ABOUT

As an effort to help national NGOs and Refugee-led organizations (RLOs) in Poland to identify founding opportunities for 2023 and beyond, the UNHCR Inter-Agency Team in Poland has compiled a list of funding opportunities **primarily for national organizations**. The elements which guide the adding of a source to this list are:

- (1) National Polish Organizations and/or RLOs are eligible to apply; and
- (2) Available funds are relevant to activities, programmes, or organizations primarily working in support of **refugee related issues**.
