Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Public authorities and institutions from eligible countries (developing countries, Parties to the 2005 Convention)
- Non-governmental organizations (NGOs) from eligible countries (developing countries, Parties to the 2005 Convention)
- International non-governmental organizations (INGOs) registered in countries Parties to the 2005 Convention

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

Deadline: 20-Jun-2024

Funding Source/Donor: United Nations Development Program (UNDP)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Civil society organizations (CSOs) in Moldova, particularly Associations of Countrymen (AZ)
- Non-governmental and non-profit organizations from Moldova
- Local public authorities (LPAs) as co-applicants
- Must be registered under Law No. 86/2020

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

Title of the Call: Combating Gender-Based Violence against Lesbians

Deadline: Jun 22nd, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: ELC – EuroCentralAsian Lesbian Community

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Legally registered, non-profit, non-governmental civil society organizations in their country of operation
- Established in a Member State of the European Union (including overseas countries and territories (OCTs) and CERV-participating countries including Moldova.
- LGBTIQ CSOs, that is, LGBTIQ-led and/or focused CSOs.
- Applicant respecting EU values such as dignity, equality, and justice (as laid down in Article 2 of the Treaty on European Union and the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights)

- Understanding and meeting the specific needs of LGBTIQ women and non-binary persons who are victims of gender-based violence (GBV)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Organizations located anywhere in the world.
- Organizations that have made a demonstrated and distinctive impact in advancing maternal health equity.
- Organizations led by a person of color and/or representative of the marginalized group being served.
- Non-profit organizations only
- Organizations that have not previously received the Kenneth C. Frazier Award for Maternal Health Equity

Title of the Call: Supporting Survivors of Modern Slavery Challenge

Deadline: Jul 1st, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: MIT Solve

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Individuals, teams, and organizations
- Solutions can be for-profit, nonprofit, or hybrid models and must be at least at the prototype stage.
- Applications must be written in English.
- US law prevents MIT Solve from accepting applications from individuals residing in Iran, Cuba, Syria, North Korea, or the Crimea, Donetsk People's Republic, or Luhansk People's Republic areas of Ukraine. Applications from Venezuela, Belarus, China (including Hong Kong), Saudi Arabia, and Russia will undergo legal review.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Improving and scaling resources for legal, financial, physical, psychological, and social well-being of survivors
- Enhancing access to and awareness of critical survivor resources
- Strengthening the ecosystem of providers through better communication, data collection and sharing, and coordination
- Training and supporting organizations and agencies to effectively work with survivors.



Funding Details:

- Total pool: \$300,000
- Two grand prize winners: \$75,000 each
- Three runner-up prize winners: \$50,000 each
- Winners will participate in a 6-month support program, including in-kind resources, virtual orientation sessions, monthly cohort convenings, check-in meetings with MIT Solve staff, executive leadership coaching, and capacity building workshops.

Title of the Call: Community Engagement Exchange (CEE) Program

Deadline: Jul 2nd, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: IREX

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Emerging civil society and community leaders aged 21-27
- Citizens of eligible countries, currently living and working in their home country
- Minimum of two years of professional or volunteer experience in community or civil society issues
- Able to begin the CEE Program in the United States in 2025 and receive a U.S. J-1 Visa
- Committed to returning to their home country after completion of the program and implementing a community-based project.
- Proficient in spoken and written English

- Civic dialogue and peacebuilding
- Open and participatory government

Title of the Call: USAID Integrated Health Systems Strengthening Program

Deadline: Jul 6th, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: United States Agency for International Development (USAID)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Organizations that have not previously received financial assistance from USAID.
- Local organizations and/or consortiums that include local organizations.
- Faith-based organizations are eligible to apply on the same basis as any other organization.



- USAID defines a “local entity” as legally organized under the laws of, with the principal place of business in, majority owned by, and managed by citizens or lawful permanent residents of the country receiving assistance.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Addressing root causes of complex health system challenges through systems thinking
- Strengthening the health system, including public and private sectors, with a focus on Primary Health Care (PHC)
- Promoting localization by putting local actors in the lead and strengthening local systems
- Increasing social inclusion and gender transformation to advance equitable healthcare systems.
- Enhancing health system resilience and responsiveness to emerging challenges
- Strengthening monitoring, evaluation, research, and learning (MERL) efforts to understand health system changes.
- Advancing health sector integration and collaboration by coordinating efforts and fostering multi-sectoral partnerships

Funding Details:

- USAID intends to award one (1) Cooperative Agreement
- Total funding: Up to \$325,000,000 over a five-year period

Title of the Call: Digital Freedom Fund

Deadline: Jul 15th, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: Digital Freedom Fund (DFF)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Digital rights advocates (e.g., NGOs and other entities pursuing a public interest objective)
- Pro bono lawyers and other litigators seeking to protect and advance digital rights in Europe.
- Organizations working on digital rights, including those focused on racial, social, feminist, queer, environmental, migrant rights, and economic justice movements.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Advancing individuals’ ability to exercise their right to privacy.
- Protecting and promoting the free flow of information online
- Ensuring accountability, transparency, and adherence to human rights in technology use and design.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Nominees must be established, nongovernmental, publicly supported charitable organizations.
- Nominees must have U.S. IRS tax-exempt status or equivalent for international organizations.
- Legally established for at least five years.
- Own audited financial statements for at least five consecutive years
- Expenditures greater than \$750,000 in the most recent audited fiscal year



- Cannot be a Hilton Humanitarian Prize Laureate or a local office/member organization of a Prize Laureate
- Cannot be local offices/member organizations of parent organizations or fiscally sponsored organizations.
- Cannot be specific programs within organizations or university-based projects.
- Cannot be academic institutions providing educational degrees but can be affiliates with independent tax-exempt status and audited financials.

- Health and Wellness: Efforts to improve physical and mental health in underserved communities.
- Education: Initiatives aimed at increasing access to quality education for all
- Economic Empowerment: Programs that support economic self-sufficiency and poverty alleviation.

- Human Rights: Actions to protect and promote human rights and social justice.
- Emergency Response: Initiatives providing disaster relief and humanitarian aid in crisis situations.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Affiliated entities are eligible if established in eligible countries.
- Associated partners can participate unless specified otherwise.
- Legal entities established in non-associated third countries can participate as associated partners in 'Coordination and support' actions.
- International European research organizations and international organizations headquartered in a Member State or Associated Country are eligible for funding under specific conditions.

Funding Source/Donor: Sexual Violence Research Initiative (SVRI)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Local organizations based in low and middle-income countries (LMICs)
- Multidisciplinary, multisectoral consortia, especially those led by researchers or evidence builders residing in LMICs.
- Proposals should embrace an intersectional approach and involve communities where relevant, appropriate, and ethical.
- Proposals must provide a clear breakdown of responsibilities for consortiums, ensuring equitable partnerships.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:
