Main Topic	
1 and 2	The latest figures from the IAWG on numbers of refugees crossing the border and claiming TP was shared. There has been an increase in cross border activity both into and out of Ukraine with fewer people claiming TP. There remains a prominence of women and children and a significant number of unaccompanied minors.
3. Presentation by GB of SECS	GB shared the activity of SECS over the summer months, which included working with young people on SRHR. SECS have developed a game to tackle gender norms as a way to tackle GBV and also drama sessions in schools. The presentation is attached with the minutes. There are also learning resources available from the SECS website www.secs.ro on their training hub, which are available for all to download as required Silvia asked about possible collaboration with SECS working with adolescent refugees. This could be possible as SECS use translators.
4.	AG shared the findings from the recent WHO field trip including a list of refugee inclusive family doctors (presentation attached) IM highlighted a lack of Obstetric and Gynaecological care in Constanta. AG commented that the midwives from Galati had looked into working part time in Galati but there was still a lack of available working space and a lack of OBGYN doctors who could receive referrals.

	Save the Children supported a family doctor near Brasov to buy an USS and perform gynaecological investigations. SB agreed to share details with WHO
Updates/AOB	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. AMI have an HIV referral service for men who have sex with men (MSM) and sex workers primarily. They will share the contact details of this service 2. WHO has recently launched a social media campaign to address myths and misconceptions around STIs and contraception in Romanian and Ukrainian. It was launched during PRIDE and will be shared with partners soon. 3. WHO has recently carried out GBV and PSEAH trainings to UN and health partners and is planning more in the near future with family doctors in Sibiu. 4. Save the Children employs cultural mediators in health to assist refugees access medical services and they distribute medical vouchers. They are happy for anyone who might want to partner with them. The cultural mediators are located in Mures, Iasi, Brasov, Suceava and Bucharest.
