Funding Source/Donor: United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Individuals, civil society actors, governmental and non-governmental entities.
- Candidates must have made exceptional contributions and demonstrated leadership in the promotion of tolerance and non-violence.
- The Prize may be awarded to individuals, groups of individuals, institutions, or non-governmental organizations.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Educational activities promoting tolerance and non-violence.
- Implementation of international, national, regional, or local programs aimed at promoting tolerance and non-violence.
- Mobilizing initiatives for the implementation of such programs.

- Full staff support and operating costs, including all costs related to the International Jury meeting, award ceremony, and public information activities, are covered by the Donor's contribution.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Proposals must be for research projects that aim to study education.
