


Following the outbreak of armed conflict in Sudan on 15 April 2023, **growing numbers of refugees, returnees and third country nationals** have been crossing into neighbouring countries.


As of 28 April, the most significant cross border movements so far have been Sudanese refugees arriving in Chad and Egypt, and South Sudanese returning to South Sudan. Sudanese refugees have also arrived in the Central African Republic (CAR).

The main new arrivals to Ethiopia have been third country nationals, with some refugees also arriving, among which are small numbers of refugees previously hosted by Sudan and Ethiopia. UNHCR has not yet registered any refugees arriving in Libya.
