Welcoming	Welcoming participants and providing a brief on the agenda and housekeeping rules.	MoM will be uploaded on UNHCR's Data Portal
Coordination updates (All Updates, updates from the field)	<p>The JRP logframe has been consolidated and reviewed, the narrative is under review by MOPIC and the World Bank. The old JORIS system is still in place, the new one will be launched in July 2024. A review panel is in place for the markers, they will be uploaded and embedded in the system.</p> <p>ActivityInfo: several trainings were organized, but not all partners have uploaded the data yet. 32 partners received credentials to access, but only 2 uploaded the data. Members are invited to reach out to UNCHR if technical issues are experienced, especially on the planning/reporting roles. Oct-Nov-Dec data will be published on monthly basis, along with overall Jan to Sept data. We need to know members' data to support the advocacy efforts for funding. If there is a new focal point who has not attended the trainings UNCHR is ready to offer support also through bilateral trainings.</p> <p><u>Updates from fields:</u></p> <p>Azraq: SWG meeting will be tomorrow. ARDD conducted in November legal awareness sessions, and PLAN conducted awareness on youth issues. PSEA trainings were held for 68 persons in October.</p>	All agencies update the sheet if they replicate the ToT on GBV safe referrals.

	<p>EJC: TDH and IFH will conduct activities related to 16 days of activism.</p> <p>Irbid: a PSEA session was conducted in a remote area close to Ramtha and a training on GBV safe referrals in Jerash. A GBV gap analysis was carried out for Irbid, Jerash and Ajloun and it will be used to update the national one (to be shared with co-chairs)</p> <p>Mafraq: the monthly meeting will be conducted this week; they have previously conducted a child marriage session.</p> <p>Zaatari: a community-based initiative led by women was launched to accompany girls to school (116 so far but the number is growing). A GBV safe referral training was conducted for rehabilitation service providers.</p>	
<p>16 Days of Activism</p>	<p>Some organizations, as well as GBV SWG sub-national locations, have decided to cancel large events but others will still continue to go ahead with low key ones to shed a light on GBV issues related to the theme (investing to prevent violence against W&G).</p> <p>A presentation was provided giving an overview of what was done so far around the campaign, with a TaskForce established on 17th October, FGDs held with 140 persons in the field at the beginning of November to develop messages. 21st December will be the deadline for the final report. There will be 116 activities during 16 days.</p> <p>16 messages were developed around the 'Every Act Counts' theme on prevention (which also constituted a moment of reflection for GBV practitioners themselves) to be used in field locations, and 8 messages around GBV in times of crises to be used through social media. In some locations there will be collaborative events across organizations. A full calendar will be shared with members.</p>	<p>Presentation available here.</p>
<p>Overview of the project: "Supporting Systems for Gender-based Violence Prevention and Protection" by GIZ</p>	<p>Presentation of the GIZ project 'Supporting Systems for GBV prevention and protection', part of a wider EU funded programme with another project supported by AECID (which will be also presented soon). The GIZ project aims at enhancing the FPJD and PSD capacity to enhance the support processes of GBV victims by shifting from an institution-centred to a victim-centred approach, including with a new comprehensive service centre in East Amman, along with the refurbishment of several other branches.</p>	<p>Presentation available here.</p>

<p>Reflections on cross sectoral coordination with Livelihood Sector.</p>	<p>Reflections from a presentation held in September as part of the Economic Empowerment WG meeting, which was the opportunity to initiate a conversation between the GBV SWG and the EE WG and look at areas of joint actions to enhance safety of our programming.</p> <p>The presentation revolved around the GBV Minimum Standards, their core guiding principles and then Standard 12 on Economic Empowerment and Livelihood. Some of the possible follow up actions discussed include enhancing the referral pathway by ensuring addition of EE updated interventions to the Amaali app, ensuring training on safe referrals for EE WG members, foster exchange of resources generated on the linkages between GBV and EE, and ensuring capacity building of small organizations and CBOs on GBV risk mitigation and analysis.</p>
