Transit Center two (TC2), also known as the extension Site, was opened in January 2, 2024 to ease congestion in Transit Center one (TC1) in Renk. The transit center, with a current capacity of 2,200 individuals, is now accommodating 7,770 refugees and returnees, which puts it at 353% of its intended capacity. This situation necessitates the construction of 207 communal shelters.

This month, access to water, latrines, and showers improved to the construction of 10 new latrine and shower facilities each, coupled with a decrease in population. Additionally, outdoor lighting improved with the installation of extra solar lights, particularly in Sector 1 of TC2. Conversely, there was a reduction in Non-Food Item (NFI) distributions, which is set to be addressed with a restock by the NFI partner in April.

**Existing Gaps**

- **Safety & Security:** 47% of the shelters do not have internal lighting, and the latrines and showers are completely dark.
- **Health:** The two centers have only one ambulance to cater to a population of 15,000 refugees and returnees.
- **Food Scarcity:** There is a shortage of food, posing a threat to the refugees and returnees staying in the transit center for extended period of time. Despite adequate nutrition service capacity, the malnutrition rate among children remains at 25%.
- **WASH:** The ratio of access to latrines and showers is 66:1, exceeding the minimum standards of 50 persons per facility. This includes urgent need for proper drainage system.
- **Disability Inclusion:** There is a limited availability of mobility aids and equipment for people with disabilities.
