

ASSISTED RETURN IN NORTHERN REGIONS

January - April 2023

Context

Under the auspices of the Durable Solutions Working Groups (DSWG) chaired by the regional/zonal authorities, UNHCR has facilitated voluntary returns for 19,051 IDPs in safe and dignified conditions to their places of origin in Afar (3,027), Amhara (6,395) and Tigray (9,629). Ahead of the return, the displaced population benefited from Core Relief Items (CRIs) and Cash-Based Interventions (CBI) for transportation and multi-purposes, such as food and medicines.

The return process includes counselling and profiling of those willing to return, pre-return assessment in locations of return, support of persons with specific needs such as pregnant and lactating mothers, the elderly, unaccompanied and separated children and people with disability. Post return monitoring is conducted through Protection Monitoring and Solutions (PMS) to identify protection issues in the areas of return for quick impact projects to make returns sustainable.
