







SECTOR ACHIEVEMENTS

As of the last quarter of 2022, more than 2 million beneficiaries cumulatively received various basic needs support provided by the Basic Needs sector partners in Türkiye. Approximately 2.1 million beneficiaries were supported through monthly cash assistance provision in the context of the nationwide Emergency Social Safety Net (ESSN) and the Complementary-ESSN (C-ESSN) programmes. On the other hand, the number of one-time cash assistance beneficiaries increased by almost 22% since the third quarter and reached 110,283. However, the achievement level of the relevant yearly target stayed significantly low throughout 2022. The total number of one-time cash assistance beneficiaries supported in 2022 also substantially decreased from the previous year and was only around 22% of its 2021 level (491,972).

Despite the accelerating momentum in relation to the number of beneficiaries accessing adequate shelter solutions in the third quarter, this progress ground to a halt in the end of the year with a 90% progress rate against the related target for 2022 (same as in the third quarter) with 33,053 beneficiaries supported in total by the end of the year. Nevertheless, the number of beneficiaries reached in this respect almost quadrupled in 2022 compared to the achievement reported in 2021 (9,022), pointing out to the increasing attention given to access to shelter in the context of the deteriorating housing market conditions and increasing cost of living.

The number of food assistance beneficiaries showed slow progress since the third quarter as well (75,821 were reached in total by a small increase of 1.4%), marking 49% achievement of the 2022 target. In 2022, the number of beneficiaries supported in this respect also decreased by nearly 20% in comparison to that of 2021 (94,877), partly since the number of TAC residents decreased by 8%.

Finally, the number of beneficiaries receiving gender appropriate hygiene, dignity and sanitary items increased by 13% compared to the third quarter and marked a 52% progress against its yearly target by reaching 205,073, which is only around 53% of the number of beneficiaries reached through this support in 2021. Similarly, the number of beneficiaries receiving Non-Food Items (NFIs) in 2022 (216,579), which include those receiving core relief items (CRIs) along with hygiene kit beneficiaries, was only around 50% of the number reported in 2021 (429,307).
