









Situation Overview


The refugee population in DRC increased from 520,547 to 521,011, an increase of 0.09% due to the synchronization of data from South Sudanese (365) verified in November and December 2022 as well as continued registration of Central Africans (65), Burundians (32), and (2) of other nationalities. Asylum seekers increased from 2,152 to 2,163, an increase of 0.5 percent, mainly from South Sudan and Burundi. 451 Congolese (ex refugees) were repatriated to the DRC from Zambia (440), South Africa (7), Nigeria (2), and Mali (2) during the month.














Central African Refugee Population by Type of Location

















Age and Gender of Refugee Population




Age and Gender of Asylum Seekers





South Sudanese Refugee Population Trend (2016 - 2022)



There were **56,412** South Sudanese refugees and asylum seekers in DRC in January. The DRC government, with technical support from UNHCR, conducted a registration and verification activity from October to December 2022 of refugees living in the camps (Biringi, Meri, and Bele). The synchronization of the recorded data is underway and will result in an effective increase in the consolidated figures.











Age and Gender of Refugee Population





Comments about the figures of Burundian refugees

45,154 Burundian refugees and asylum seekers, including 43,655 refugees and 1,499 asylum seekers, an increase of 0.07% due to the reactivation of 32 people. They all hold identity documents issued by the government with technical support from UNHCR.





Documentation (issued by the Government): 60 244 refugees and asylum seekers living in urban areas, and in the sites/camps have Refugee Cards, i.e., 30% of the eligible population (181 599 people). In addition, 321 231 persons were issues with refugee and asylumseeker certificates.
