of the survey. There is need for vetting of landlords; PSEA, GBV and CP WGs are working on this issue to prevent children and women from the risk of trafficking and GBV in their accommodations. The issue has been raised with the Government. 36 per cent of refugees did not receive food. Winterization Assessment: Kylie and Stefan presented the result of the survey. Provision of CASH assistance for winter will start from Monday 19 December 2022. UNHCR and UNICEF will find out how to support each other for winterization. Winter clothing are in stock. Distribution process will be discussed within BNWG. IMWG will share a report based on the assessment. 	
	• Survey is available on the SharePoint. IOM, UNICEF and UNHCR are reviewing the programme before providing technical advice to the Government. UNICEF is currently analysing the result which will be shared with the Government.
