Transit center one (TC1) was set up in April 25, 2023, to host the first new arrivals. It serves as a temporary center for refugees and returnees. The transit center, with a current capacity of 1,357 individuals, is accommodating 3,788 refugees and returnees, which puts it at 279% of its intended capacity. This situation necessitates the construction of 90 communal shelters.

This month, access to water and latrines has improved due to a decrease in population. Conversely, there has been a reduction in Non-Food Item (NFI) distributions, which is set to be addressed with a restock by the NFI partner in April.

Existing gaps

- **Safety & Security:** There is a total lack of internal lighting in shelters and latrines, with 70% of outdoor areas also experiencing darkness.
- **Health:** The two centers have only one ambulance to cater to a population of 15,000 refugees and returnees.
- **Hazard:** The risk of fire is increased due to densely packed, flammable shelters and the absence of fire breaks/extinguishers. Similarly, the transit center is highly vulnerable to flooding, lacking raised shelters or a proper drainage system.
- **Food Security:** Ongoing food insecurity poses a threat to refugees and returnees residing at the transit center for extended periods.
- **WASH:** The ratio of access to showers is 80:1, exceeding the minimum standards of 50 people per shower stance.
- **Disability inclusion:** There is a limited availability of mobility aids and equipment for people with disabilities.
