**ABOUT**

In an effort to assist national NGOs and Refugee-led organizations (RLOs) in identifying funding opportunities for 2025 and beyond, the UNHCR Inter-Agency Team in Poland has put together this overview. The criteria guiding the inclusion of a funding source in this list are:

- (1) **Eligibility:** National Polish Organizations and/or RLOs are eligible to apply.
- (2) **Relevance:** Available funds should be applicable to activities, programs, or organizations primarily addressing refugee-related issues.
