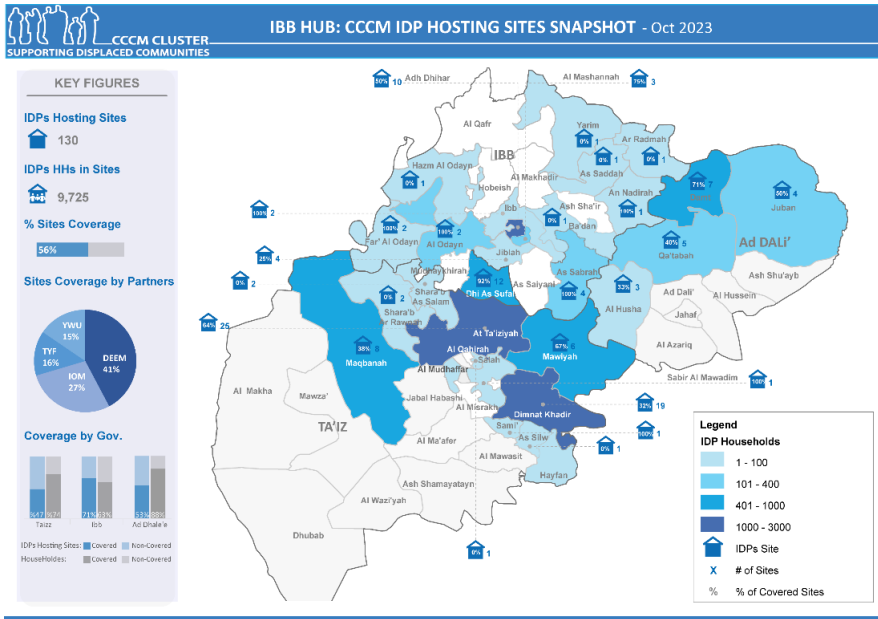

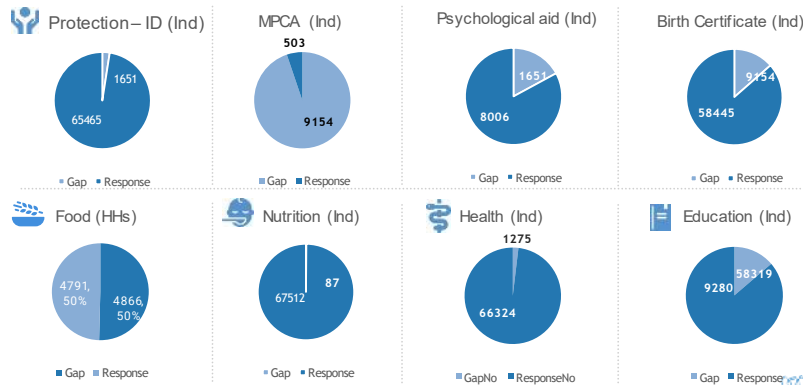

2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Partners updates: <p>TYF:</p> <p>TYF CCCM has working on having a clear accurate database through establishing a systematic monitoring of IDPs movement at the managed sites, numbering of each shelter to avoid duplication, establishing a mechanism of updating the database in case of arrivals or departures, conducting field visits for verification and registration.</p> <p>Site infrastructures improvements: CCCM team has prepared proposal to cover the prioritized gaps and needs at the IDP sites to improve the sites infrastructures. The intervention planned to be implemented were designed based on the priority gaps of IDPs placed during community consultation, and focus group discussion,</p> <p>Ensure that the IDP are engaged in all CCCM activities and interventions including designing of the project activities, planning, implementation, and decision-making to ensure a smooth successful implementation and coordination. This is achieved through conducting training the community committees on the concept of community participation, and community-led projects, and then conducting regular monitoring visits and sessions with IDPs, establishing a transparent CFM for accountability and feedback.</p> <p>Deem:</p> <p>DEEM CCCM implements a range of regular CCCM activities at managed sites. These activities encompass addressing the multi-sectoral needs and gaps by referring and escalating them to the relevant service providers and SNC coordinator in Ibb Hub. DEEM CCCM established entry and exit systems within their managed sites by dividing them into designated squares and assigning specific codes to each IDP's tent. The team also monitors the movements of IDPs, including new arrivals and departures, within the sites.</p> <p>DEEM CCCM places a strong emphasis on mobilization and community engagement. This is achieved through regular coordination meetings with the site-level community committees and stakeholders. Capacity-building sessions are conducted to enhance the skills and knowledge of the site's community committees. The team also maintains two-way communication with the site's population, actively collecting, analyzing, sharing, and</p>	

<p>taking action on complaints raised by the population. Additionally, regular awareness sessions are conducted on hygiene promotion, fire and flood mitigation, and regular cleaning campaigns are organized to improve the overall site environment.</p> <p>Furthermore, DEEM CCCM identified the priority needs of the site's population through consultations and prepared three community-led projects aimed at addressing those needs and improving the site's infrastructure. These projects include the installation of 86 external solar spotlights, providing and installing 67 emergency latrines, supplying maintenance kits, fire extinguishers, and first aid kits, carrying out site leveling, supplying and installing an iron pedestrian bridge, and establishing three community spaces at IDP sites in Taiz and Al Dhala'e governorates. DEEM CCCM submits these projects for approval to the CCCM cluster and UNHCR.</p> <p>IOM:</p> <p>IOM CCCM implements a range of regular CCCM activities at sites.</p> <p>These activities the -sectoral needs and gaps by referring and escalating them to the relevant service provider's coordinator.</p> <p>The CCCM team also monitors the movements of IDPs, including new arrivals and departures, within the sites.</p> <p>IOM coordination meetings with the community committees. Capacity-building sessions are conducted to enhance the skills and knowledge of the site's community committees.</p> <p>The team also maintains with communication with the site's IDPs, actively collecting, analyzing, sharing, and taking action on complaints raised by the IDPs.</p> <p>Awareness sessions are conducted on hygiene promotion, fire and flood mitigation, distribution of cleaning materials and cleaning campaigns</p> <p>IOM to improve the overall site environment.</p> <p>IOM CCCM identified the priority needs of the site's IDPs through consultations and prepared projects aimed at addressing those needs and improving the site's infrastructure. 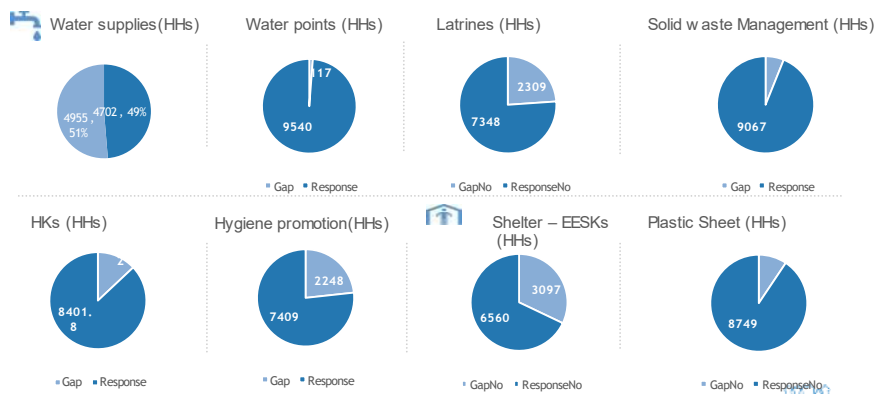


Sectoral gaps within IDP hosting sites in Ibb hub




Sectoral gaps within IDP hosting sites in Ibb hub
