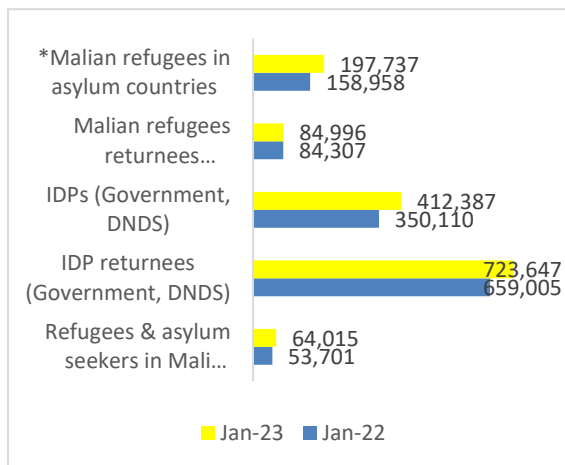




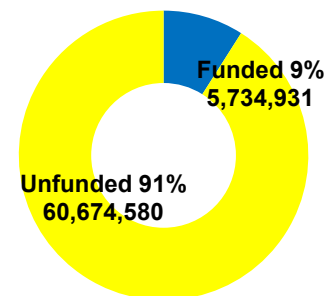

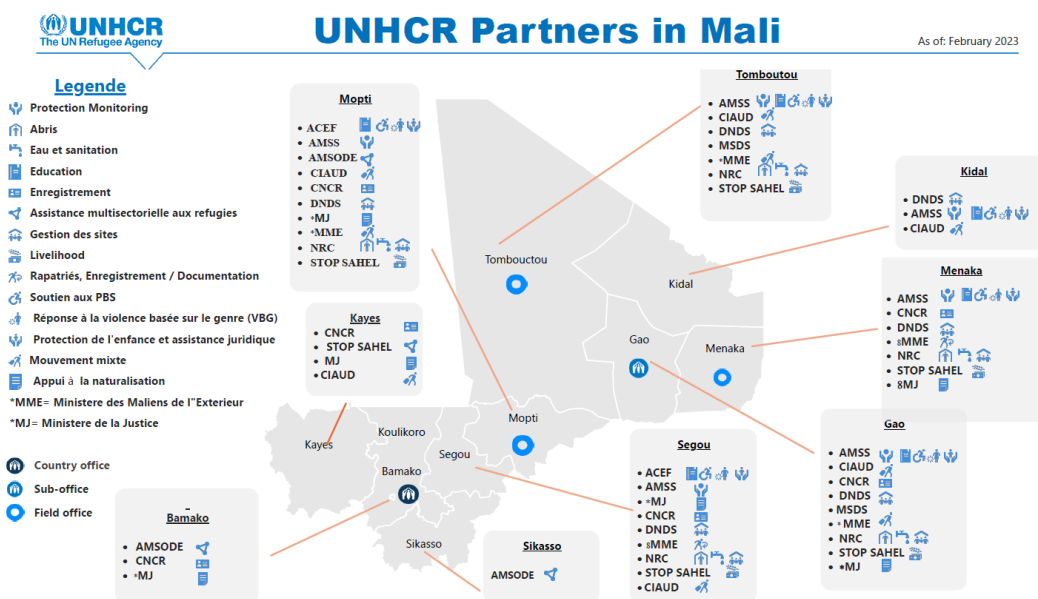

MAIN ACTIVITIES

PROTECTION

- As part of the monitoring of detention centers, police stations and gendarmerie brigades, authorization for UNHCR access was renewed in January by the authorities to allow monitoring activities to be restarted.
- In January, in Bamako, UNHCR received, advised, and guided four refugees (two women and two men) following their needs including documentation and community services.

Community Mobilisation

- In January, UNHCR organized four awareness-raising sessions on peaceful coexistence in Menaka, Diabaly, Farako, Kolongo and Markala, reaching 93 persons (53 women, 34 men, four girls and two boys). Many internally displaced persons and refugees participated in these sensitizations.

Education

- As part of the selection of candidates for the BIOFORCE training course, UNHCR facilitated the selection of two young refugee to follow a four-month training course in Human Resources and Finance Management and Transport Logistics at the BIOFORCE center in Dakar.

Gender-based violence

- In Koro and Ménaka, UNHCR provided psychosocial and medical care to 13 GBV survivors among refugees and IDPs, including three cases of denial of resources, one case of psychological, two cases of sexual assault, etc. In addition, UNHCR distributed dignity kits to four women survivors of GBV in Menaka
- During January, UNHCR and its partners conducted awareness-raising sessions on gender-based violence, in Ansongo, Gao and Menaka, reaching 166 persons, including 154 women, seven girls and five men. Most of the participants are refugees and internally displaced persons.

Mixed Movements:

- In January, UNHCR identified 384 persons (275 men, 74 women, 21 boys and 14 girls) of various nationalities in mixed movements in Mali, especially in the regions of Gao, Menaka, Mopti, Nioro, Segou and Timbuktu. Many of these persons on the move have suffered psychological and emotional abuse and extortion of property.
- UNHCR conducted a total of 27 awareness-raising sessions in the regions of Gao, Menaka, Mopti, and Timbuktu, reaching 371 persons, including 282 men, 85 women, three boys and one girl. These sessions focused on the refugee status determination process, asylum procedures in Mali, the consequences of irregular migration, the importance of civil registration, and prevention against COVID-19.

Statelessness:

- In January, thanks to awareness-raising on birth declarations, nine new births registered within the Mauritanian refugee community in Kayes were declared to the communal authorities in order to obtain a civil status document.
- During January, UNHCR and its partners conducted six awareness-raising sessions on importance of birth registration in Kayes, reaching 83 persons, including 47 men and 36 women. In addition, to increase the rate of birth registration, UNHCR has identified 70 community relays in the refugee sites in Kayes. These persons, who will soon be trained, will help to raise awareness of the importance of civil status documents.

Durable solutions :**Voluntary Repatriation:**

- In January, UNHCR facilitated the voluntary repatriation of a Congolese refugee to his country of origin, the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Resettlement:

- UNHCR organized an awareness and information session for urban refugees in Bamako on the resettlement process. 40 persons including 30 men and 10 women took part in this session.

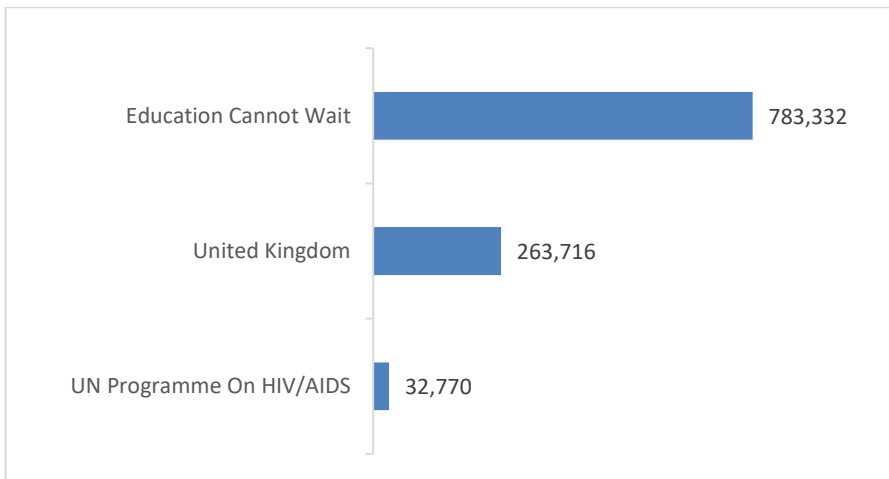
- In Timbuktu, UNHCR handed over 2 Refugee Housing Unit (RHU) tents and 8 tarpaulins to a community school.
