

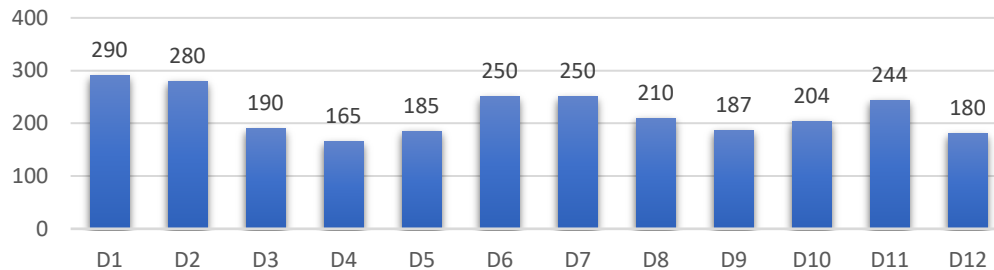
Zaatari camp Incentive-Based Volunteering Monthly Report – January 2024

Due to the lack of livelihood opportunities in the Zaatari camp, UNHCR and its partners have focused their efforts on providing a significant number of services through Incentive-Based Volunteering (IBV), an initiative in which refugees are remunerated for supporting partner programming in the camp. IBV activities are coordinated by the Basic Needs and Livelihoods Working Group (BNLWG) and partner members. This factsheet is based on the information that humanitarian actors in the camp provide to the BNLWG about their IBV activities at the end of each month.

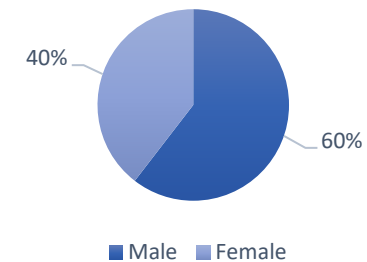
Key Figures for January 2024:

- Camp active population (18+): **34.125**.
- Active engaged IBVs (18+): **2,635, (8%)**.
- Vulnerable IBVs (specific needs): **856**.
- IBVs who have another family vulnerable member (specific needs): **1424**.

IBVs by District



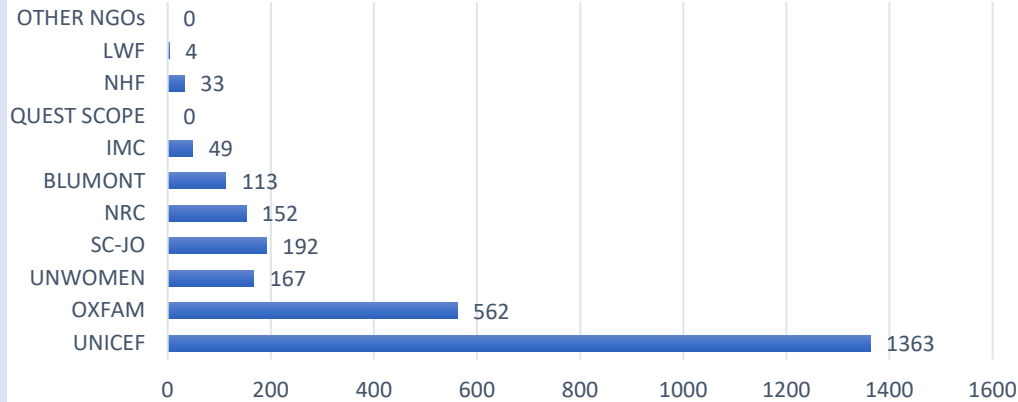
IBVs by Gender



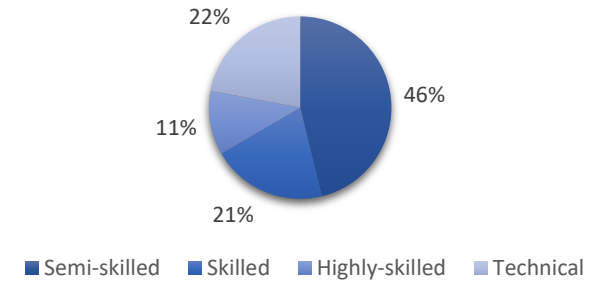

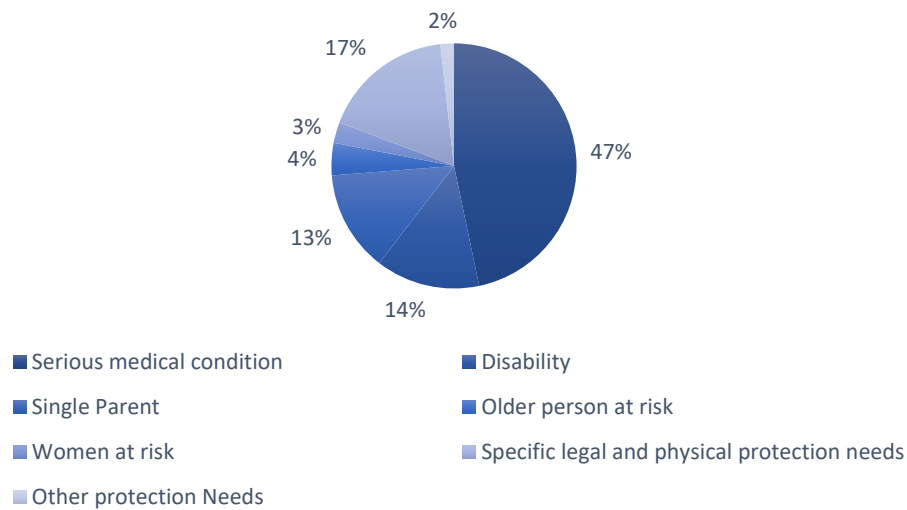

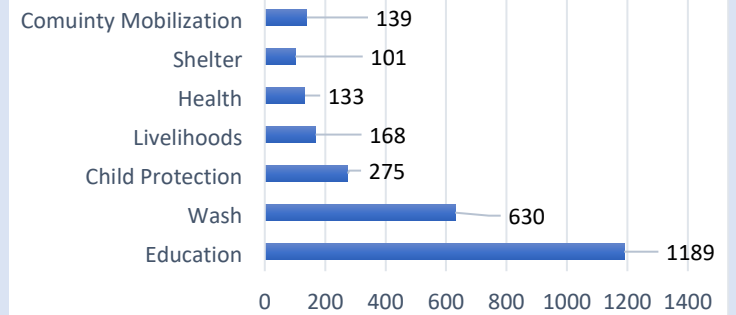
Skill Level
