Uganda Refugee Response Plan (RRP) 2022-2023

January - December 2022

#### Overview

The under 5 mortality rate was low at 0.12 compared to the standard of less than 1.5 deaths per 1,000 population. This was achieved because of the developed capacity of health workers, and early diagnosis and treatment by the community health workers.

Malaria continues to top the causes of morbidity with a proportion of 43 per cent of morbidity cases. This contributes to the high number of consultations at the clinics making the consultation per clinician per day high at 56.

An outbreak of Measles was registered in Palabek where a total of 114 cases were registered and successfully treated with no death. 03 cases of suspected bacterial meningitis were also registered in Palorinya settlement in December 2022. All cases were successfully treated and discharged.

There was an outbreak of Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) in Uganda in the last quarter of 2022. No case was registered among the refugees in Uganda during this outbreak. A community health information system has been deployed in the settlements of Kyaka II and Kiryandongo to help improve on community health disease surveillance as a pilot tool and will be rolled out to other settlements after successful piloting.


#### Challenges and key priorities


Shortages of medicines were experienced in the last quarter of 2022 due to a breakdown in the national medical supply system and there is need for UNHCR to always have a buffer stock to fill the gaps.

Strengthening of health and nutrition screening of refugees and asylum seekers at points of entry to avoid importing diseases of outbreak potential into the country.










Anaemia rate among children U5

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


