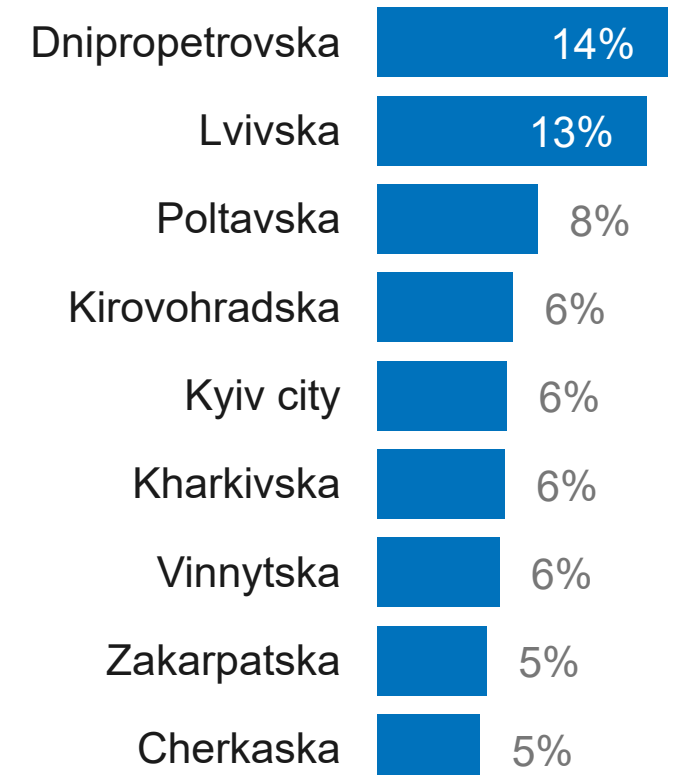

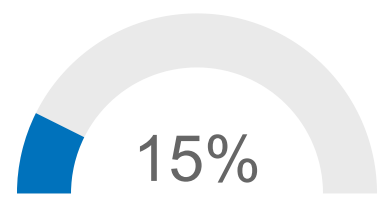

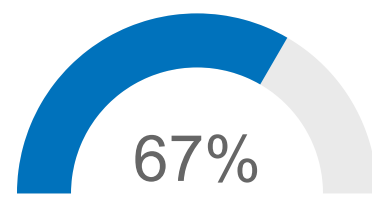
Methodology

UNHCR is conducting regular **intention surveys with IDPs in Ukraine** to prioritize the inclusion of their perspectives in discussions about their future and to inform the early recovery and durable solutions response of the Government of Ukraine and the international community. This dashboard presents the main findings of the second round of the IDP intentions survey conducted in **May 2023**. **4,001** respondents were interviewed through a **phone-based** survey. 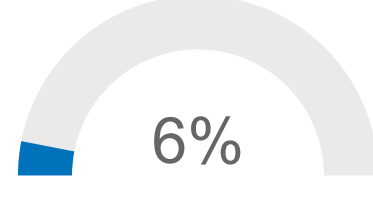
KEY FINDINGS: INTENTIONS TO RETURN TO UKRAINE



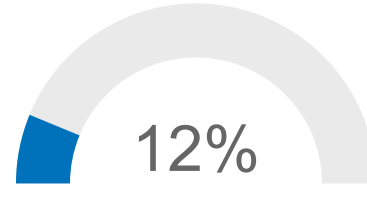
of respondents are planning to return in the next 3 months

Overall, the survey found that fifteen percent of respondents planned to return home within the next three months. However, the majority of those surveyed expressed a desire to return home in the future, although without a specific timeframe. It is important to note that the results vary across different respondent groups.

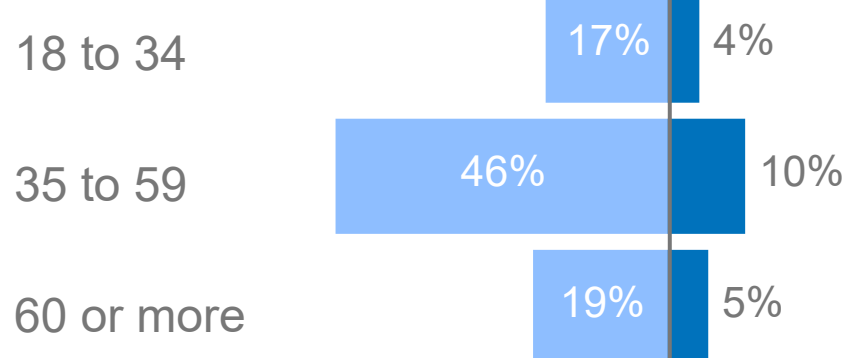

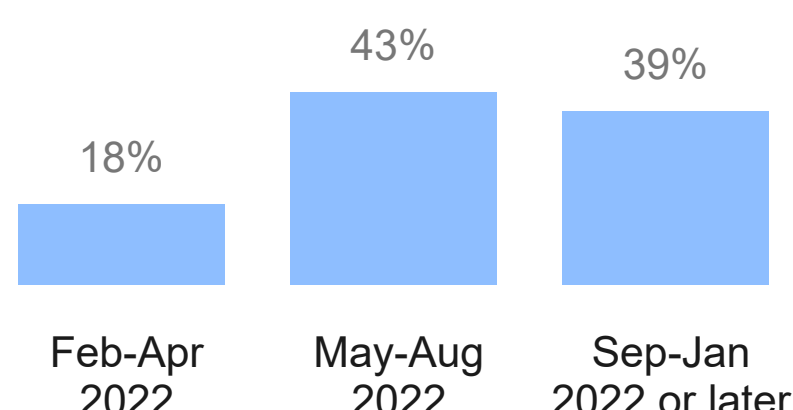

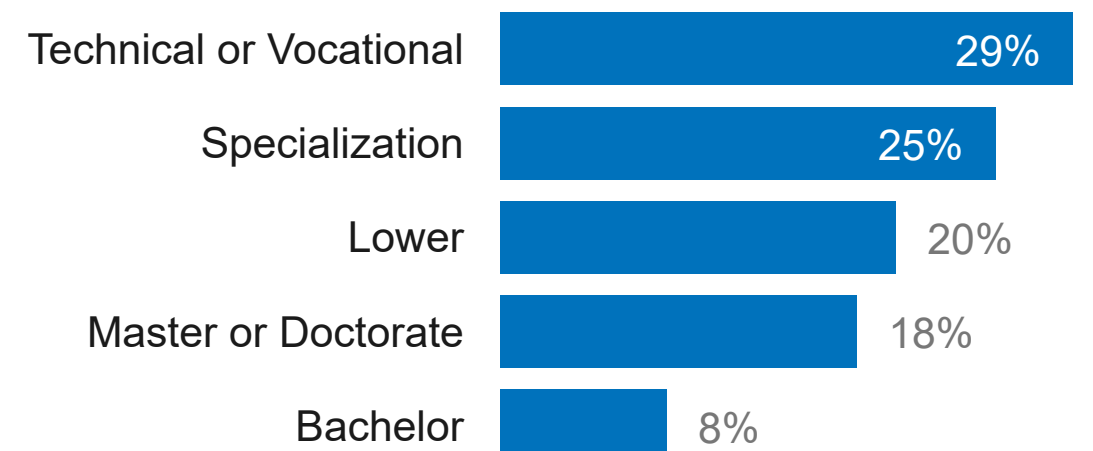

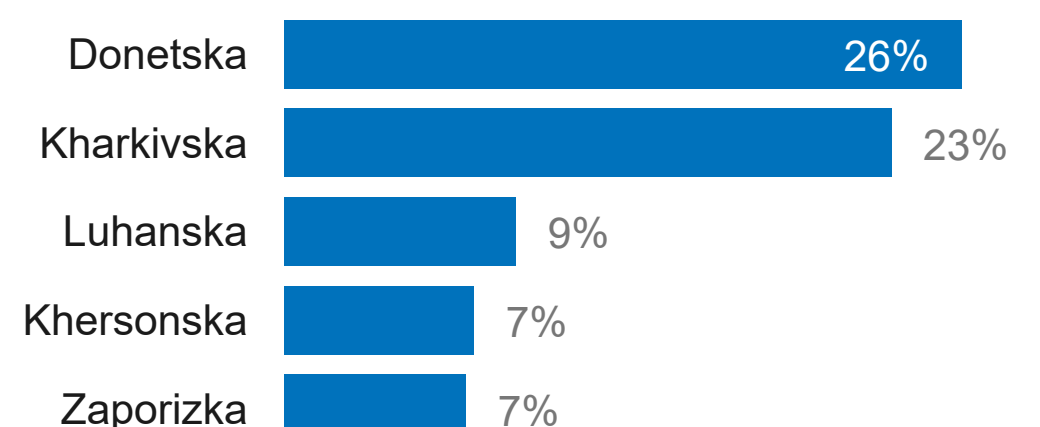

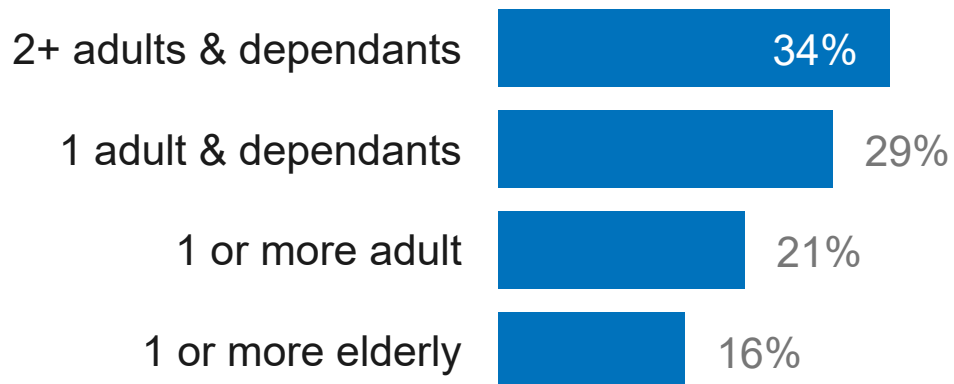

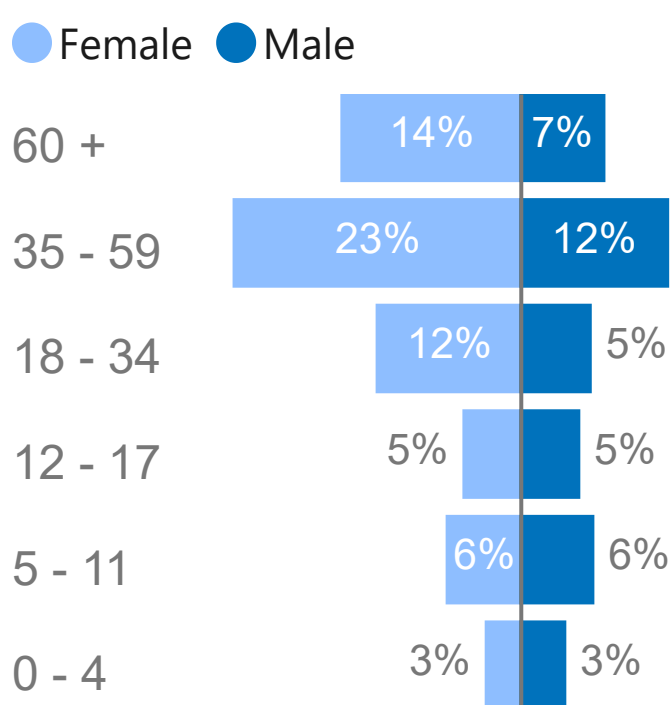

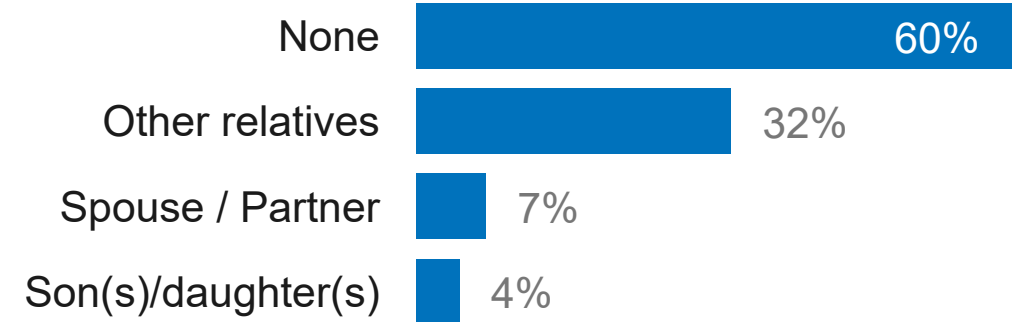

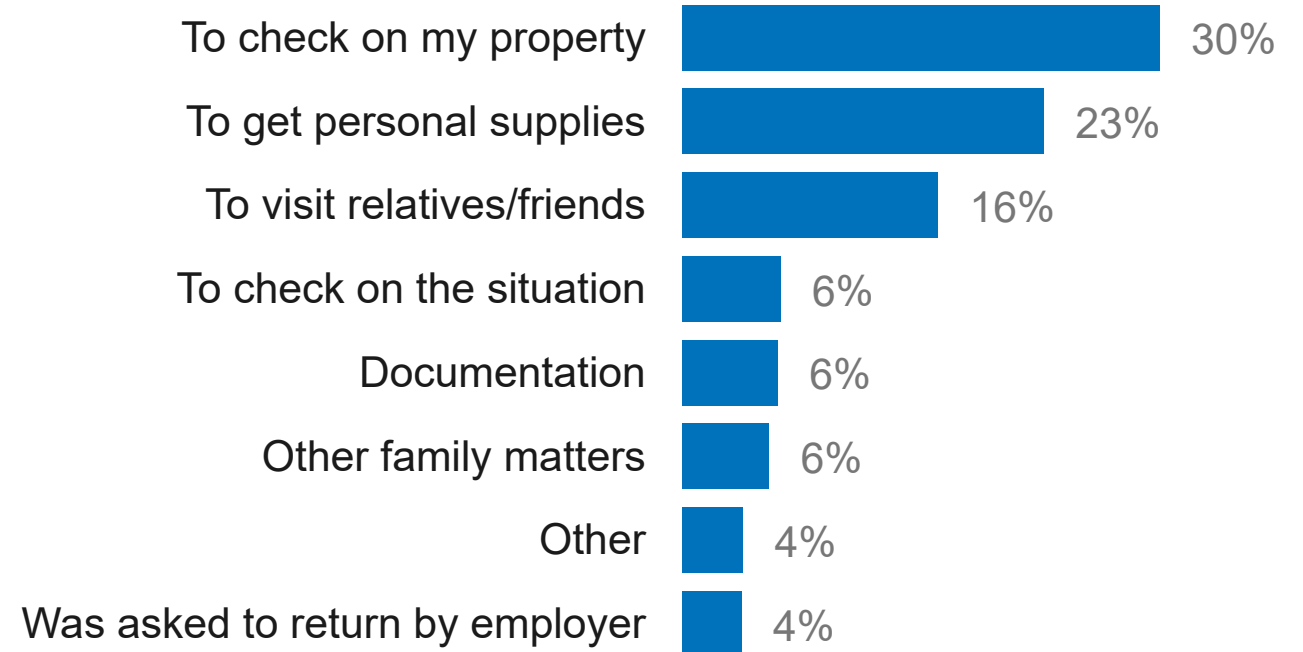

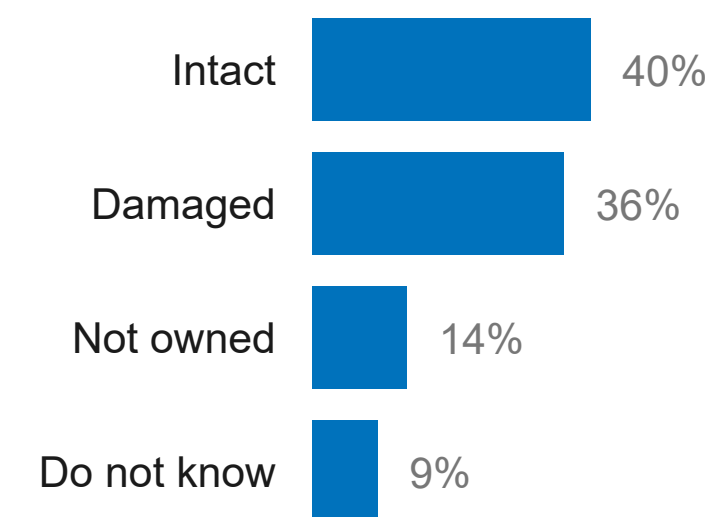

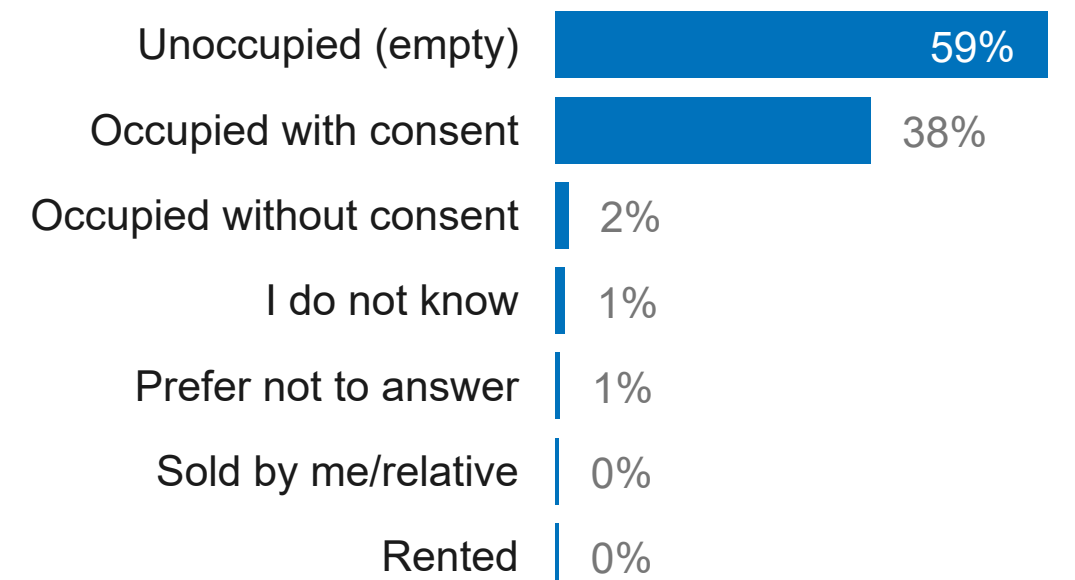
Reasons for temporary visit*



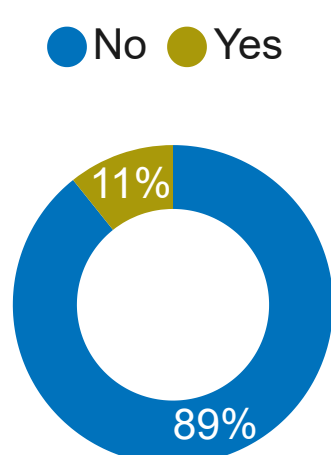
Status of dwelling in place of origin**



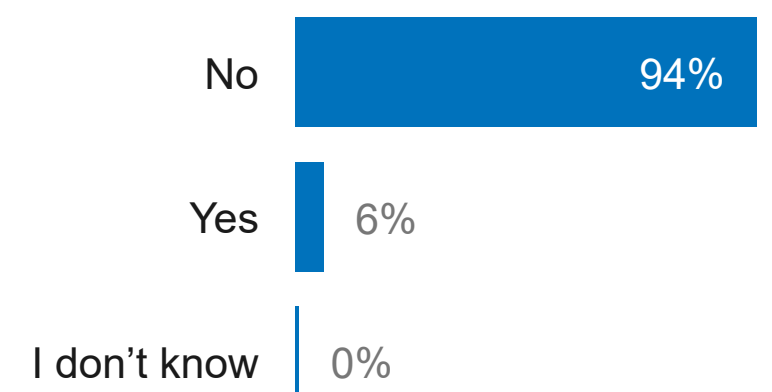
Occupational status of the dwelling in place of origin**

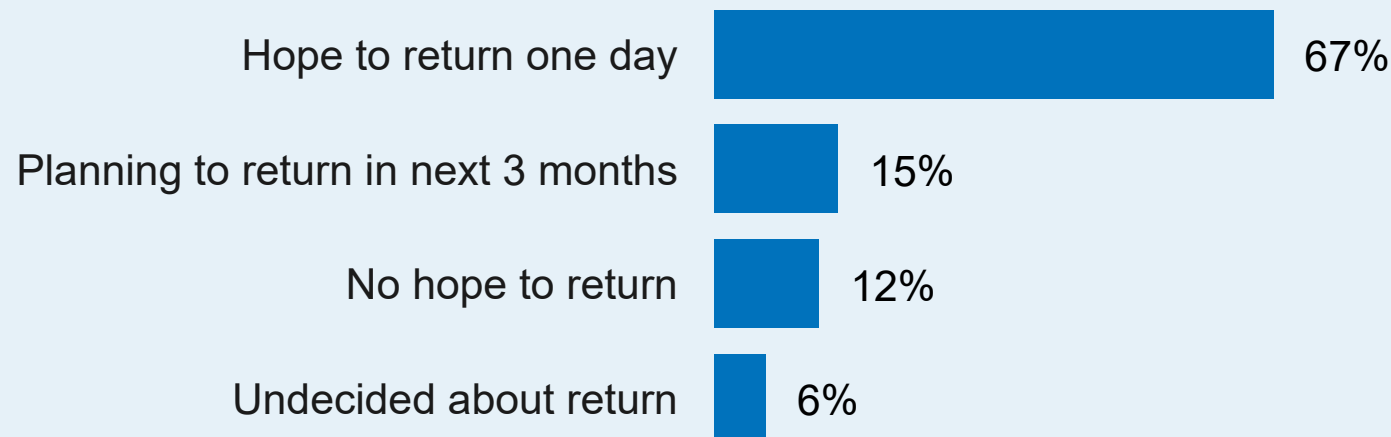

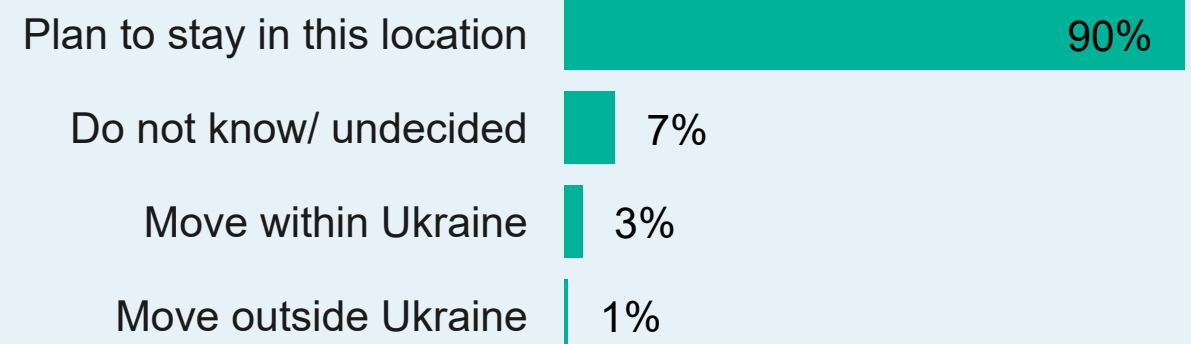

IDP intentions to return to place of origin**



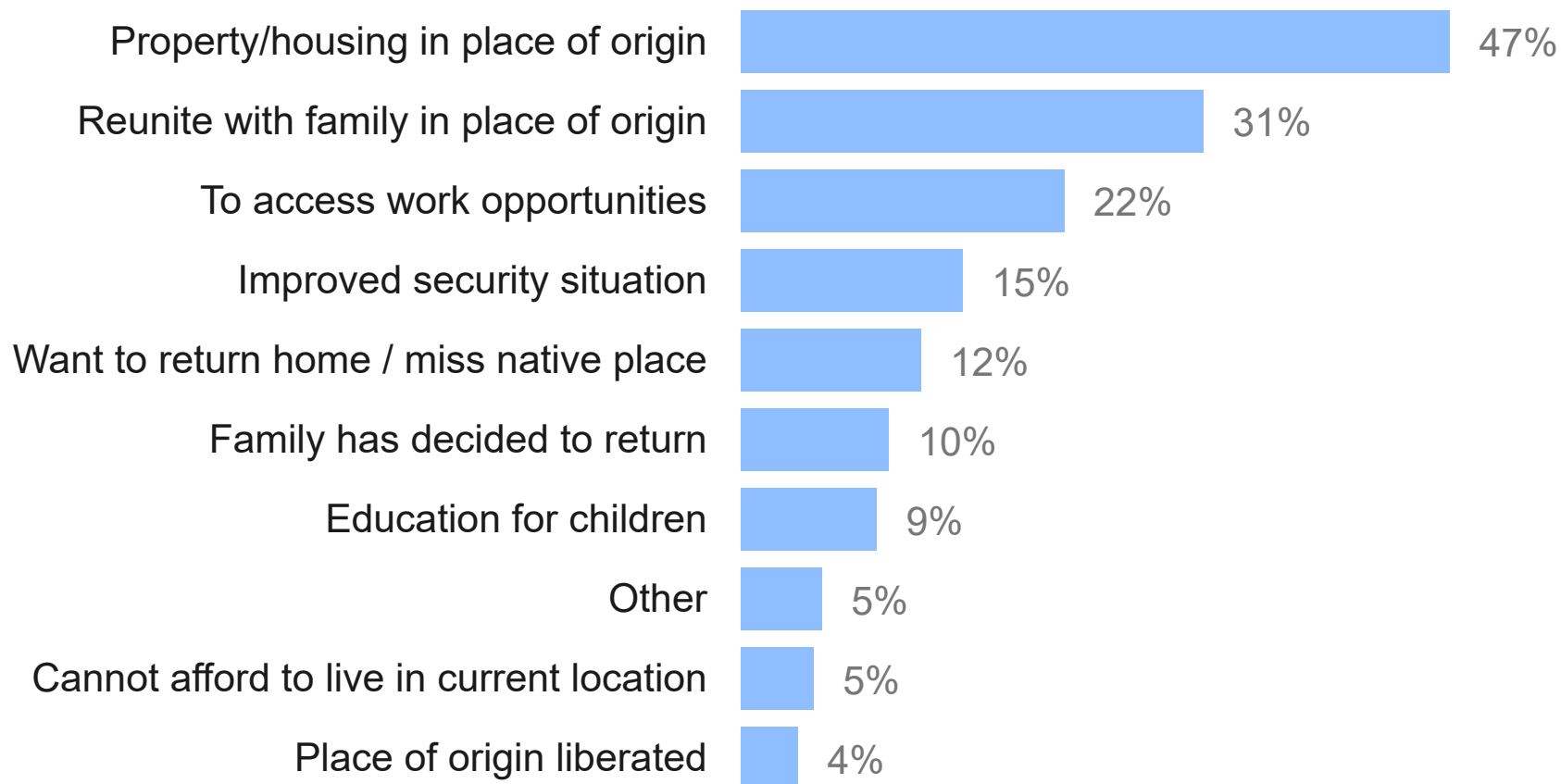
Intentions for the next 3 months**

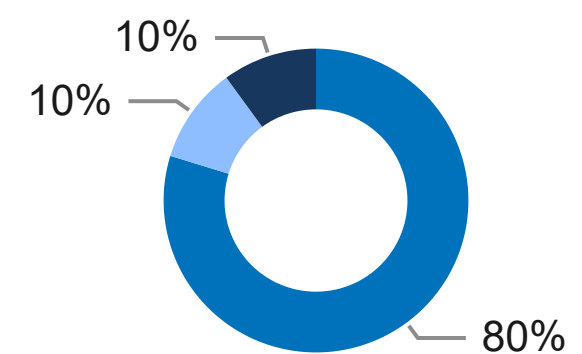

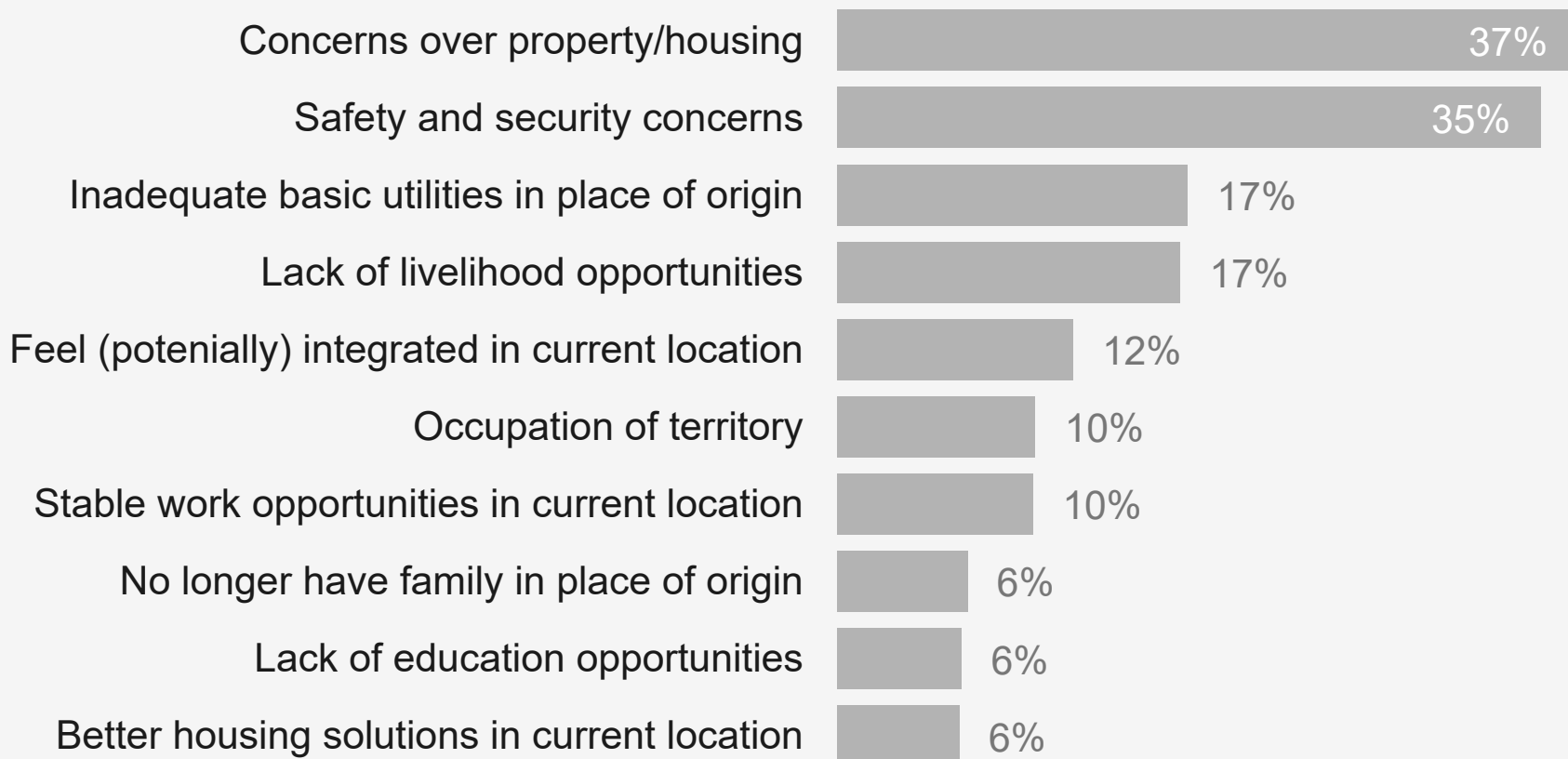

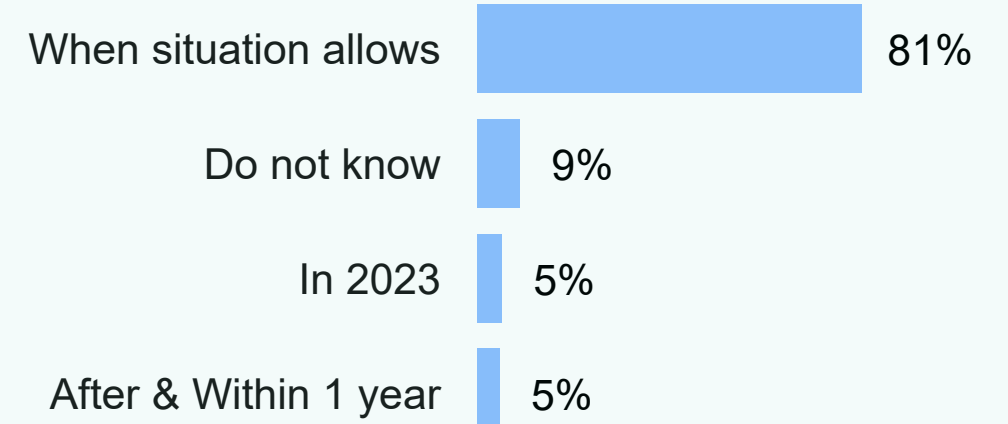

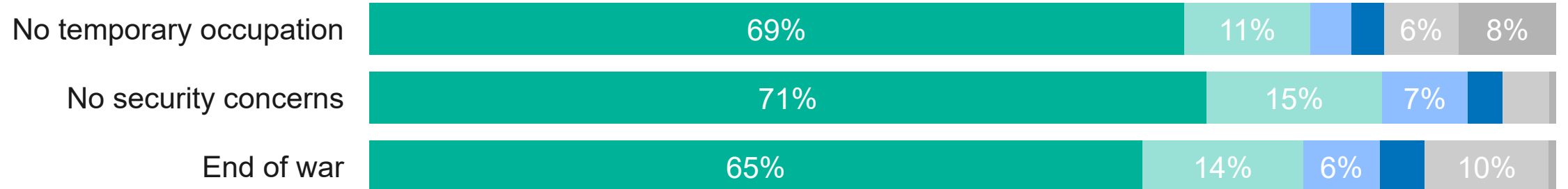

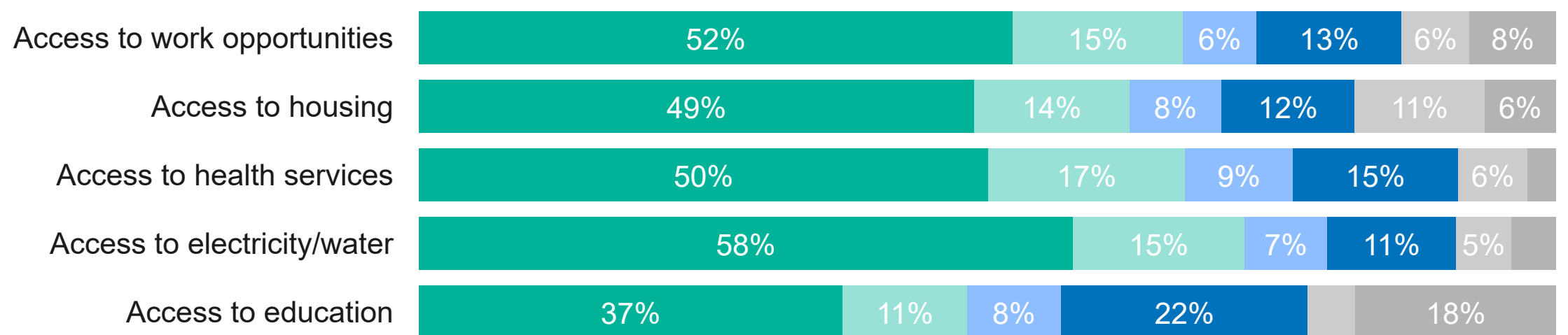

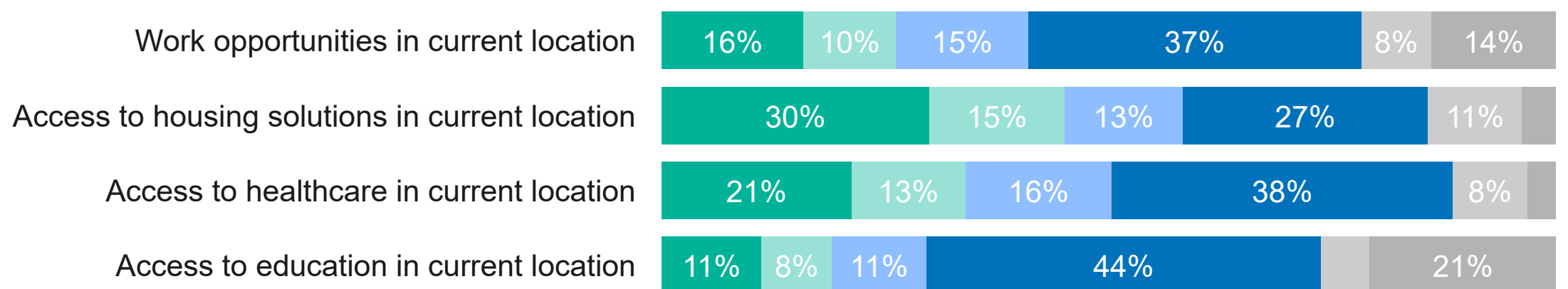
Importance of factors related to basic services/livelihoods in place of origin**

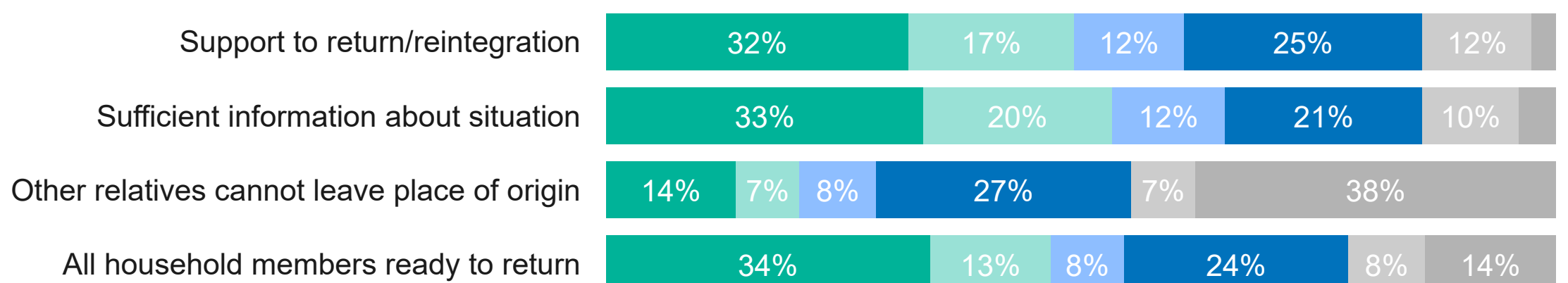
Importance of factors related to basic services/livelihoods in current location**

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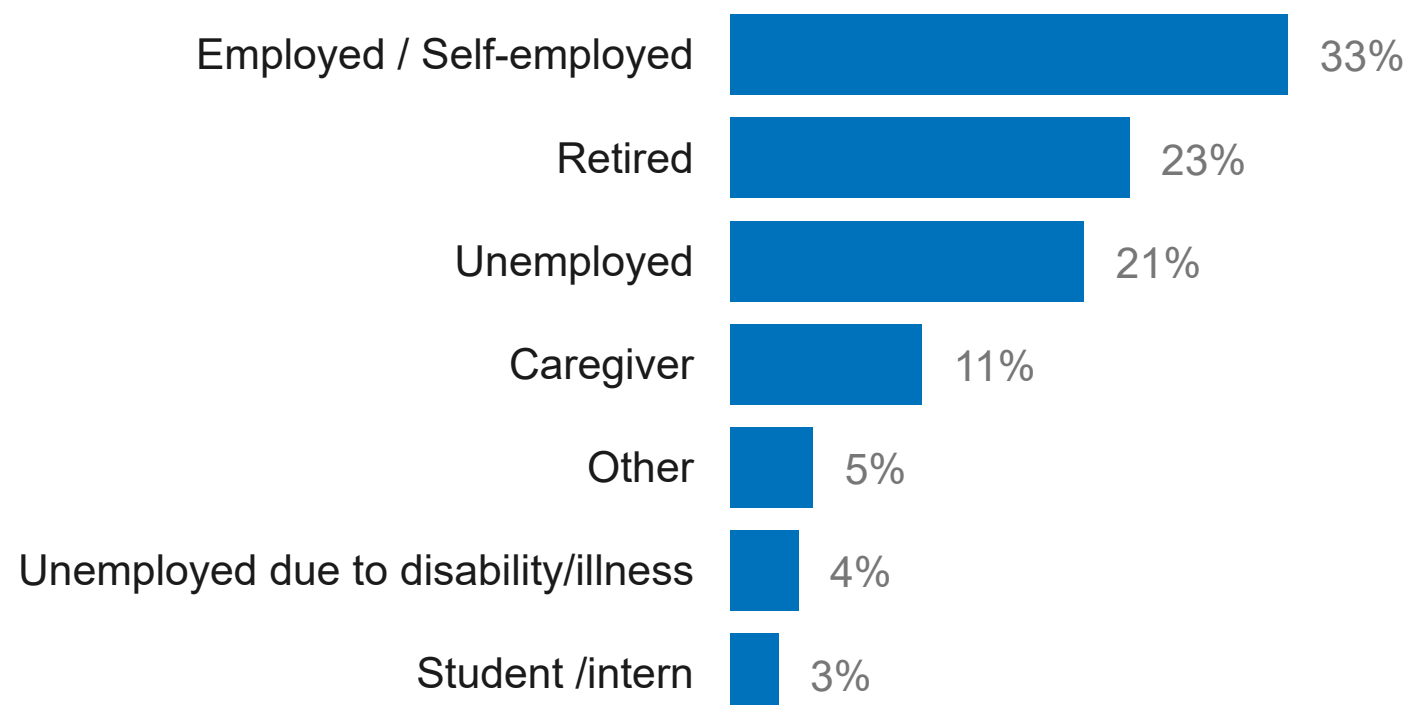

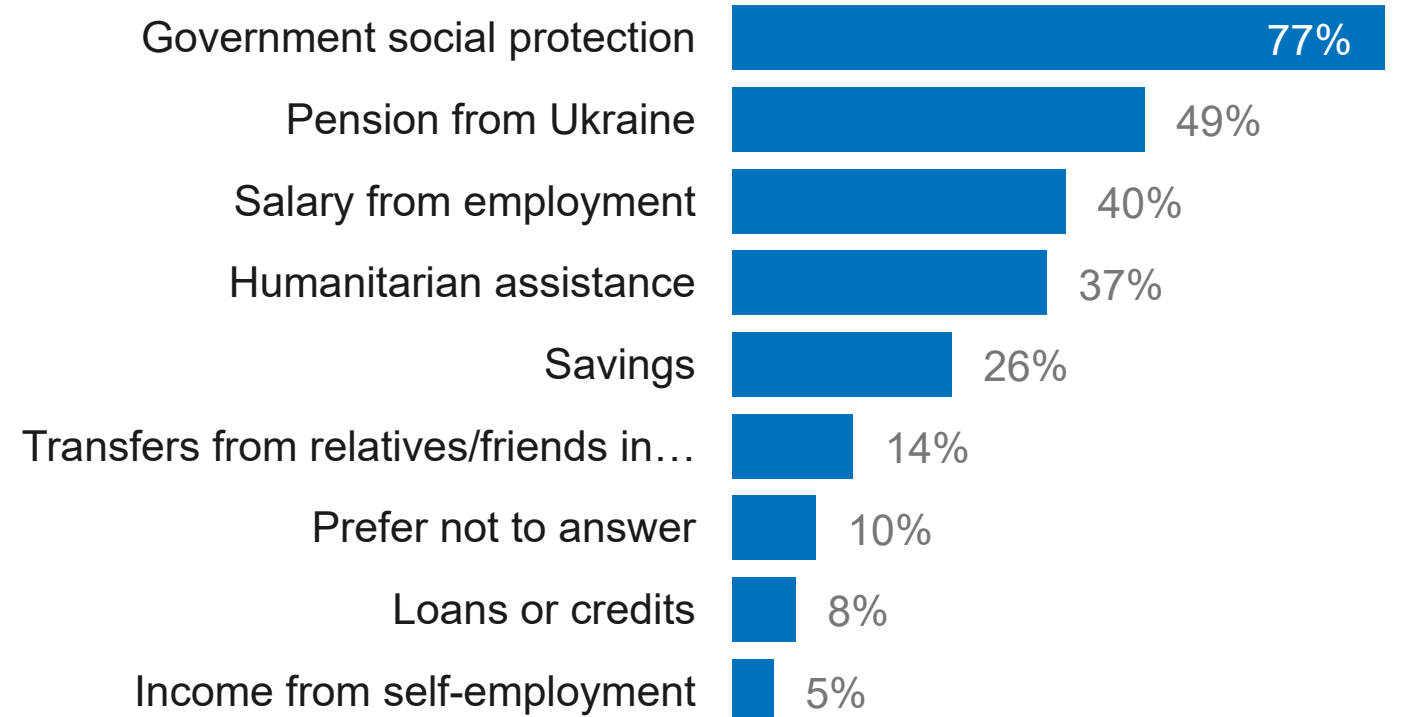

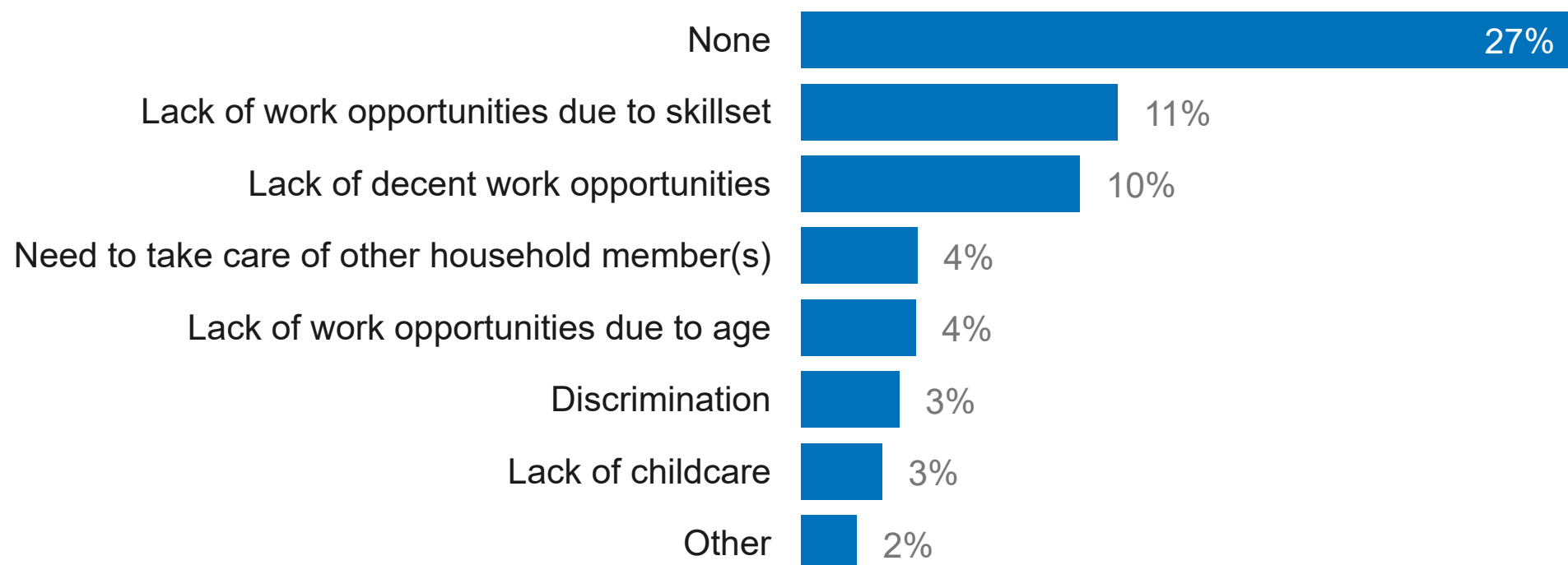

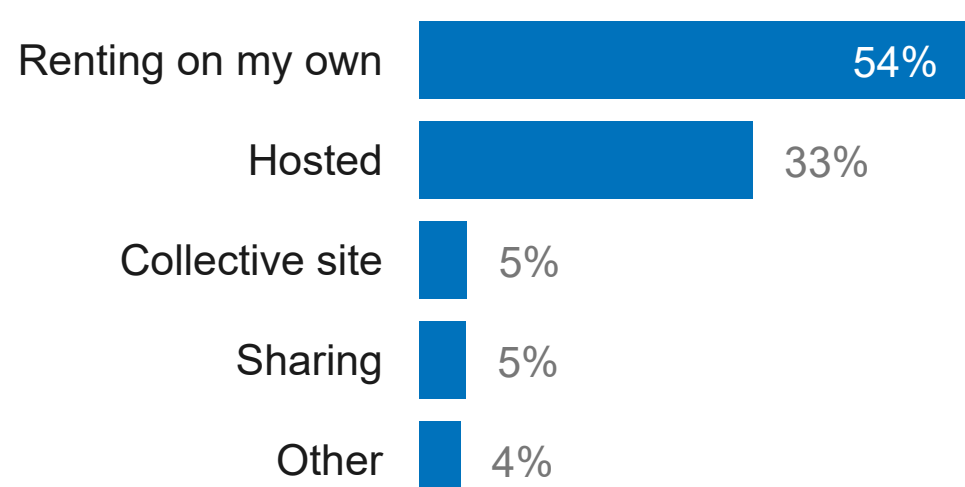

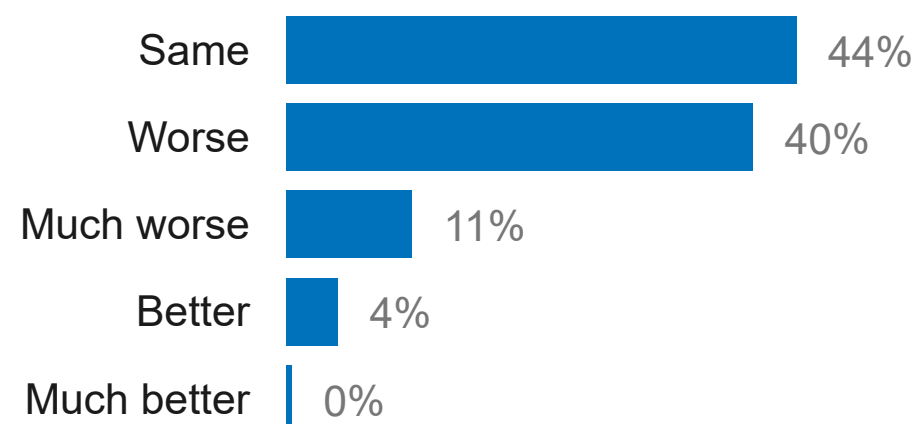
Main reasons for unemployment*



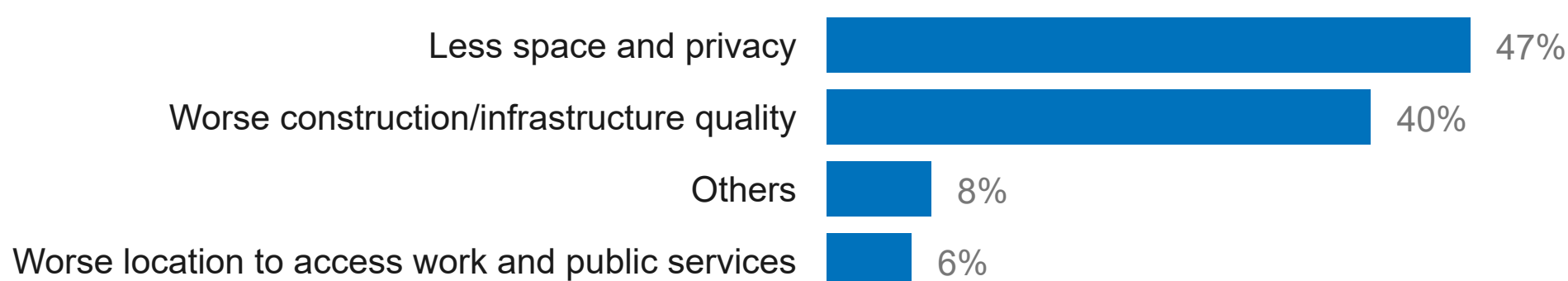

Why housing condition is worse**

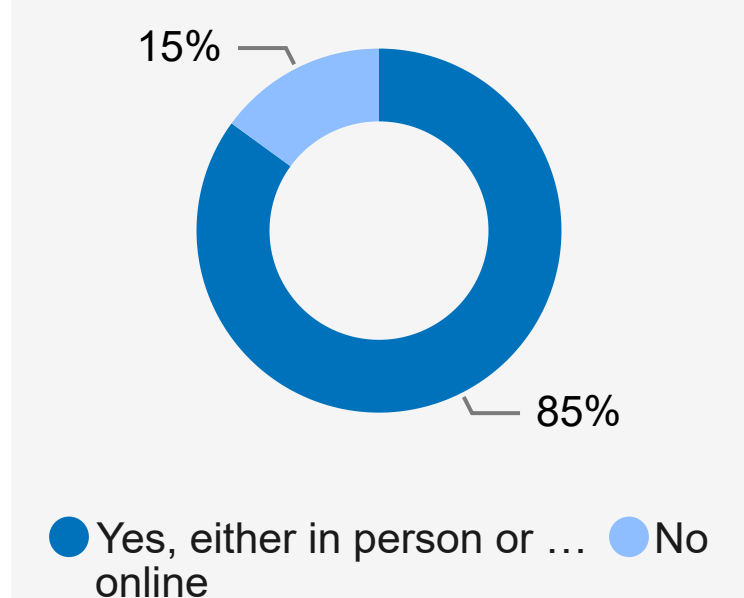

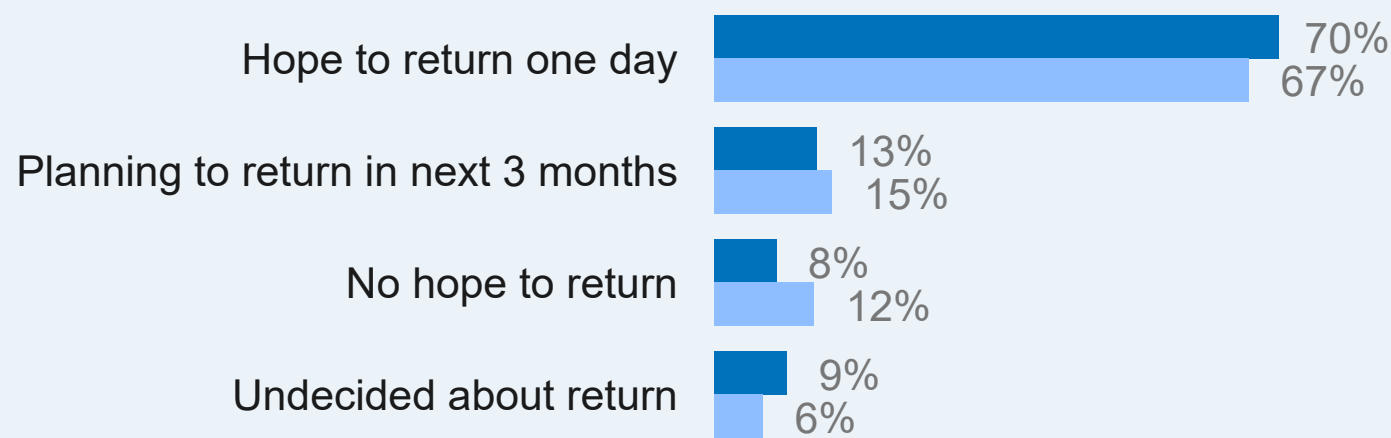

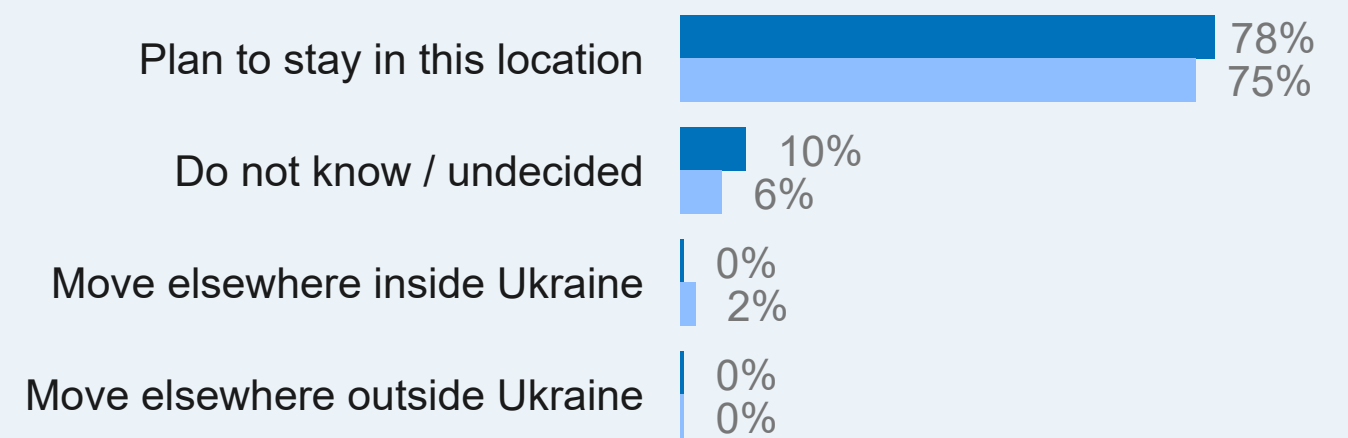

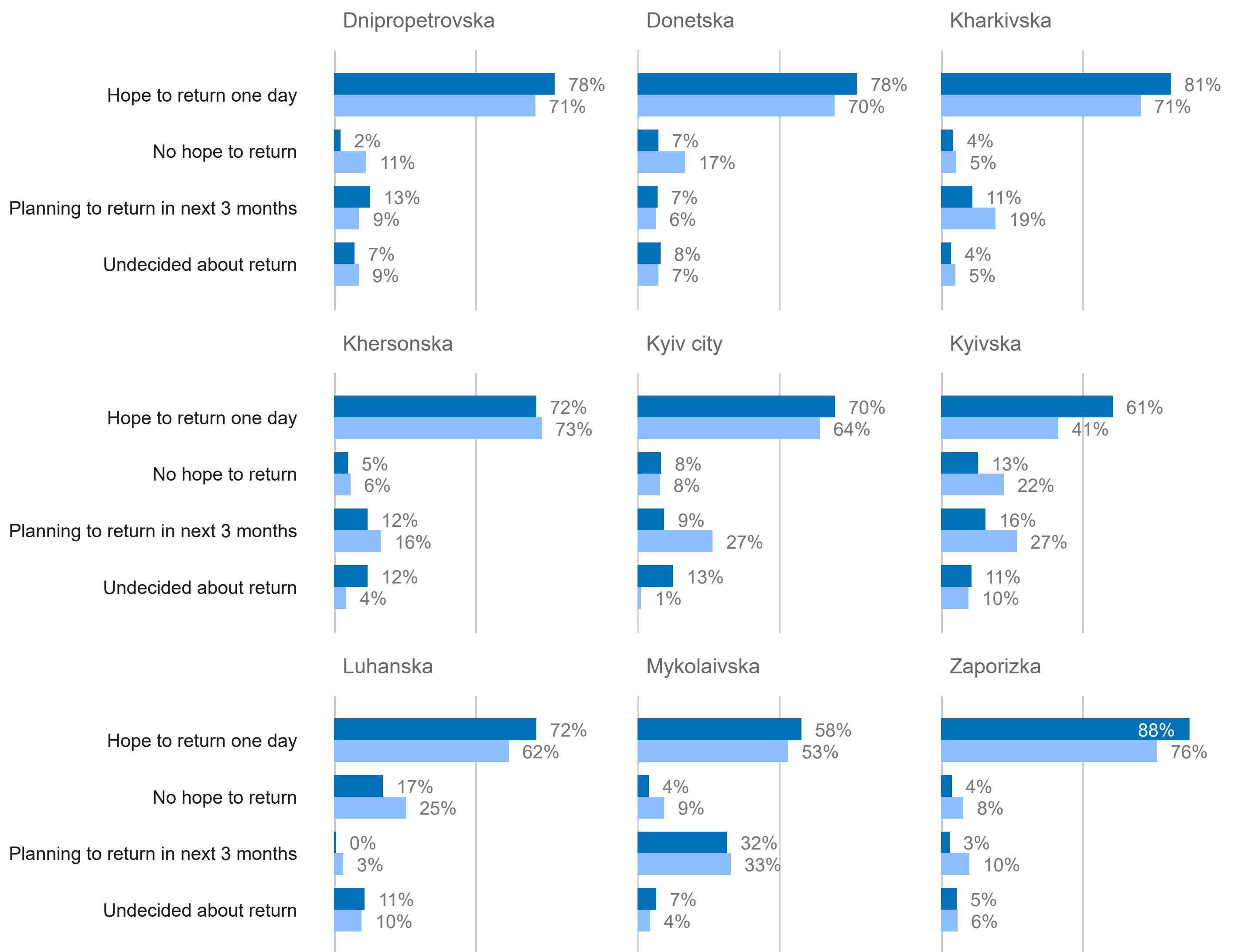
